Objectives of the Charity

The Company's principal activity is to promote road safety for the public benefit by promoting the training of learner motorcycle riders in the safe use and maintenance of their machines. The Company acts as a national coordinating body for motorcycle rider training, providing administration support services to motorcycle rider training centres, supervising and organising the syllabus of training

Reserves Policy

It is the policy of the Company to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the Company at a level which will provide sufficient funds to cover the major part of the management, support and administration costs and projected charitable expenditure in the following year

1 Accounting Policies

11 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005) and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities

12 Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee The members of the company are the directors named on page 1. In the event of the charitable company being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member.

13 Fund accounting

General funds are funds which are available for use at the discretion of the directors in furtherance of the general objectives of the charitable company and which have not been designated for other purposes

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charitable company for particular purposes. Investment income and gains are allocated to the appropriate funds

14 Incoming resources

All incoming resources including donations and grants are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy, with the exception of grants receivable where the donor has specified that these must be used in future accounting periods where the income has been deferred until those periods

Affiliation and other fees are credited to income in the period to which they relate

Investment income comprising interest receivable is included when receivable by the charity

15 Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis inclusive of attributable VAT which cannot be recovered and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.
