MISYS INTERACTIVE TRADING LIMITED NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. The principal accounting policies which have been applied consistently throughout the year are set out below.

Going concern

The Company has a deficiency of capital. A letter of support has been received from the ultimate parent company, Misys plc, stating that it will provide continuing financial support as necessary to enable the Company to meet its obligations as and when they fall due, for a period of at least 12 months from the date of this report. Accordingly, the Directors are satisfied that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less tax in the future. Resultant deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that it is considered more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Cash flow and related party disclosures

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Misys plc and is included in the consolidated financial statements of that company, which are publicly available. Consequently, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS1 (revised 1996) 'Cash Flow Statements'.

The Company has also taken advantage of the exemption under FRS8 'Related Party Disclosures' not to disclose transactions with group undertakings since Misys plc is the beneficial owner of the entire equity share capital of the Company.

2. PROFIT ON ORDINARY ACTIVITES BEFORE TAXATION

Remuneration of the auditors and Directors has been borne by a fellow subsidiary as was the case in the prior year. There were no employees in the year (2007: nil).
