DIRECTORS' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2009

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2009

Principal activities

The principal activity of the company is that of project management and surveying services

On 16th June 2009, the Company's immediate parent John Shreeves Holdings Limited, sold its shareholding in the company to its immediate parent company, Hill International (UK) Limited

On 31 December 2009 the company transferred the majority of its trade and assets to its immediate parent company, Hill International (UK) Limited Some contracts that weren't transferred in this transaction, remain and will be traded out over the next twelve months. The transfer took place at book value, which was not considered to be materially different to fair value, which resulted in a consideration of £36,153, satisfied by an intercompany loan.

The key performance indicators of the Company are considered to be turnover and operating profit

Turnover

For the year to 31 December 2009, turnover has reduced from £2,080,239 in 2008 to £1,696,348

Loss on ordinary activities before interest and tax

For the year to 31 December 2009 the Company has seen a loss before interest and tax of £842,007 (2008 £576,300)

In assessing the company's ability to generate profits and positive cashflows in the future, the directors utilise internal forecasting and backlog information, in addition to giving consideration to external market conditions and trends

Based on their review and the continued support of its ultimate parent undertaking Hill International Inc , the directors have concluded that they have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2009

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements

Despite net current liabilities and net liabilities of £912,849, the directors have prepared the accounts on a going concern basis, since the company has the continued support of its ultimate parent undertaking, Hill International Inc

12 Cash flow

The company is exempt from preparing a cashflow statement under FRS1 (revised) as it is a wholly owed subsidiary of Hill International Inc which prepares consolidated financial statements

13 Turnover

Turnover represents the amounts (excluding value added tax) recorded as turnover in respect of amounts recoverable on contracts, and amounts earned to date on other work to the extent that the Company has obtained the right to consideration

Invoices are rendered in accordance with an agreed timetable and in certain cases the relevant work may be performed after the date of the invoice

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows.

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

- 33% to 50% straight line

Motor vehicles

- 33% to 50% straight line

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment, in periods where events of changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable

15 Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible assets and depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease term

1.6 Long term contracts

Long term contracts are assessed on a contract by contract basis and where the outcome of a project can be estimated with reasonable certainty, revenue and costs are recognised in the accounts according to the level of completion. If it is anticipated that a contract will be loss making, all of the loss is recognised as soon as it is foreseen.

Amounts recoverable on long term contracts, which are included in debtors, are stated at the net sales value of the work done after provision for contingencies and anticipated future losses on contracts, less amounts received as progress payments on account Excess progress payments are included in creditors as payments on account

17 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held seperately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The amount charged to the profit and loss account represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting period.

1.8 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS19. Deferred taxation

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not, that they will be recovered

19 Foreign currency transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the contracted rate or the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account.

2 Turnover

The total turnover of the company for the year has been derived from its principal activity wholly undertaken in the United Kingdom
