

- 1. The name of the Company is "NEW LOOK WHOLESALERS -
- 2. The registered office of the Company will be situate in England.
- 3. The objects for which the Company is established are:-
- (a) To carry on all or any of the businesses of designers, manufacturers and agents for the sale of, and dealers in clothing of every description, fashion specialists, tailors and dressmakers, dostumiers, milliners and general drapers, furriers, hosiers, hatters, slik mercers, lace merchants and dealers in textile fabrics of all kinds, carset and belt makers, haberdashers, glovers, dyers and cleaners, proprietors of boutiques, dress shops and general stores, sports outfitters, dealers in sports and athletic equipment and accessories, boot and shoe manufacturers and dealers, hide, skin umbrella merchants, curriers, tanners, dealers, manufacturers of and dealers in wigs, bags, trunks, suit cases, leather and fancy goods of all kinds, and of and in perambulators, nursery and other furniture, china, glass, cutlery, pottery, lewellery, toys, games, novelties, stationery, perfumery and toilet requisites and all articles, commodities and things used or required for household or personal use or adornment; owners of depositories, furnishings and general warehousemen, storekeepers, insurance and general agents, merchants and traders; and to buy, sell and generally deal in garments, clothing and soft goods of every description, and all goods, materials, articles and things required for the purpose of any of the foregoing businesses, or capable of being profitably dealt with in connection with, or are likely to be required by customers of or persons having dealings with the Combany.



- (b) To carry on any other trade or business whatever which can in the opinion of the Board of Directors be advantageously carried on in connection with or ancillary to any of the businesses of the Company.
- (c) To purchase or by any other means acquire and take options over any property whatever, and any rights or privileges of any kind over or in respect of any property.
- (di): To apply for, register, purchase, or by other means acquire and protect, prolong and renew, whether in the United Kingdom or elsewhere any patents, patent rights, brevets dinvention, licences, secret processes, trade marks, designs, protections and concessions and to disclaim, alter, modify, use and tunn to account and to manufacture under or grant licences or privileges in respect of the same, and to expend money in experimenting upon, testing and improving any patents, inventions or rights which the Company may acquire or propose to acquire.
- (e)) To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, goodwilk, and assets of any person, firm, or company carrying on or proposing to carry on any of the businesses which the Company is authorised to carry on and as part of the consideration for such acquisition to undertake all or any of the liabilities of such person, firm or company, or to acquire an interest im, amalgamate with, or enter into partnership or into any arrangement for sharing profits, or for co-operation, or for mutual assistance with any such person, firm or company, or for subsidising or otherwise assisting any such person, firm or company, and to give or accept, by way of consideration for any of the acts or things aforesaid or property acquired, any shares, debentures, debenture stock or securities that may be agreed upon, and to hold and retain, or sell, mortgage and deal with any shares, debentures, debenture stock or securities so received.
- (f) To improve, manage, construct, repair, develop, exchange, let on lease or otherwise, mortgage, charge, sell, dispose of, turn to account, grant licences, options, rights and privileges in respect of, or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property and rights of the Company.
- (g) To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required in such manner as may from time to time be determined and to hold or otherwise deal with any investments made.
- (h) To lend and advance money or give credit on such terms as may seem expedient and with or without security to customers and others, to enter into guarantees, contracts of indemnity and suretyships of all kinds, to receive nearly on deposit or loan upon any terms and to secure or guarantee the payment of any sums of money or the performance of any obligation by any company, firm or person including any holding company, subsidiary or fellow subsidiary company in any manner.
- (i) To borrow and raise money in any manner and to secure the repayment of any money borrowed, raised or owing by mortgage, charge, standard security, lien or other security upon the

- (a) To sell or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of the business or property of the Company, either together or in portions, for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and in particular for shares, debentures, or securities of any company purchasing the same.
- (p) To act as agents or brokers and as trustees for any person, firm or company, and to undertake and perform sub-contracts.

