
MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION

-of-

WELSH HOUSING AID LIMITED.

1. The name of the Company (herein called the Charity

- 2. The registered office of the Charity will be
- The objects of the charity are to relieve the poverty hardship and distress caused by homelessness and bad housing.
 - (ii) The Charity may carry out these objects firstly by direct action and secondly by assisting others in carrying out similar charitable purposes.
 - (iii) In furtherance of these purposes (but not otherwise) the Charity shall have the following powers:
 - (A) To accept subscriptions donations devices and bequests of and to purchase take on lease or in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire and hold any real or personal estate (whether or not subject to any trust), and to construct, maintain and alter any of the same as are necessary or expedient (subject to such consents as may be by law required) sell, lease or otherwise dispose of or mortgage any such real or personal estate.
 - (B) To issue appeals, hold public meetings and take such other steps as may be required for the purpose



of promoting and publicising the objects of the Charity and procuring contributions to its funds in the shape of donations, subscriptions or otherwise.

- (C) To co-operate and enter into arrangements with any bodies or authorities, national local or otherwise, and to obtain from any such bodies or authorities any rights, privileges and concessions.
- (D) To borrow or raise money for the objects of the Charity on such terms (and with such consents as are by law required) and on such security as may be thought fit.
- (E) To take any gift of property whether subject to any special trust or not for any one or more of the objects of the Charity.
- (F) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills, cheques and other instruments, and to operate bank accounts.
- (G) To invest the moneys of the Charity not immediately required for its purposes in or upon such shares, stocks, funds, securities or other investments in any part of the world involving liability or not as the Charity shall in its absolute discretion think fit.
- (H) To make any charitable donation either in cash services or assets for the furtherance of the objects of the Charity.
- (I) To establish and support any charitable association or body and to subscribe or guarantee money for charitable purposes calculated to further the objects of the Charity.
- (J) To print and publish and to arrange to have printed and published either gratuitously or by way of sale any reports, periodicals, films, tapes, books or leaflets which are desirable for the promotion of the objects of the Charity and to hold seminars, courses, colloquia and meetings of any kind for those purposes.
- (K) To undertake and execute charitable trusts.
- (L) To employ or engage and pay any person or persons to supervise, organise, carry on the work of and advise the Charity.
- (M) Subject to the provisions of Clause 4 hereof to pay reasonable annual sums or premiums for or towards the provision of pensions for officers or servants for the time being of the Charity or their dependants.

- To amalgamate with any companies, institutions, societies or associations which shall be charitable at law and have objects altogether or mainly similar to those of the Charity, and prohibit the payment of any dividend or profit to the distribution of any of their assets amongst the members at least to the same extent as such payments or distributions are prohibited in the case of members of the Charity by this Memorandum of Association.
- (O) To pay out of the funds of the Charity the costs, charges and expenses of and incidental to the formation and registration of the Charity.
- (P) To do all such other things as are necessary to the attainment of the objects of the Charity or any of them.

Provided always that:-

- (a) The objects of the Charity shall not extend to the regualtion of relations between workers and employers or organisations of workers and organisations of employers.
- (b) In case the Charity shall take or hold any property subject to the jurisdiction of the Court or the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales the Charity shall not sell, mortgage, charge or lease the same without such authority, approval or consent as may be required by law.
- (c) In case the Charity shall take or hold any property which may be subject to any trusts the Charity shall only deal with the same in such manner as may be allowed by law having regard to such trusts.
- (d) No amendments which would fundamentally alter the objects and powers of the Charity shall be made to or in the provisions of this Memorandum of Association unless previously approved by the Charity Commission.
- The income and property of the Charity whencesoeve derived shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the charity as set forth in this Memorandum of Association, and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, bonus or otherwise howsoever by way of profit to the members of the Charity: Provided that nothing herein contained shall prevent -
 - (A) the payment in good faith of reasonable and proper remuneration to any officer or servant of the Charity or to any member of the Charity in return for any services actually rendered to the Charity; nor

the payment of interest at a rate not exceeding 7 per cent per annum on money lent or the rate for the time being prescribed by the Treasury in manner mentioned in Section 189 (i) of the Housing Act 1957 (whichever rate shall be the less) or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let by any member of the Charity.

But so that no Committee Member of the Charity shall be appointed to any salaried office of the Charity or any office of the Charity paid by fees, and that no remunderation or other benefit in money or money's worth shall be given by the Charity to the Committee Member except repayment of out-of-pocket expenses and interest at the rate aforesaid on money lent or reasonable and proper rent for premises demised or let to the Charity so however that this restriction shall not apply to any payment to any company or charitable housing association of which a Committee Member may be a member and in which such member shall not have more than one hundredth part of the capital and such member shall not be bound to account for any share of profits he may receive in respect of any such payment.

5. The liability of the members is limited.

- Every member of the Charity undertakes to contribut to the assets of the Charity in the event of the same being wound up during the time that he is a member or within one year after he ceases to be a member for payment of the debts and liabilities of the Charity contracted before the time at which he ceases to be a member and of the cests, charges and expenses of winding up t same and for the adjustment of the rights of contributors amongst themselves such amount as may be required not exceeding £1.
- 7. If upon the winding up or dissolution of the Charit there remains after the satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities any property whatsoever the same shall not be paid to or distributed among the members of the Charity but shall be given or transferred to some other charitable trust or body having objects similar to the objects of the Charity and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income and property amongst its or their members to an extent at least as great as is imposed on the Charity under or by virtue of Clause 4 hereof, such trust or body to be determined by the members of the Charity at or before the time of dissolution and if and so far as effect cannot be given to the aforesaid provision then to some charitable object.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION

-of-

WELSH HOUSING AID LIMITED:

1. In these Articles -

"The Act" means the Companies Act 1948 as amended by the Companies Act 1967 and these Articles shall be construed with reference thereto.

