## NOTES TO THE ABBREVIATED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 28 FEBRUARY 1998

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

#### 1.2 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts.

#### 1.3 Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal annual instalments over its estimated useful economic life of 10 years.

#### 1.4 Patents

Patents are valued at cost less accumulated amortisation. Amortisation is calculated to write off the cost in equal annual instalments over their estimated useful lives of 10 years.

#### 1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets other than freehold land are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Freehold buildings

2% p a straight line

Plant and machinery

25% p a reducing balance

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

25% p a reducing balance

Motor vehicles

25% p a reducing balance

#### 1.6 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term.

#### 1.7 Stock and work in progress

Stock and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 1.8 Pensions

The pension costs charged in the financial statements represent the contributions payable by the company during the year in accordance with SSAP 24.

#### 1.9 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided at appropriate rates on all timing differences using the liability method only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

#### 4 Transactions with directors

During the year the company had the following transactions, on a commercial basis, with TJA Tooling, a business in which J D Pomfrett is a partner.

Purchased goods and services from it totalling £15,685 (1997:£29,019)

Let property to it at a rent of £5,700 p.a. (1997: £5,700)

Balances outstanding at 28 February 1998 are as follows:

Amounts due to TJA Tooling - £808(1997: £3,663)

Amounts due from TJA Tooling - £3,325(1997:£3,325)

The company also rented two factory units from J D Pomfrett and J B Thornthwaite at £4,000 p.a. each.

During the year the company also had the following transactions, on a commercial basis, with J B Models, in which J B Thornthwaite has a business interest:

Sold goods to it totalling £2,582(1997: £2,375)

The balance outstanding at 28th February 1998 as a result of these transactions was £307(1997: £nil).

The company also sold, at current market value, the Vauxhall Senator, and accompanying number plate 200 JDP, to J D Pomfrett for £1,958.

On 26 February 1998 units 24 and 26 were purchased, at current market value, from J D Pomfrett and J B Thornthwaite for £30,000 each.