- (q) To remunerate any person, firm or company rendering services to the Company either by tesh payment or by the allowent to him or them of shares or other securities of the Company credited as paid up in full or in part or otherwise as may be thought expedient.
- (r) To pay all or any expenses incurred in connection with the promotion, formation and incorporation of the Company, or to contract with any person, firm or company to pay the same, and to pay commissions to brokers and others for underwriting, placing, selling, or guaranteeing the subscription of any shares or other securities of the Company.
- (5) To support and subscribe to any charitable or public object and to support and subscribe to any institution, society, or club which may be for the benefit of the Company or its Directors or employees, or may be connected with any town or place where the Company carries on business; to give or award pensions, annuities, gratulities, and superannuation or other allowances or benefits or charitable aid and generally to provide advantages, facilities and services for any persons who are or have been Directors of, or who are or have been employed by, or who are serving on have served the Company, or of any company which is a subsidiary of the Company or the holding company of the Company or a fellow subsidiary of the Company or of the predecessors in business of the Company or of any such subsidiary, holding or fellow subsidiary company and to the wives, widows, children and other relatives and dependants of such persons; to make payments towards insurance; and to set up, establish, support and maintain superannuation and other funds or schemes (whether contributory or. non-contributory) for the benefit of any of such persons and of their wives, widows, children and other relatives and dependants; and to set up, establish, support and maintain profit sharing or share purchase schemes for the benefit of any of the employees of the Company or of any such subsidiary, holding or fellow subsidiary company and to lend money to any such employees or to trustees on their behalf to enable any such purchase schemes to be established or maintained.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF

NEW LOOK WHOLESALERS LIMITED

PRELIMINARY

The Regulations contained or incorporated in Table A in the First Schedule to the Companies Act 1948 as amended by the Companies Acts 1967 to 1980 (such Table being hereinafter called "Table A") shall apply to the Company save in so far as they are excluded or varied hereby and such Regulations (save as so excluded or varied) and the Articles hereinafter contained shall be the regulations of the Company.

ALLOTMENT OF SHARES

After the initial allotment any shares proposed to be issued 2'. shall first be offered to the Members in proportion as nearly as may be to the number of the existing shares held by them respectively unless the Company shall by Special Resolution otherwise direct. The offer shall be made by notice specifying the number of shares offered, and limiting a period (not being less than fourteen days) within which the offer, if not accepted, will be deemed to be declined. After the expiration of that period, those shares so deemed to be declined shall be offered in the proportion aforesaid to the persons who have, within the said period, accepted all the shares offered to them; such further offer shall be made in the same manner and limited by a like period as the original offer. Any shares not accepted pursuant to such offer or further offer as afforesaid or not capable of being offered as aforesaid except by way of fractions and any shares released from the provisions of this Article by such Special Resolution as aforesaid shall be under the control of the Directors, who may allot, grant options over or otherwise dispose of the same to such persons, on such terms, and in such manner as they think fit, provided that, in the case of

shares not accepted as aforesaid, such shares shall not be disposed of on terms which are more favourable to the subscribers thereof than the terms on which they were offered to the Members. Subject to this Clause the Directors are unconditionally authorised for the purposes of Section 14 of the Companies Act, 1980, to allot shares up to the amount of the share capital created on incorporation of the Company at any time or times during the period of five years from the date of incorporation. In accordance with Section 17(9) of the Companies Act 1980 Sub-sections (1), (6) and (7) of the said Section 17 shall be excluded from applying to the Company.

SHARES

- 3. The lien conferred by Clause 11 in Table A shall attach also to fully paid-up shares and the Company shall also have a first and paramount lien on all shares, whether fully paid or not, standing registered in the name of any person indebted or under liability to the Company, whether he shall be the sole registered holder thereof or shall be one of two or more joint holders, for all moneys presently payable by him or his estate to the Company. Clause 11 in Table A shall be modified accordingly.
- 4. The power of the Directors to make calls conferred by Clause 15 in Table A shall be modified by deleting from such Clause the words. "provided that no call shall exceed one-fourth of the nominal value of the share or be payable at less than one month from the date: fixed for the payment of the last preceding call".
- 5. The liability of any Member in default in respect of a call shall be increased by the addition at the end of Clause 33 in Table A of the words "and all expenses that may have been incurred by the Company by reason of such non-payment".

