#### REPORT OF COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2019

Council presents its report together with the audited financial statements of the Devon County Agricultural Association (the Association) for the year to 30th September 2019, which comply with current statutory requirements and with the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities, issued in March 2005.

#### The Charity as a Company Limited by Guarantee and its Objects

The Association, founded in 1872, is a registered charity and a company limited by guarantee. It is governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association, most recently amended in January 2018. The objects of the Association are the advancement of agriculture in the County of Devon and the encouragement of education and knowledge of agriculture and country pursuits. These objects are particularly fostered by the promotion of the annual Devon County Show. Westpoint Centre (Devon) Limited, a wholly owned subsidiary, manages the Westpoint Exhibition Centre, which, outside the County Show time, is used for educational and charitable events as well as concerts, exhibitions and trade fairs. The profits of Westpoint are covenanted to the Association to contribute towards its charitable activities.

#### The Council of the Association

The Association is controlled by its Council, which is limited to a maximum of 100 elected members, who act as the Trustees and Directors of the Company. In addition, the Association invites a number of local authorities and societies with interests in agriculture and the countryside to appoint non-voting representatives to Council. The members of Council who held office at 30th September 2019 are listed on pages 6 and 7.

All members of the Association are entitled to stand for election to Council and are strongly encouraged to involve themselves in the governance of the Association and its voluntary activities by offering to become a Steward, seeking election to a committee and then to Council itself. Many current Council members have gained a sound knowledge of the Association and the appropriate experience and skills by such service. All newly elected Council members receive induction support; including briefing papers about the Association, Charity Commission publications describing the responsibilities of trustees and a copy of the Association's Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Board of Management regularly briefs Council on Charity Commission guidance documents and monitors the evolution of charity law and practice. Council seeks to ensure that, through the annual County Show in particular, the Association continues to provide considerable public benefit to the wider community of Devon.

#### The Presidents of the Association 2018 and 2019

Council welcomed Sir Harry Studholme Bt DL as President of the Association for 2019 together with his wife, Lucy and expresses its deep gratitude to them for all they contributed. His extensive knowledge of forestry and being Chairman of the Forestry Commission brought a new dimension to the Show. They were both widely greeted by stewards, exhibitors and the public alike, during their tours, with many being impressed by his keen interest in their affairs and the unusual extent of his knowledge.

At the Annual General Meeting next January, Council will also welcome the Lord Lieutenant of Devon, Mr David Fursdon, as President of the Association for 2020. In 1972 he won a scholarship to St John's College, Oxford, where he was twice awarded a cricket blue including in 1975, when he scored 112 not out against the Cambridge team. Following a spell in the MOD, more than 40 years ago he moved to Devon, where he taught at Blundell's school in Tiverton and was subsequently Chair of the Governors for 10 years. He later qualified as a rural surveyor and has worked in agriculture and rural property across Devon and elsewhere for over 30 years. His voluntary work has included prominent roles in the CLA, the National Trust, the Crown Estate, the Duchy of Cornwall, English Heritage and Historic Houses.

Council greatly looks forward to welcoming David Fursdon, as President, and his wife Catriona for 2020.

#### The Board of Management

Council has delegated most of its powers to the Board of Management, which meets regularly to oversee the affairs of the Association. However Council members are the Trustees of the Association and thus retain the ultimate decision making power when necessary.

Following the death of Sir John Cave Bt in summer 2018, Council at its July meeting resolved that the election of his replacement on the Board would be postponed until that December, after the end of the financial year. Subsequently at the meeting of Council held in December 2018 it was announced that Sir Harry Studholme Bt DL had been elected by ballot. Following the usual call for nominations to the Board last May, Mrs Deborah Custance Baker and J A T Lee OBE were re-elected unopposed for a further three years. #### **Council Members**

Council congratulates Mrs Heleen Lindsay-Fynn and Mrs Grania Phillips on their appointment as Deputy Lieutenants of Devon, both following their recent years as High Sheriff of Devon.

Council deeply mourns the death of Nick Davey on the 3rd July, after a fall in Exeter. He had been the Chief Steward of Woodland and the last Chairman of the Woodland Committee before it merged with the Country Life section. He had been an avid supporter of the Show, exhibiting for many years with his business Perrie Hale Nursery Ltd. Well known to many stewards and members, he will be sadly missed.

Council also mourns the death of Mrs Jennifer Rabjohns, who died on 4th December 2018. She had been a trade stand steward for many years and was the Young Farmers' representative on Council from 1984 to 1993.

Council wishes to convey its deepest sympathies to both their families.

#### **Financial Statements**

Council presents the audited financial statements for the Association including its subsidiary, Westpoint Centre (Devon) Limited, for the year ended 30th September/2019. On consolidated turnover of £2,558,134 (2018 - £2,284,990), the Association enjoyed a surplus of £234,402 (2018 deficit - £50,760), the largest surplus ever. In the Consolidated Statement-of-Financial Activities on page 12, the surplus for the year is shown as the Net Movement in Funds. The surplus has increased-the Total Funds Carried Forward at 30th September 2019, in effect the book value of the assets of the Association, to £2,937,901.

