Strategic Report For The Year Ended 31 December 2015

The directors present their strategic report for the year ended 31 December 2015.

FAIR REVIEW OF BUSINESS

A reorganisation of the trading activities of the parent company, Hood Group Limited, took place on 1st January 2015. Under this reorganisation a significant proportion of the trade, assets and liabilities of Plus One Services Limited (the company) were sold/transferred to Hood Group Limited at their book value.

As a result of this sale/transfer, the trading carried out by the company is now more limited. The company now provides insurance services to external clients and other subsidiaries of Hood Group Limited (internal clients), where the client retains responsibility for FCA regulation and compliance under their own registration with the FCA. Under this model, the company works as an Authorised Representative of the client.

Systems and staffing to support the company's trading activities are provided by Hood Group Limited.

During the year under review the company provided services to two clients - one external client and one internal client. The external client is a long standing client of the company and has, during the year, substantially completed the migration of the services provided by the company back to its own in-house facility.

As a result of the changes outlined above, turnover and profits for the year under review were significantly lower than the previous year. The completion of the migration of services back to the external client's in-house facility will further reduce turnover and profits in 2016. The directors are, however, confident that this shortfall will be substantially offset by growth in the services provided to the internal client.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The principal risks and uncertainties identified by the directors are outlined below.

Opportunities to provide insurance services to clients under the Authorised Representative model are limited and the company's future turnover and profits could be affected by this. However, providing services under this model is an important part of the group's proposition and the company is well placed to exploit these opportunities as and when they arise.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The company transitioned from previously extant UK GAAP to FRS 102 as at 1 January 2014. An explanation of how transition to FRS 102 has affected the reported financial position and financial performance is given in the notes to the financial statements.

In the opinion of the directors, it remains appropriate to continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting.

Turnover

Credit is taken for administration fees billed to clients in the period in which they are earned. Other income is credited to the profit and loss account as it is received.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life or, if held under a finance lease, over the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

Systems development costs

- 33% on cost and 20% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

20% on cost

Computer equipment

33% on cost

At each reporting date, fixed assets are reviewed to determine whether there is any indication that those assets have suffered an impairment loss. If there is an indication of possible impairment, the recoverable amount of any affected asset is estimated and compared with its carrying amount. If the estimated recoverable amount is lower, the carrying amount is reduced to its estimated recoverable amount, and an impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

If an impairment loss subsequently reverses, the carrying amount of the asset is increased to the revised estimate of its recoverable amount, but not in excess of the amount that would have been determined had no impairment loss been recognised for the asset in prior years. A reversal of an impairment is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax with the following exceptions:

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Notes to the Financial Statements - continued For The Year Ended 31 December 2015

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts or finance leases are capitalised in the balance sheet. Those held under hire purchase contracts are depreciated over their estimated useful lives. Those held under finance leases are depreciated over their estimated useful lives or the lease term, whichever is the shorter.

The interest element of these obligations is charged to profit or loss over the relevant period. The capital element of the future payments is treated as a liability.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The company operates defined contribution pension schemes. The amount charged to the profit and loss account in respect of pension costs is the contributions payable in the year. Differences between contributions payable in the year and contributions actually paid are shown as either accruals or prepayments in the balance sheet.
