1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom.

1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of freehold land and buildings and include the results of the company's operations which are described in the Directors' Report and all of which are continuing.

1.2 Basis of Consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of Silver Ski Holidays Limited and all its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to the 30 April 2004. Intra-group transactions are eliminated on consolidation and all figures relate to external transactions only. Foreign taxes borne by overseas subsidiaries are reported by financial year to the 31 December preceding the financial year end.

1.3 Turnover

Turnover comprises the invoiced value of goods and services supplied by the group, exclusive of Value Added Tax and trade discounts.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

All the freehold properties owned by the group are holiday chalet properties situated in the French Alps, used in the tour operator business. All the freehold properties owned by the group were independently valued in 2004 by 'Immobiliére Courcheval'. All valuations are on an open market existing use basis and the directors consider that the valuations reflect the current values. Freehold properties are let on annual operating leases to Silver Ski Holidays Limited. No depreciation is provided on the freehold land and buildings owned by the Group, as it is the group's policy to maintain its properties in such condition that the

value to the business of the property as a whole is not impaired by the passage of time. As a consequence, any element of depreciation would, in the opinion of the directors, be immaterial. The maintenance costs are charged to the profit and loss account in the year incurrent. This accounting treatment, which is a departure from the statutory requirement is, in the opinion of the directors, necessary to provide a true and fair view.

1.5 Goodwill

Goodwill arising on consolidation is written off to profit and loss account on acquisition.

1.6 Leasing and hire purchase

Assets obtained under hire purchase contracts and finance leases are capitalised as tangible fixed assets. Assets acquired by finance lease are depreciated over the shorter of the lease term and their useful lives. Assets acquired by hire purchase are depreciated over their useful lives. Finance leases are those where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership are assumed by the company. Obligations under such agreements are included in creditors net of the finance charge allocated to future periods. The finance element of the rental payment is charged to the profit and loss account so as to produce a constant periodic rate of charge on the net obligation outstanding in each period.

1.7 Operating leases

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged to profit and loss account as incurred.

1.8 Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling on the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken intro account in arriving at the operating profit.

1.9 Deferred taxation

Provision is made for taxation deferred as a result of material timing differences between the incidence of income and expenditure for taxation and accounts purposes, using the liability method, only to the extent that, in the opinion of the directors, there is a reasonable probability that a liability or asset will crystallise in the near future.
