Review of the Year 1996

The tenth anniversary of the opening of the Shipwreck Heritage Centre was celebrated by the Trustees of the Nautical Museums Trust on 29th July, 1996 and Mrs Sybil Perkins, the Manager, was presented with a specially commissioned plate. She retired in October and the task as Manager was taken over by Mrs Yasmin Ornsby, her deputy who had developed our very successful schools service. It is sad to add that early in 1997 Sybil Perkins died suddenly.

The Shipwreck Heritage Centre had 14,041 visitors, of which 11,008 were paying admissions. This compares to 14,225 admissions of which 12,476 were paying in 1995. There were 56 booked groups and many more came that were not booked. These booked groups were mostly from schools and came from as far away as Siberia, Russia, the Czech Republic, Taiwan and Turkey. Groups included children with learning difficulties and mentally handicapped people, but most were from schools in Europe, as well as Scouts, Cubs and Brownies. At the Centre was also held an adult education course in archaeology run for two terms by the University of Sussex. Of particular interest was the inclusion of the Centre in a day outing for passengers of the Orient Express.

There was some important acquisitions of objects: two bottles of wine from the wreck of the Amsterdam (1749) were purchased at auction in Bath with a grant from East Sussex County Council. Two more from that wreck were purchased from a local resident of Hastings with a fine collection of other items, including sealing wax and a shoe and belt buckles. Several people also donated other items from the wreck, thereby enabling there to be for the first time some significant objects from the Amsterdam in Hastings. Two important wrought iron breech blocks from early guns were deposited in the Centre, these having been found in the 16th century wreck of an armed merchant ship at Brighton Marina. And finally, the Shipwreck Heritage Association generously donated the funds to the Trust to buy a rare print dating from 1822 showing the discovery of an almost complete 16th century wrecked vessel in a field near Rye.

Generous grants from the Isabel Blackman Foundation enabled the Trust to replace the ten year old video players, and also to update the satellite weather picture receiver with new equipment which not only shows Europe in colour but also has the capability to enlarge saved images.

The deterioration of the Amsterdam wreck site continued to be monitored and unsuccessful efforts were made to resolve the difficulty whereby the Dutch and British Governments are both keen to pass the responsibility of the care of the site to the other.

The project to raise the wreck of the *Anne* (1690) from Prett Level and to tell her story in a museum at St Leonards was worked on by an increasing team of specialists, with financial support particularly from Hastings Borough Council and the Isabel Blackman Foundation. Moreover, Ralph Wood, one of the Trustees who is an architect, kindly designed a much needed building to be the *Anne* headquarters. An application for a major grant will be submitted to the Heritage Lottery Trust during 1997.

Trustees' Report

The Trustees present their report and financial statements for the period ended 31st December 1996.

Company Status

The Trust is a Company limited by guarantee and a registered Charity.

Results for the Year

During the period the excess of income over expenditure amounted to £12,602 (after making a charge for depreciation of £4,137) (Y/E 28.2.96 - £2,393 excess of expenditure over income). Details of the Trust's operations are to be found in the Review of the Period.

Accounting Policies

for the period ended 31st December 1996

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below.

a. Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

b. Cash Flow

The financial statements do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirement to prepare such a statement.

c. Income

Income is recognised in the period to which it relates.

d. Tangible Fixed Assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life:-

Leasehold Buildings - 2% on Cost Exhibition Cases and Fittings - 2% on Cost Office Equipment - 20% on Cost

Costs relating to the acquisition of exhibits are included in the income and expenditure account at the time of acquisition.

e. Stocks

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
