Report of the trustees (incorporating the directors' report) for the year ended 31 March 2008

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2008. The trustees, who are also directors for the purposes of company law and who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1.

Structure, governance and management

The company is registered as a charitable company limited by guarantee as set up in the Memorandum of Association on 13 March 1984. The management of the company is the responsibility of the Trustees who are elected and co-opted under the terms of the Articles of Association. The committee is made up of the Trustees of the Davenant Centre. The day to day administration of the Trust is carried out by the Operating Trustee.

Objectives and activities

The company's principal activity during the year continued to be that of working towards the provision of two community centres for the educational and social benefits of the inhabitants of the London Borough of Tower Hamlets. It is currently working towards creating a Youth Centre of Excellence.

The refurbishment of the oldest part of the property's structure ran into construction delays and significant cost overruns compelling the company to borrow £863,000 from National Westminster Bank Plc. The loan was secured against the whole property. Also disagreements escalated in 2007 to litigation between members of the board because of the uncertainty over who are entitled to be members of the company and its management committee. This in turn led to a deterioration in the trust between the officers of the company and as a result stakeholders became concerned about their positions. The costs of this litigation soon mounted and the company was unable to pay the solicitors and other liabilities. Eventually, towards the end of 2008 the solicitors acting for both sides served statutory demands on the company. The board met in June 2009 and resolved to appoint Andrew McTear and Chris Williams as Joint Administrators. The company came out of administration on 15 September 2009 and a business plan produced by a firm of management consultants was implemented.

Risk management

The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, in particular to those relating to the operations and finances of the Trust. The Trustees are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to the major risks.

Statement as to disclosure of information to auditors

In so far as the trustees are aware:

- there is no relevant audit information of which the charity's auditors are unaware; and
- the trustees have taken all steps that they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the auditors are aware of that information.

Statement of trustees' responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the surplus or deficit of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Auditors

Eric & Co were appointed auditors to the charity and a resolution proposing their reappointment will be put to the Annual General Meeting.

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2008

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2007), the Statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Companies Act 1985.

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement because it is a small charity.

1.2. Funds

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Trustees in furtherance of the activities of the charity and have not been designated for other purposes.

Designated funds comprise unrestricted funds that have been set aside by the Trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such fund are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

1.3. Incoming resources

All incoming resources, including capital grants are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy, except as follows:

- when donors specify that incoming resources given to the charity must be used in future accounting periods, the income is deferred until those periods.
- when donors impose conditions which have to be fulfilled before the charity becomes entitled to use such income, the income is deferred and not included in incoming resources until the pre-conditions for use have been met.

Income from investments is included in the year in which it is receivable.

1.4. Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them. Support costs, which cannot be directly attributed to particular activities have been apportioned proportionately to the direct staff costs allocated to the activities.

Notes to financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2008

1.5. Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

All assets costing more than £500 are capitalised.

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Land and buildings

Straight line over 50 years

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

25% reducing balance

1.6. Going concern

The Trustees have stated that as the company has no endowed funds, the level of activities in the subsequent financial years would depend entirely on its ability to secure grants income and generate rental income. In March 2009, a firm of management consultants undertook a financial review and produced a business plan for the future trading of the company. The company came out of administration on 15 September 2009 and the business plan was implemented. In addition, London Borough of Tower Hamlets ("LBTH") would loan £200,000 to re-finance the company. On the basis of this information, the Trustees consider that the company would be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due for a period of not less than 12 months from the date these financial statements are approved. Accordingly, the Trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting.

17. Contingent liabilities

The land and building were paid for by use of grant aid exceeding £1.6 million. The initial and by far most substantial grants were from Greater London Council (GLC). A condition of the grant-aid was that GLC and successors in title have a mortgage charge secured on the property to the extent of the grant-aid (£1,093,470). This charge is for thirty years from 6 June 1984. It is estimated that the amount of the charge would now be in the region of £320,000. In addition, there are covenants and regulations restricting the use of the property. The mortgage is a charge, contingent on any breaches of the conditions of grant-aid and would not normally be payable.

18. Related party transactions

During the year the Trust received £274,019 (2007: £Nil) from Tower Hamlets Community Empowerment Network (company limited by guarantee), a company in which Mahmoud Adur Rauf is a director and made payments of £274,019 (2007: £Nil) for expenditure.

DAVENANT CENTRE (THE) is a company limited by guarantee and accordingly does not have a share capital.

Every member of the company undertakes to contribute such amount as may be required not exceeding £1 to the assets of the charitable company in the event of its being wound up while he or she is a member, or within one year after he or she ceases to be a member.
