## 1. Accounting Policies

## **Basis of preparation**

These financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 1985 and applicable accounting standards. The principal accounting policies are set out below.

## **Cash Flow Statement and Related Party Transactions**

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of George Wimpey Plc and is included in the consolidated financial statements of George Wimpey Plc, which are publicly available. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS 1 (Revised 1996).
