Basis of opinion

We have carried out the procedures we considered necessary to confirm, by reference to the financial statements, that the company is entitled to deliver abbreviated financial statements and that the abbreviated financial statements to be delivered are properly prepared. The scope of our work for the purpose of this report did not include examining or dealing with events after the date of our report on the financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion the company is entitled to deliver abbreviated financial statements prepared in accordance with sections 246(5) and (6) of the Companies Act 1985, and the abbreviated financial statements on pages 5 to 8 are properly prepared in accordance with those provisions.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error or other irregularity. However, the evidence available to us was limited in respect of the revaluation of the leasehold property and it's contents to £2,500,000 made at 31 March 1996 carried out by the directors during that year. The directors estimate of the market value of the property is based on their own financial projections and opinion of market conditions. There were no satisfactory audit procedures that we could adopt to confirm the directors' assessment of market value. Any adjustment to this figure would also have a consequential effect on the revaluation reserve.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Qualified opinion arising from limitation in audit scope

Except for any adjustments to the financial statements that might have been found to be necessary had we been able to obtain sufficient third party evidence concerning the revaluation of the leasehold property, in our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 31 October 1998 and of its profit for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.'

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement conferred by Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 on the grounds that it qualifies as a small company under the Companies Act 1985.

Turnover

Turnover represents the amount derived from the provision of goods and services falling within the company's activities after deduction of trade discounts and value added tax.

Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Long leasehold propertynot depreciatedMotor vehicles10% straight lineFixtures and fittings10% straight line

Depreciation is not provided on the leasehold property which is a long lease. It is the company's policy to maintain this asset in a continual state of sound repairs and to make improvements thereto from time to time. Accordingly the Directors consider that the life of this asset and residential values is such that the depreciation is insignificant

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Stocks of glass, linen and china are valued at cost and all replacements are written off to the profit and loss account.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method in respect of the taxation effect of all timing differences to the extent that tax liabilities crystallise in the foreseeable future.