GENERAL MEETINGS AND RESOLUTIONS

- 6. Every notice convening a General Meeting shall comply with the provisions of Section 136(2) of the Companies Act 1948 as to giving information to Members in regard to their right to appoint proxies; and notices of and other communications relating to any General Meeting which any Member is entitled to receive shall be sent to the Directors and to the Auditor for the time being of the Company.
- 7. Clause 54 in Table A shall be read and construed as if the words ", and if at the adjourned Meeting a quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the Meeting the Meeting shall be dissolved" were added at the end.
- 8. Subject to the provisions of the Companies Acts 1948 to 1980, a resolution in writing signed by all the Members for the time being entitled to receive notice of and to attend and vote at General Meetings (or being corporations by their duly authorised representatives) shall be as valid and effective as if the same had

been passed at a General Meeting of the Company duly convened and held. Any such resolution in writing may consist of two or more documents in like form each signed by one or more of such members and Clause 73A in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTORS

- 9. (a) Clause 75 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.
- (b) The number of the Directors shall be determined by Ordinary, Resolution of the Company but unless and until so fixed there; shall be no maximum number of Directors and the minimum number of Directors shall be one. In the event of the minimum number of Directors fixed by or pursuant to these Articles or Table. A being one, a sole Director shall have authority to exercise all the powers and discretions by Table A or these Articles expressed to be vested in the Directors generally and Clause 99 in Table A, shall be modified accordingly.
- (c) The Directors shall not be required to retire by rotation and accordingly
- (I) Clauses 89, 90, 91, 92 and 94 in Table A shall not apply to the Company; and
- (III) Clause 95 in Table A shall be ended at the words "shall them be eligible for re-election" and the succeeding words shall not apply to the Company; and
- (a) Clause 97 in Table A shall be ended at the words "additional director" and the succeeding sentence shall not apply to the Company.

BORROWING POWERS

- 10. (a) The Directors may exercise all the powers of the Company to borrow money without limit as to amount and upon such terms and im such manner as they think fit, and, subject to Section 14 of the Companies Act 1980 if applicable, to grant any mortgage, charge or standard security over its undertaking, property and uncalled capital, or any part thereof, and to issue debentures, depending stock, and other securities whether outright or as security for any debt, liability or obligation of the Company or of any third party.
- (b) Accordingly, Clause 79 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

ALTERNATE DIRECTORS

11. (a) Each Director shall have the power at any time to appoint as an alternate Director either another Director or any other person approved for that purpose by a resolution of the Directors, and, at

- any time, to terminate such appointment. Every appointment and removal of an alternate Director shall be in writing signed by the appointment and (subject to any approval required) shall (unless the Directors agree otherwise) only take effect upon receipt of such written appointment or removal at the registered office of the Company.
- (b) An alternate Director so appointed shall not be entitled as such to receive any remuneration from the Company except only such part (if any.) of the remuneration otherwise payable to his appointor as such appointor may by notice in writing to the Company from time to time direct, but shall otherwise be subject to the provisions of these Articles with respect to Directors. An alternate Director shall during his appointment be an officer of the Company and shall not be deemed to be an agent of his appointor.
- (c) Am alternate Director shall (subject to his giving to the Company am address at which notices may be served upon him) be entitled to receive notices of all meetings of the Directors and of any committee of the Directors of which his appointor is a member and to attend and to vote as a Director at any such meeting at which his appointor is not personally present and generally in the absence of his appointor to perform and exercise all functions, rights, powers and duties as a Director of his appointor and to receive notice of all General Meetings.
- (d) The appointment of an alternate Director shall automatically determine on the happening of any event which if he were a Director would cause him to vacate such office or if his appointor shall cease for any reason to be a Director otherwise than by retiring and being re-appointed at the same meeting.
- (e) A Director or any other person may act as alternate Director to represent more than one Director and an alternate Director shall be entitled at meetings of the Directors or any committee of the Directors to one vote for every Director whom he represents in addition to his own vote (if any) as a Director, but he shall count as only one for the purpose of determining whether a quorum is present.

