## Report of the directors for the year ended 31st December 1996

The directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st December 1996.

#### Directors responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare accounts that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss for its financial year. In doing so the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

#### Principal activity and trading review

The profit for the year, after taxation, amounted to £16,805 (1995: £43,280), as set out on page 4.

#### Notes forming part of the accounts for the year ended 31st December 1996

#### 1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

#### **Basis of Preparation**

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules.

#### Turnover

Turnover represents the value of work done under construction management contracts, during the period, exclusive of value added tax.

#### Deferred taxation

Provision is made for timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes where it can be reasonably foreseen that such deferred taxation will be payable in the future.

#### Foreign currency

Assets and liabilities expressed in foreign currency are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Differences arising are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

#### 2. Turnover and Results

The turnover and results of the company are derived from its principal activity.

#### 11. Ultimate parent company and parent undertaking of larger group

The company is a subsidiary undertaking of Compagnie Générale des Eaux which is incorporated in France and which is the ultimate parent company and ultimate controlling party.

The largest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Compagnie Générale des Eaux, incorporated in France. The smallest group in which they are consolidated is that headed by Symonds Woolf Limited, a company incorporated in Great Britain and registered in England and Wales. #### Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors

As described on page 2 the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

#### **Basis of opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations that we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material mis-statement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error.
