The principal activities of the company are the toll manufacture and procurement of soft drinks in the UK and Ireland

The company's Key Performance Indicators are the level of turnover, reflecting the volume of products sold, and the level of operating profit The turnover for the year was £19,758,000 (2006 £21,332,000) and operating profit was £2,103,000 (2006 £1,846,000)

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Accounting convention

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom

(b) Depreciation

Freehold land is not depreciated. Other tangible assets are depreciated at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset evenly over its expected useful life as follows.

Freehold buildings

20 years

Plant & Machinery

7 years

(c) Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for any obsolete or slow-moving items

(d) Foreign currencies

Monetary assets, habilities, revenues and costs denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the rates of exchange ruling at the dates of the transactions. Monetary assets and habilities at the balance sheet date are translated at the year end rates of exchange. All exchange differences arising are reported as part of the results for the year.

(e) Cash flow statement

Publicly available consolidated accounts are produced by the group's ultimate parent undertaking, The Coca-Cola Company and, under FRS 1 (revised), Coca-Cola International Sales Limited is therefore not required to prepare a cash flow statement

(f) Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all material timing differences that have originated, but not reversed, by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax is measured on a non-discounted basis at tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences reverse. Deferred tax assets are recognised where their recovery is considered more likely than not in that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of underlying timing differences can be deducted.

2 TURNOVER

Turnover comprises the invoiced price of goods and services supplied by the company stated net of value added tax. The whole of the company's turnover arises from the promotion and sale of soft drinks
