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DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their Annual Report and the audited Financial Statements of Paragon Salvage Recovery (No 2) Limited ('the Company'), registration no 1860064, for the year ended 30 September 2010

BUSINESS REVIEW AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of The Paragon Group of Companies PLC ('the Group') The principal activity of the Company was the administration and collection of a portfolio of unsecured arrears loans The Company is currently engaged in loan relationships with other group companies

The Company's profit and loss account is shown on page 5. The retained profit has stayed consistent with the preceding year at £5,000.

The balance sheet on page 6 of the Financial Statements shows the Company's financial position at the year end Net assets have decreased due to the interim dividend being paid during the year. Details of amounts owed from and to other group companies are shown in notes 7 and 10

The directors recommend no final dividend (2009 £nil) which, given the interim dividend of £50,000 per share (2009 £nil), means a total dividend for the year of £50,000 per share (2009 £nil)

The Group manages its operations on a centralised basis. For this reason, the Company's directors believe that further key performance indicators for the Company are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business. The performance of the Group's mortgage lending operation, which includes the Company, is discussed in the Group's Annual Report, which does not form part of this Report.

PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Company's primary financial assets and liabilities are with other group companies, therefore the directors do not consider that the Company is exposed to any significant cash flow, credit or liquidity risks

After considering the above, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company will have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the Financial Statements.
