Report of The Council of Management

The Council of Management submits its report together with financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2015

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity is constituted as a Company limited by guarantee, without a share capital, and is therefore governed by a Memorandum and Articles of Association. It became a registered charity on 13 May 1993.

The Charity is organised so that the Members of the Council of Management meet regularly to manage the affairs of the charity. The Secretary is in charge of the day to day running of the Charity. A management team consisting of the Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary and one nominated representative meet monthly to make decisions on the day to day matters. Important decisions have to be ratified at the quarterly meetings of the full Council of Management. All Members of the Council of Management have equal responsibilities in the running of the Charity, except the co-opted members who do not have a vote.

Appointment of Trustees

As set out in the Articles of Association, membership of the Company is unlimited with the Council of Management (Board of Trustees) being recruited from the membership and appointed as follows: each organisation permanently based in St Mary's Centre shall nominate 1 representative, as will Middlesbrough Council. In addition, 3 additional members shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting. A further 4 members may be co-opted who shall not be entitled to vote.

All members are circulated with an invitation to nominate trustees prior to the AGM, advising them of the retiring trustee(s) and requesting nominations for the AGM. When considering co-optees, knowledge and expertise which will benefit the Centre is taken into consideration.

Nominees appointed by Middlesbrough Council are subject to the appointment processes of that body and the guidelines on appointment to public office as they apply to Local Government nominees.

Trustee Induction and Training

New Trustees are inducted by the Centre Manager/Company Secretary who briefs them on their legal obligations with regard to company and charity law. They are also given an introduction to the building, the staff and other trustees and are instructed in the Health & Safety and security requirements of the Centre.

External training events which will facilitate the undertaking of their role are provided as and when appropriate.

Objectives, Activities and Achievements

The Charity's objects and its principal activity continues to be the promotion of more effective working of charities and voluntary organisations in the area by providing premises and other facilities at competitive rates.

Rents increased by almost £20,000 due to more income received from occasional users. Charges were increased by 5% for all users. The grant from Middlesbrough Borough Council was £12,500 (2014: £12,500). A similar amount will be received in 2015/16.

Expenses have increased slightly. An increase in repairs due to a large boiler repair, have been partly offset by reductions elsewhere, in particular heat and light.

The charity showed a surplus on unrestricted funds of £3,266 (2014: £16,245 deficit).

Report of The Council of Management

Reserves Policy

The Council of Management of St Mary's Centre have established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed or invested in tangible fixed assets (free reserves) held by the charity should be approximately three months running costs plus redundancy requirements. At the present time the free reserves of £19,968 do not cover this requirement and the Council of Management will consider ways in which additional unrestricted funds will be raised. This will be monitored on an annual basis.

Council of Management Statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities the trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 March 2015

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified for the revaluation of fixed assets and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP). "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" published in March 2005 and applicable accounting standards and Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Going concern

The grant from Middlesbrough Borough Council was reduced from £25,250 in 2012/13 to £12,500 for 2013/14 and 2014/15. This has had a significant impact on the charity. The charity is exploring new funding sources and has increased usage of the centre this year. Expenditure has been cut where possible. Salary reductions will be made in 2015/16 as hours have been cut. The charity currently has sufficient reserves to continue in operation.

The Council of Management therefore believe that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis.

(b) Company status

The charity is a company limited by guarantee. The members of the company are the trustees named on page 1. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity.

(c) Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering the funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

(d) Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities (SOFA) when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Donations are credited to income as they are received. Grants received are recognised as income for the period which they relate to. Income from sale of refreshments is net of the related cost. There is no other netting off of expenditure in the accounts. Items purchased for the use of other charities and services recharged are not included within the SOFA.

Donated facilities and services are included at the actual cost or value to the company, as described in Note 2.

(e) Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and includes VAT as this is not recoverable by the charity.

Resources expended on charitable activities include the direct costs of running the centre. Support costs include central overheads including salaries, and communication costs, integral to the running of the Charity. Governance costs include the costs of meeting constitutional and statutory requirements. Salary costs of the secretary have been split between charitable and governance costs 60:40 which is an estimate of the time spent. Printing and stationery has 10% allocated to governance costs.

(f) Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Assets costing less than £500 are not capitalised.

Assets purchased from restricted funds are capitalised in the Balance Sheet and the funds then transferred to unrestricted funds as they have been expended in the year.

Fixtures and fittings are depreciated on a 15% straight line basis to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

(g) Pension Costs

The Company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for the benefit of its employees and contributions are charged to the SOFA in the year in which they are made.

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of St Mary's Centre (Association of Middlesbrough Based Charities) Limited

I report on the accounts of the company for the year ended 31 March 2015 which are set out on pages 4 to 9.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
