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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees, who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act, present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st March 2006. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in October 2000 in preparing the annual report and financial statements of the charity.

Principal activities

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee. It is governed by a memorandum and articles of association. The principal activities of the Association is the provision of services to Chinese and Vitenamese community in the London Borough of Tower Hamlets through project base programmes providing specific services to meet the needs of its user groups. The Statement of Financial Activities for the year is set out on Page 5 to 12 of the financial statements.

Risk management

The trustees are in the process of carrying out a review of the major risks faced by the charity and establishing procedures to mitigate the effect of any risks identified.

Reserves Policy

The charity receives funding from the local authority and charitable trusts and such funding is generally short term and subject to fluctuations. To allow the charity to have some security to operate where there is a shortfall in funding, the trustees are aiming to build up the free reserves to the level of approximately six months expenditure.

Achievements during the year and future development

During the financial year of 2005-2006, we achieved an excellent and successful record. Each member of the Management Committee, staff and volunteers played a vital role in contributing to the successful outcome.

Summarising the year's achievement, we can proudly say that CATH has grown into an even more successful centre, making its presence in the boroughs of Tower Hamlets, Islington, Newham and Hackney. NOTES FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2006

1 Accounting policies

a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards and the Statement of Recommended Practices (SORP), "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in October 2000 and applicable accounting standards.

The charity has availed itself of Paragraph 3 (3) of Schedule 4 of the Companies Act and adapted the Companies Act formats to reflect the special nature of the charity's activities. No separate Statements of Financial Activities has been presented for the charity alone as permitted by Section 230 of the Companies Act 1985 and paragraph 304 of the SORP.

b) Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liabilities in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

c) Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements. Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

d) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA on accrued received basis. No amounts are included in the financial statements for services donated by volunteers.

Notes forming part of the financial statements continued

e) Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under heading that aggregate all costs related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management carried out at Headquarters. Management and administration costs are those incurred in connection with administration of the charity and compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements.

f) Depreciation

Depreciation is provied on all tangible fixed assets at rates calculated to write off the cost on a reducing balances basis over their expected useful economic lives as follows:
