Report of Council for the year ended 30th September 2015

Council presents its report together with the audited financial statements of the Devon County Agricultural Association (the Association) for the year to 30th September 2015, which comply with current statutory requirements and with the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities, issued in March 2005.

The Charity as a Company Limited by Guarantee and its Objects

The Association, founded in 1872, is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association, most recently amended in January 2008. The objects of the Association are the advancement of agriculture in the County of Devon and the encouragement of education and knowledge of agriculture and country pursuits. These objects are particularly fostered by the promotion of the annual Devon County Show. Westpoint Centre (Devon) Limited, a wholly owned subsidiary, manages the Westpoint Exhibition Centre which is used for concerts, exhibitions, trade fairs and other events. The profits of Westpoint are covenanted to the Association to contribute towards its charitable activities.

The Council of the Association

The Association is controlled by its Council, which is limited to a maximum of 100 elected members, who act as the Trustees and directors of the Company. In addition, the Association invites a number of local authorities and societies with interests in agriculture and the countryside to appoint non-voting representatives to Council. The members of Council who held office at 30th September 2015 are listed on pages 6 and 7.

All members of the Association are entitled to stand for election to Council and are strongly encouraged to involve themselves in the governance of the Association and its voluntary activities by seeking election firstly to its committees and then to Council itself. Many of those elected will have served on committees or as stewards, where they will have gained a sound knowledge of the Association and the appropriate experience and skills to become a Member of Council. All newly elected Council members receive induction support, including briefing papers about the Association, Charity Commission publications describing the responsibilities of trustees and the Association's Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Board of Management regularly briefs Council on Charity Commission guidance documents and monitors the evolution of charity law and practice. Council sets out to ensure that, through the annual County Show in particular, the Association continues to provide considerable public benefit to the wider community of Devon.

The Chairman of Council

Mr J A T Lee OBE, having served as Chairman for seven years, stood down at the meeting of Council held on 30th March. He remains a member of Council. He is due much praise and sincere thanks for the dedicated and efficient way in which he has served the Association not only as Chairman and as a member of the Board of Management, but in so many roles over so many years.

In his place, Council has elected Mrs Mary Quicke MBE, President of the Association in 2012.

The Board of Management

Council has delegated most of its powers to the Board of Management, which meets regularly to oversee the affairs of the Association. Mrs Mary Quicke has replaced Mr J A T Lee, as an ex officio, being Chairman of Council. During the year Mr T L Hammett retired by rotation from the Board and was re-elected unopposed. Subsequently the board re-elected Mr John Maunder as Chairman. The members of the Board of Management at 30th September 2015 were:

Council Members

Council is proud to welcome the Countess of Arran MBE DL, as President Elect, following her election at the Annual General Meeting in January 2015. She follows in the footsteps of her mother, Lady Margaret Fortescue, who in 1989 became the first Lady President of the Association for the last County Show on the Whipton showground. Since 2008 she has been a judge of the Association's annual Prince of Wales award. She was appointed High Sheriff of Devon in 1994 and a Deputy Lieutenant of Devon in 1998.

Council wishes the President Elect a most successful 2016 Show and year.

Council mourns the passing of two very significant past Presidents. The Earl of Devon died unexpectedly on 18th August, aged 73. Elected a Life member in 1966 and a Vice President in 1974, he joined the livestock committee 1981-85, became a member of Council in 1987 and was elected President for 2003. Born in the dark days of the last war, he was brought up at Powderham Castle, the family home of the Courtenays for 700 years. He dedicated his life to restoring an estate in recent decline, introducing modern farming methods, restoring the gardens and deer park to their original 18th-century splendour, while developing tourism and commercial enterprise throughout the Estate. He was generous in his support not only of this Association but of numerous charities and voluntary organisations within the county such as President of the Country Landowners' Association, regional chairman of the Historic Houses Association and a trustee of both the Exeter Cathedral Preservation Trust and the Devon Historic Churches Trust. He was appointed Deputy Lieutenant of Devon in 1991 and Vice Lord-Lieutenant of Devon in 2002.

The Earl of Morley died on 20th September, aged 92. He was elected to the Association in 1973 and Life Vice President in 1983. He served on the Finance and General Purposes Committee 1985–90, the New Showground Committee 1983-90 (Chairman 1983) and became a member of Council in 1986. He was elected President for 1984. He was instrumental in the constitutional changes that created a separate permanent Chairman of Council, previously chaired by the annual President, and the conversion of the Association into a company limited by guarantee, so minimising the risk to members in the event of a financial crisis. He joined the 60th Rifles in 1941, continuing a military career well into the 1950s. Following his appointment as a Deputy Lieutenant of Devon in 1973, he was appointed Lord-Lieutenant of Devon 1982-97. Among many voluntary offices he held, he was a founding trustee of the Exeter Cathedral Preservation Trust, President of Devon Young Farmers Clubs, Governor of Seale Hayne Agricultural College and was active in both the Devon and Royal Cornwall Agricultural Associations.

