for the year ended 31 December 2012

The directors present their annual report on the affairs of the Company and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2012

Business review and principal activity

The Company was the holding company of Surfeal Limited, which became a wholly owned subsidiary of the Company following the dissolution of its previous parent company, Surfeal Holdings Limited on 29 October 2008 Surfeal Limited was a non-trading company that was dissolved on 19 March 2013

The results for the Company show a profit on ordinary activities before tax of £202,786 (2011 loss £6,196,293) The shareholder funds of the Company were £23,101,650 as at 31 December 2012 (31 December 2011 £22,837,946)

Future outlook

There is not expected to be any change to the business in the foreseeable future

Dividends

The directors do not recommend payment of a dividend in respect of the year ended 31 December 2012 (2011 Enil)

Principal risks and uncertainties

The Company's principal risks and uncertainties are integrated within and managed together with the principal risks of the RSA Insurance Group plc (the "Group") and are not managed separately. The principal risks and uncertainties of the Group, which include those of the UK business, and hence the Company, are set out in the estimation techniques, uncertainties and contingencies on pages 88 to 91, and in the risk review on pages 26 to 29 of the 2012 Annual Report & Accounts of the Group, which do not form part of this report.

The Company's principal exposure is to debts due from group companies which the directors expect to be settled in full as they fall due or on demand as applicable