"Table C" means Table C contained in the First Schedule to the Act.

"The Committee" means the Council of Management of the Charity (or the directors when referred to in the Act and Table C in the sense of a Board of Directors) and "Committee Member" in the singular or plural means a member of the Council (or a director or directors when referred to in the Act and Table C in the sense of an individual director or individual directors).

- The Articles contained in Table C including Article shall apply to the Charity and shall be deemed to be expressly incorporated herein with the exceptions, modifications and additions hereafter contained.
- 3. The Charity is established for the purposes express in the Memorandum of Association.
- 4. (a) The number of members with which the Charity proposes to be registered shall be two.
 - (b) The Committee at their absolute discretion may from

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time to time admit new members provided that (excepting the persons referred to in Section 28 (1)(b) of the Act) the number of members of the Charity shall be limited to 100

- The subscribers of the Memorandum of Association and such other persons as the Committee shall admit to membership shall be members of the Charity.
- (d) Every member shall sign a written application or consent to become a member.
- (e) The Secretary shall keep an accurate Register of Members.
- 5. The rights of a member shall not be transferable or transmissible.
- 6. Any member may withdraw from membership by giving one month's notice in writing to the Charity (subject to the provisions of Section 212 of the Act).
- The Charity may without showing cause by a resolution passed by a majority consisting of not less than two-thirds of the Committee Members present at a special meeting of the Committee of and at which a member in question has been given reasonable notice and a reasonable opportunity of being heard in his own defence convened solely (or inter alia) for the purpose of considering such resolution refuse to continue any person as a member of the Charity, and if any such resolution shall be so passed then (subject as in Article 6 provided) such person shall cease to be a member and his name shall be removed from the Register of Members.
- 8. Without prejudice to Article 7. the Committee may by a majority of not less than two-thirds at any meeting of the Committee refuse to continue any person as a member if that person is in arrears with the payment of such annual subscription as the Committee shall from time to time resolve.
- 9. It shall be lawful for the Committee to provide for the admission of such persons as they may think fit to be Friends or Associates of the Company, and for the rights, duties and liabilities (if any) of such Friends or Associates but so that such persons shall not by virtue of having been admitted to be such Friends of Associates as aforesaid be members of the Company, and that such rights shall not include a right to speak or vote at General Meetings of the Charity. The Secretary shall keep an accurate register of such Friends or Associates of the Charity.
- 10. In Regulation 9 of Table C, the words "declaring a dividend" shall be omitted.
- 11. There shall be added to Article 23 of Table C the following words "On a show of hands a member present only



by proxy shall have no vote, but a proxy for a corporation may vote on a show of hands."

- It shall be lawful for the Committee to provide for the creation of the office of President and (one or more) Vice Presidents and Patrons of the Charity and for the creation of an Advisory Council for the Charity, for the admission and retirement of persons to such offices and to membership of the advisory Council and for the powers, rights, duties and liabilities (if any) of such persons and of the Advisory Council but so that such persons shall not by virtue only of having been admitted to be Honorary Officers or Advisory Council members be members of the Charity, and that such rights shall not include a right to speak or vote at General Meetings or meetings of the Committee of the Charity. The Secretary shall keep an accurate register of any such Honorary Officers and Advisory Council of the Charity.
- 13. Article 31 of Table C shall be omitted. The first Committee Members shall be appointed in writing by the subscribers to the Memorandum of Association.
- 14. Unless otherwise determined by a General Meeting the number of Committee Members shall not be less than two nor more than twenty.
- 15. In Article 32 of Table C, the first two sentences shall be omitted.
- 16. The Committee may appoint a Director (who may or may not be a Committee Member or a member). The Director shall have such powers and duties in relation to the conduct of the business the Company as the committee shall from time to time determine.
- 17. The words "and every director present at the meeting of directors or committee of directors shall sign his name in the book to be kept for that purpose" shall be omitted from Article 37 of Table C.
- 18. Article 44 of Table C shall be omitted.
- 19. In Article 52 of Table C the words "and/or such other persons" shall be inserted after the words "members of their body".
- 20. In Article 63:-
 - (a) the words and figures "Sections 148-157" shall be substituted for the words and figures "sections 148, 150 and 157".
 - the words "income and expenditure" shall be substituted for profit and loss".
 - (c) the words "group accounts (if any)" shall be omitted.
- 21. Every Committee Member or other officer (including Auditor) of the Charity shall be entitled to be indemnified out of the assets of the Charity against all losses or liabilities (including any such liability as is mentioned in paragraph (b) of the proviso to Section 205 of the Act) which he may sustain or incur in or about the execution of the duties of his office or otherwise in relation thereto, and no Committee member or other officer (including Auditor) shall be liable for any loss, damage or misfortune which may happen or be incurred by the Company in the execution of the duties of his office or in relation

thereto; but this Article shall only have effect in so far as its provisions are not avoided by the said section.

- 22. The Director and the team of senior staff of the Charity shall be entitled to make their view on any matter affecting the Charity known to the Committee at any time and shall be entitled to circulate memoranda, notes and accounts to the Committee.
- 23. The provisions of Clause 7 of the Memorandum of Association relating to the winding up or dissolution of the Charity shall have effect and be observed as if the same were repeated in these Articles.