Both these past Presidents gave outstanding service to the wider community of Devon and were prominent figures to be much admired. To both their families, Council wishes to extend its deepest condolences.

Council further extends its deepest condolences to the family of Mrs Isobel Mortimer who died in her sleep on 2nd October. Isabel became a member of the Association in 1976; in 1983 she was appointed a catering steward and joined the catering committee in 1986, becoming Chairman and Chief Steward 1992-99. She was a Council member 1986-2004 and was made an Honorary Life Vice President in 1999. Farming near Crediton, she and her late husband, John, were both passionate supporters of the Association. She will be sadly missed.

Financial Statements

Council presents the audited financial statements for the Association including its subsidiary, Westpoint Centre (Devon) Limited, for the year ended 30th September 2015. On consolidated turnover of £2,275,729 (2014 - £2,042,957), the Association achieved a surplus of £85,308 (2014 – loss £480,269). This welcome return to profit comes after three years of losses, being the first surplus since 2011. In the Consolidated Statement of Financial Activities on page 11, the surplus for the year is shown as a Movement in total funds for the year. The surplus has increased the Fund Balance at 30th September 2015, in effect the book value of the assets of the Association, to £2,697,146.

Review of Business

Under the Presidency of David Parish, in his dual role also as Honorary Show Director, the 2015 Show returned to its normal self in reasonable weather conditions. Total Association and Show income, excluding Westpoint Centre (Devon) Ltd, returned to a more normal £1,265,056, compared with £919,405 for 2014 when the Saturday Show day was abandoned. Public Admission income (in advance and on the day) recovered to £489,187 (2014 - £230,774 net of compensation), Trade Stand fees to a slightly disappointing £396,767 (2014 - £361,297 net), catering concession income to £75,257 (2014 - £41,240 net), while income from members increased 3.5% to £62,239 (2014 - £60,150). Direct Show Costs were well contained at £1,177,026 (2014 - £1,177,093 excluding compensation). The Show Gross Contribution recovered to a more normal £93,231 (2014 - loss £257,688).

Unexpectedly the Westpoint subsidiary enjoyed its best year since 2011. Turnover including catering commissions increased 5.9% to £943,854 (2014 - £891,482), with a decline in event direct costs following the end of ice shows at Westpoint, the net contribution to the Association increased 24.6% to £557,744 (2014 - £447,586).

Rent and related income, previously affected by voids, recovered to £66,817 (2014 - £58,564). With increased borrowings to finance the 2014 loss and the solar panels project, unsurprisingly interest paid increased substantially to £14,079 (2014 - £4,774).

Fixed Assets and Finances

Council has once again decided not to re-value any of the freehold land and buildings and consequently not to recognise in the accounts any revaluation surplus for the tenanted investment properties that could arise.

After detailed examination of numerous alternative green energy proposals, the Board of Management approved the purchase (as against leasing) of a solar panel array with a rated output of some 150 kWh for installation on the roof of the Westpoint exhibition building. The total cost of £135,000 was partly financed by a ten year loan with interest fixed at just under 4% per annum. The anticipated life of the array is 20 years. But on the advice of the Treasurer, depreciation will be applied over 10 years. The value of the gross output is forecast at £30,000 per annum. Costs other than depreciation and interest are minimal.

It will be recalled that to finance the 2014 loss, in October 2014 the Treasurer put in place borrowing facilities totalling £750,000, of which £300,000 is a flexible repayment ten year loan. In early 2015 these facilities were augmented with the £100,000 ten year loan to finance the solar panel array.

Capital expenditure for the current year totalled £162,135 (2014 - £60,486). Taking into account the 2015 non-cash depreciation of £199,890 (2014 - £213,289) and the surplus for the year, total bank borrowings fell by £74,342 to £621,656 (2015 - £695,998). Net current liabilities plus long term debt, a better measure of total debt, fell by £123,063 to £643,804 (2014 - £766,867). If the cost of the solar panel array is added back, on the basis that the investment was an exceptional opportunity, the true positive cash flow would have amounted to £258,000.

Reserves and the Future

Council continues to review the reserves of the Association. With depreciation again exceeding capital expenditure and due to the Association surplus, the free reserves deficit, otherwise the net current assets shortfall, has reduced by £175,063 and at 30th September 2015 there were net current liabilities of £291,804 (2014 - £466,867). Council continues to regard an appropriate level of reserves to equate to current assets exceeding current liabilities, underscoring the need to continue to reduce bank debt, which will remain central to the policy of Council and the Board of Management.

Council regards these results as highly satisfactory following three years of losses and considering the financial problems it faced when forced to abandon the final day of the 2014 Show. In 2015 the Association needed to rebuild the confidence of the public and prove it could run a successful Show. 2015 clearly suffered from a lack

of confidence when considering the public admission and trade stand revenues. Accordingly Council now looks to the 2016 Show with some confidence. However current bookings for Westpoint are lower than in late 2014, due to the cancellation or failure of three major events from previous years. Overall this leaves Council concerned for the eventual outcome for 2016 and consequently it intends to continue to restrict capital expenditure and maintain a tight control over all costs.