POWERS OF DIRECTORS

- 12. A Director may vote as a Director in regard to any contract or arrangement in which he is interested or upon any matter arising thereout, and if he shall so vote his vote shall be counted and he shall be reckoned in estimating a quorum when any such contract or arrangement is under consideration; and Clause 84 in Table A shall be modified accordingly.
- 13. (a) The Directors may exercise the powers of the Company conferred by Clause 3(s) of the Memorandum and shall be entitled to retain any benefits received by them or any of them by reason of the exercise of any such powers.
- (b) Accordingly, Clause 87 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

- 14. It shall not be necessary for Directors to sign their names in any, book which may be kept for the purpose of recording attendance at meetings; and Clause 86 in Table A shall be modified accordingly.
- 15. Clause 88 in Table A shall be read and construed as if the words "becomes incapable by reason of mental disorder, illness or injury of managing and administering his property and affairs" were substituted for the words "becomes of unsound mind".
- 16. A resolution in writing pursuant to Clause 106 in Table A may consist of two or more documents in like form each signed by one or more of the Directors in such Clause referred to and the said Clause 106 shall be modified accordingly. The said Clause 106, modified as aforesaid, shall also apply to any resolution of a committee of Directors.

INDEMNITY

- 17. (a) Every Director or other officer of the Company shall be Indemnified out of the assets of the Company against all losses or liabilities which he may sustain or incur in or about the execution of the duties of his office or otherwise in relation thereto, including any flability incurred by him in defending any proceedings, whether civil or criminal, in which judgment is given in his favour or in which he is acquitted or in connection with any application under Section 448 of the Companies Act 1948 or Section 36 of the Companies Act 1980, in which relief is granted to him by the Court, and no Director or other officer shall be liable for any loss, damage or misfortune which may happen to or be incurred by the Company in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation thereto. But this Article shall only have effect in so far as its provisions are not avoided by Section 205 of the Companies Act 1948.
- (b) Accordingly, Clause 136 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.

ACCOUNTS

18. The accounts and other documents to be prepared by the Directors under Clause 126 in Table A shall be prepared in accordance with Sections 150 and 157 of the Companies Act 1948 as amended by Sections 16 to 22 inclusive of the Companies Act 1967 and in accordance with Sections 1, 6 and 7 of the Companies Act 1976...

TRANSFER OF SHARES

19. A transfer of a fully paid share need not be executed by or on behalf of the transferee; and Clause 22 in Table A shall be modified accordingly.

- 20. (a) The Directors may, in their absolute discretion and without assigning any reason therefor, decline to register any transfer which would otherwise be permitted under the succeeding provisions of this Article if it is a transfer
 - (f) of a share on which the Company has a lien;
- (III) of a share (not being a fully paid share) to a person of whom they shall not approve;
- (III) of a share (whether or not it is fully paid) made pursuant to paragraph (g.) below.
- Clause 24 in Table A shall not apply to the Company.
- (b)) Any person (hereinafter called "the proposing transferor") proposing to transfer any shares shall give notice in writing (hereinafter called "the transfer notice") to the Company that he desires to transfer the same and specifying the price per share which in his opiniom constitutes the fair value thereof. The transfer notice shall constitute the Company the agent of the proposing transferor for the sale of all (but not some of) the shares comprised in the transfer notice to any Member or Members willing to purchase the same (hereinafter called "the purchasing Member") at the price specified therein or at the fair value certified in accordance with paragraph (d) below (whichever shall be the lower). A transfer notice shall not be revocable except with the sanction of the Directors.
- (c)) The shares comprised in any transfer notice shall be offered to the Members (other than the proposing transferor) as nearly as may be in proportion to the number of shares held by them respectively. Such offer shall be made by notice in writing (hereinafter called "the offer notice") within seven days after the receipt by the Company of the transfer notice. The offer notice shall state the price per share specified in the transfer notice and shall limit the time in which the offer may be accepted, not being less than twenty-one days nor more than forty-two days after the date of the offer notice, provided that if a certificate of fair value is requested under paragraph (d) below the offer shall remain open for acceptance for a period of fourteen days after the date on which notice of the fair value certified in accordance with that paragraph shall have been given by the Company to the Members or until the expiry of the period specified in the offer notice whichever is the later. For the purpose of this Article an offer shall be deemed to be accepted on the day on which the acceptance is received by the Company. The offer notice shall further invite each Member to state in his reply the number of additional shares (if any) in excess of his proportion which he desires to purchase and if all the Members do not accept the offer in respect of their respective proportions in full the shares not so accepted shall be used to satisfy the claims for additional shares as nearly as may be in proportion to the number of shares already held by them respectively, provided that no Member shall be obliged to take more shares than he shall have applied for. If any shares shall not be capable without fractions of being offered to the Members in proportion to their existing holdings, the same shall be offered to the Members, or some of

