Directors' report for the nine months ended 31 December 1994

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the nine months ended 31 December 1994.

Principal activity

The principal activity of the company continues to be the operation of a nursing home.

Parent company

The company was acquired by Craegmoor Healthcare Company Limited on 30 June 1994. The accounting reference date of the company was changed to 31 December to coincide with that of its parent company.

Review of business

Both the level of business and the period end financial position were satisfactory, and the directors expect that the present level of activity will be sustained for the foreseeable future.

Directors' interests

None of the directors held any interests in the shares of the company at 31 December 1994. Directors' responsibilities

Notes to the financial statements for the period ended 31 December 1994

1 Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently is set out below.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets.

Tangible fixed assets

Land and buildings and fixtures and fittings are stated at valuations made by independent professionally qualified valuers on an existing use open market value basis.

Full valuations of the freehold land and buildings will be made by professionally qualified valuers every three years and in the intervening years these will be updated by the directors with the assistance of independent professional advice as required. No depreciation is provided on freehold properties as they are maintained in a state of good repair, the cost of maintenance being charged to the profit and loss account. Consequently, the directors consider their residual values are at least equal to their net book values. Any depreciation required by the Companies Act 1985 and SSAP 12 would not be material.

Depreciation is calculated on fixtures and fittings so as to write off the valuation less estimated residual value, on the following basis:

Fixtures and fittings

- 20% reducing balance

Operating leases

Costs in respect of operating leases are charged on a straight line basis over the lease term.

Turnover

Turnover, which excludes value added tax, represents fee income charged for the period.

1 Principal accounting policies (continued)

Deferred taxation

Provision is made for deferred taxation, using the liability method, on all material timing differences to the extent that it is probable that a liability will crystallise.

Cash flow statement

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Craegmoor Healthcare Company Limited and its cash flows are included in the consolidated group cash flow statement of Craegmoor Healthcare Company Limited. Consequently the company is exempt under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard No. 1 from publishing a cash flow statement.

2 Turnover

Turnover consists entirely of fee income earned in the United Kingdom.

3 Directors' emoluments