Risk Management

The Board of Management continually assesses the business risks through the normal budgetary process and seeks to ensure that effective systems and controls are in place to mitigate them. Risk management is a regular agenda item at meetings of the Board of Management. Risks and their management fall into three categories - the stability of the budgetary and financial control system, policies and procedures to prevent fraud and to protect the integrity of the physical assets of the Association and its subsidiary, and monitoring and maintaining adequate third party liability insurance cover to protect the Association from claims for loss or compensation following injury or damage.

Auditors

At the forthcoming Annual General Meeting, the Treasurer will propose the re-appointment of Bishop Fleming as auditors to the Association.

Council's thanks to all the Stewards and Staff

To manage and run the Devon County Show, Council relies heavily on the voluntary efforts of its 12 chief stewards, 22 senior stewards and more than 300 stewards and committee members, all of whom continued to give generously of their time. To the thousands of hours of voluntary work contributed by them during the Show, and throughout the year, must be added the work of the professional team in the Association office, lead by Mr Richard Maunder, Chief Executive and Association Secretary, and Mrs Ollie Allen, Show Secretary.

To the Association staff and to all the voluntary stewards and committee members, Council and the Board of Management extend warm thanks for their continuing dedicated service and loyalty.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008). The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP), 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' published in March 2005, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

The Statement of financial activities (SOFA) and Balance sheet consolidate the financial statements of the Association and its subsidiary undertaking. The results of the subsidiary are consolidated on a line by line basis.

No separate SOFA has been presented for the Association alone as permitted by section 408 of the Companies Act 2006 and paragraph 397 of the SORP.

1.2 COMPANY STATUS

The Association is a company limited by guarantee. In the event of the Association being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the Association.

1.3 FUND ACCOUNTING

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Council members in furtherance of the general objectives of the Association and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the Association for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investment income, gains and losses are allocated to the appropriate fund.

1.4 INCOMING RESOURCES

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of financial activities when the Association has entitlement to the funds, certainty of receipt and the amount can be measured with sufficient reliability.

Donated services or facilities, which comprise donated services, are included in income at a valuation which is an estimate of the financial cost borne by the donor where such a cost is quantifiable and measurable. No income is recognised where there is no financial cost borne by a third party.

Income tax recoverable in relation to donations received under Gift Aid or deeds of covenant is recognised at the time of the donation.

Income tax recoverable in relation to investment income is recognised at the time the investment income is receivable.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.5 RESOURCES EXPENDED

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been included under expense categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular activities they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of the resources.

Costs of activities in furtherance of the charity's objectives relates to the costs incurred in respect of the Devon County Show.

1.6 BASIS OF CONSOLIDATION

The financial statements consolidate the accounts of Devon County Agricultural Association and all of its subsidiary undertakings ('subsidiaries').

The Association has taken advantage of the exemption contained within section 408 of the Companies Act 2006 not to present its own Income and expenditure account.

1.7 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Freehold land is not depreciated. Freehold land and buildings are included at cost less accumulated depreciation. As the tenanted investment properties are inextricably part of the showground buildings and can never offer unrestricted public access, no arms length open market valuation would be meaningful.

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed for impairment when events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is not charged on freehold land. Depreciation on other tangible fixed assets is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of those assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Freehold property - 5 - 50 years
Plant and machinery - 5 - 10 years
Fixtures and fittings - 3 - 5 years

1.8 INVESTMENTS

Investments in subsidiaries are valued at cost less provision for impairment.

1.9 PENSIONS

The Association facilitates membership of a stakeholder pension scheme open to all employees and makes contributions in the case of staff members who have decided to join the scheme. Such costs are charged to the consolidated statement of financial activities on an accruals basis.

1.10 VAT

Expenditure is stated exclusive of recoverable input VAT where applicable.

1.11 TAXATION

Based on its status as a registered charity and the use of funds for charitable purposes the Association is exempt from corporation taxation on the whole of its income.

The gross and net book value of freehold land and buildings includes £402,563 (2014: £402,563) being the cost of land, a non-depreciable asset. In addition, an amount of £343,682 (2014: £343,682) relating to tenanted investment properties is included within the gross and net book value of freehold land and buildings. This amount being the cost of conversion of otherwise redundant or surplus buildings and the converted dairy barn offices. This does not include a proportion of the original cost of the showground that could have been attributed to these buildings. Council has considered the probable open market value of the investment properties, which normally would be significantly higher than this historic cost. It recognises that they are inextricably part of the showground buildings and can never be separated or be provided with unrestricted public access. It has concluded that no arms length open market valuation would be meaningful.

Council has once again decided not to re-value any of the freehold land and buildings and consequently not to recognise in the accounts any revaluation surplus for the tenanted investment properties.
