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#### REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2000

The directors present their annual report and accounts for the year ended 31 December 2000.

## Corporate Status

The International Council of Museums (United Kingdom) was incorporated under the Companies Acts on 2 December 1982. It is a private company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital (no 1683625), and is exempted by the Secretary of State from the requirement to use the word 'limited' in its name. The liability of each member is limited to an amount not exceeding £1. The company is a registered charity (no 326410).

## **Objects**

The company's principal objects are to further the educational purposes of museums; organise and support co-operation and mutual assistance between museums, and between the members of the museum profession, throughout the world; and emphasise the importance of museums and the museum profession within each community.

## **Principal Activities**

To achieve its objects, the company supports the International Council of Museums (ICOM) by

- administering its United Kingdom membership, which in 2000 comprised 515 institutions and individuals (1999 508);
- providing travel bursaries for persons attending triennial general assemblies of ICOM, and of meetings of its international committees and regional groups 8 bursaries were awarded during the year;
- publishing a newsletter describing the results of international contacts;
- providing information to the Department of Culture, Media and Sport, Resource (the Council for Museums, Libraries and Archives) and other governmental and museum sector organisations.

These activities are expected to continue.

#### Review of the Year

Four areas were targeted for development: increasing the membership of ICOM UK, extending the work of ICOM UK overseas, lobbying the UK government regarding unratified conventions, developing a productive relationship with the Museums Association.

Membership has continued to rise. The Executive Board has decided to employ a Project Consultant to investigate the most appropriate way for ICOM UK to develop its work overseas. ICOM UK's joint work with the Museums Association on illicit traffic has led to the establishment of the government committee to look at this question. ICOM UK has worked closely with the Museums Association particularly with the highly successful *Stealing History* report on the illicit traffic in cultural property.

Three editions of ICOM UK News plus a supplementary volume, *Going up in the World*, the outcome of a joint seminar with the Museums and Galleries Commission, were published. All ICOM UK members received a copy of *Stealing History*. ICOM UK also worked closely to develop a UK and Ireland Committee of Blue Shield.

A special Fund was set up in memory of Camilla Boodle who died in 1999. It is planned to use the Fund to help members of ICOM UK extend a visit abroad which is being made on ICOM business.

## **Future Developments**

ICOM UK is preparing a new forward plan. This will concentrate on four areas of activity: maintaining the increase in membership; developing new partnerships; improving the return on investments; and through the appointment of a Project Consultant, considering the development of ICOM UK's role overseas.

## NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2000

## 1. Accounting Policies

Basis of accounting

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and are prepared in compliance with all relevant statements of standard accounting practice, and the Charities SORP.

#### **Grants Income**

Income is allocated to the SOFA in the period to which it relates.

## 2. Directors

None of the directors received any emoluments for their services to the company.

One director received £374 in reimbursed expenses for travel.

## 3. Limitation of Liability

This company is limited by guarantee and there is no share capital. Every member of the company undertakes to contribute to the assets of the company, in the event of the same being wound up while he is a member, or within one year after he ceases to be a member, for payment of the debts and liabilities of the company contracted before he ceases to be a member, and of the costs, charges and expenses of winding up, and for the adjustment of the rights of the contributories among themselves, such amount as may be required not exceeding one pound.

  - ii. the company satisfied the conditions for exemption from an audit of the accounts for the year specified in section 249A(4) of the Act and did not, at any time within that year, fall within any of the categories of companies not entitled to the exemption specified in section 249B(1).