them, in such proportions or in such manner as may be determined by lots drawn in regard thereto, and the lots shall be drawn in such manner as the Directors may think fit.

- (d) Any Member may, not later than eight days after the gate of the offer notice, serve on the Company a notice in writing requesting that the Auditor for the time being of the Company (or at the discretion of the Auditor, a person nominated by the President for the time Leing of the Institute of Chartered Accountants in the Country of the situation of its Registered Office) certify in writing the sum which in his opinion represents the fair value of the shares comprised in the transfer notice as at the date of the transfer notice and for the purpose of this Article reference to the Auditor shall include any person so nominated. Upon receipt of such notice the Company small instruct the Auditor to certify as aforesaid and the costs of such valuation shall be apportioned among the proposing transferor and the purchasing Members or borne by any one or more of them as the Auditor in his absolute discretion shall decide. certifying the fair value as aforesaid the Auditor shall be considered to be acting as an expert and not as an arbitrator or arbiter and accordingly any provisions of law or statute relating to arbitration shall not apply. Upon receipt of the certificate of the Auditor, the Company shall by notice in writing inform all Members of the fair value of each share and of the price per share (being the lower of the price specified in the transfer notice and the fair value of each share)) at which the shares comprised in the transfer notice are offered for sale. For the purpose of this Article the fair value of each share comprised in the transfer notice shall be the sum certified as aforesaid divided by the number of shares comprised in . the transfer notice.
- (e) If purchasing Members shall be found for all the shares comprised in the transfer notice within the appropriate period specified im paragraph (c) above, the Company shall not later than seven days after the expiry of such appropriate period give notice in writing (hereinafter called "the sale notice") to the proposing transferor specifying the purchasing members and the proposing transferor shall be bound upon payment of the price due in respect of all the shares comprised in the transfer notice to transfer the shares to the purchasing Members.

- (f) If in any case the proposing transferor after having become bound as aforesaid makes default in transferring any shares the Company may receive the purchase money on his behalf, and may authorise some person to execute a transfer of such shares in favour of the purchasing Member. The receipt of the Company for the purchase money shall be a good discharge to the purchasing Member. The Company shall pay the purchase money into a separate bank account.
- (g) If the Company shall not give a sale notice to the proposing transferor within the time specified in paragraph (e) above, he shall, during the period of thirty days next following the expiry of the time so specified, be at liberty subject to paragraph (a) above to transfer all or any of the shares comprised in the transfer notice to any persons.

(h) Whenever any Member of the Company who is employed by the Company in any capacity ceases to be employed by the Company the Directors may at any time not later than twenty-eight days after his ceasing to be employed resolve that such Member do retire, and thereupon he shall (unless he has already served a transfer notice) be deemed to have served a transfer notice pursuant to paragraph (b) of this Article and to have specified therein the fair value to be certified in accordance with paragraph (d) of this Article. Notice of the passing of any such resolution shall forthwith be given to the Member affected thereby.

REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS

21. Without prejudice to Clause 96 in Table A the Company may at any time by Extraordinary Resolution remove a Director from office, and may by am Ordinary Resolution appoint another person to be a Director in his place.

ENHANCED VOTING RIGHTS FOR DIRECTORS

- 22). Every Director for the time being of the Company shall have the following rights:
- (a) if at any General Meeting a poll is duly demanded on a resolution to remove him from office, to ten votes for each share of which he is the holder; and
- (b) if at any General Meeting a soll is duly demanded on a resolution to delete or amend the providers of this Article, to ten votes for each share of which he is the leader if voting against such resolution.