#### Review of Business

Under the Presidency of Sir Harry Studholme and successfully lead by the new Honorary Show Director, Stewart Stevens, in warm and generally dry weather, the 2019 County Show was an outstanding financial success. It achieved an income of £1;390,472, a welcome increase of some £151,009 over the £1,239,463 for 2018. Public Admission income (in advance and on the day) improved by 12.8% to £491,068 (2018 - £435,313). A most successful marketing campaign by the show office staff lead to an impressive increase in Trade Stand fees which rose by £40,545, 10.6%, to £422,770 (2018 - £382,225), Catering concession income up by £11,640, 14.8%, to £90,045 (2018 - £78,405) and income from Sponsorship up £27,849, 21.3%, to a record £158,519 (2018 - £130,673). Following a five yearly increase in Subscription rates, income from Members increased by £3,267, 5.7%, to £60,575 (2018 - £57,308). In contrast Direct Show Costs, due to a concerted drive for efficiencies, fell by £114,148, 9.3%, to £1,113,682 (2018 - £1,227,830). The combination of increased income and reduced costs meant that the Show Net Contribution jumped by £273,283 to £276,790 (2018 - £3,507), probably the best result on record.

The Westpoint subsidiary also improved its financial results. An unexpected last minute booking in September by a political party helped to boost its margin by £10,000, leading turnover including catering commission to increase overall by £118,489, 12.3%, to £1,081,438 (2018 - £962,949) while the net contribution to the Association increased by £72,689, 17.1%, to £630,517 (2018 - £557,828), which the Board of Management regards as a highly satisfactory result.

The Association supports Farmwise, a charity set up to educate children about farming, with an annual event in the Exhibition building, for which the Association also provides accounting services. Included in these accounts is

a prior year brought forward balance of £8,061. Following an interim loss for the autumn 2018 event of £3,928, the carried forward positive balance was £4,133. However Farmwise will also benefit from generous sponsorship of £6,000 which will be brought into account in the following financial year. In addition, as part of the Farmwise partnership, a Schools Trailer project has separately raised £5,500, funds which are restricted and have yet to be spent.

Rent and related income, increased slightly to £86,224, and interest paid fell marginally to £3,563. Overall the excellent outcome from both the County Show and Westpoint has produced the best result in memory, with a net surplus of £234,402, which follows the 2018 deficit of £50,760. This turn-round has lead the Board of Management to approve a bonus to all staff, which, including NIC will cost close to £40,000, some 15% of the pre-bonus surplus. This is a well-earned reward, which recognises their successful contribution towards this exceptional surplus. Indeed the Board particularly wish to recognise the efforts and work of all the office staff and Sam Mackenzie Green, noting that not only has the show income risen, but costs have been significantly reduced

#### Fixed Assets, Finances and the Exhibition Building roof

The Report of Council accompanying the 2018 accounts noted that the Exhibition Building roof had reached the end of its design life, then being 30 years old. The Board of Management was advised that the most economic and best way forward was to lay a new steel skin over the existing roof. The estimated cost of this work has now been confirmed at £753,000 and Council has approved this expenditure. At the date of this report the roof contract is approaching its completion. At 30th September progress payments were already £304,539. This amount has been capitalised in these accounts, but the cost of the new roof will not be depreciated until the contract is completed early in 2020. The Board of Management intend that the new roof should be written off over 25 years, the period for which the new roof-will be covered by the contractor's guarantee.

These exceptional 2019 financial results and the strong cash flow that has resulted now mean that, whereas 12 months ago the Treasurer believed that the additional bank finance required for the roof would be in the region of £600,000, in the event both the Treasurer and the Board of Management have concluded that a seven year loan of only £450,000 is sufficient, of which the first £200,000 has recently been drawn. The variable rate of interest has been agreed at NatWest base rate plus 2.39%. With base rate at 0.75% the current cost is 3.14% and is repayable by fixed quarterly payments of capital and interest of £13,050, £52,200 per annum. At the end of the seven years, the remaining loan-of £150;300 will-remain to be refinanced.

Even to meet these repayments and to continue funding the minimum capital expenditure required to keep up to date the fixed assets of the Association for the next few years, it will need to generate a minimum positive cash flow of £150,000 - £200,000 pa. This was easily achieved in 2019, but Council is aware that in future the profitability of the Association will need to improve on that of the previous 5 year period, 2014 - 2018.

All other capital expenditure in the current year was only £23,465 (2018 - £102,267). Taking account of the 2019 non-cash depreciation of £201,8667(2018'-£201,719), the surplus for the year and the total capital expenditure of £328,004, the cash flow still remained positive at £108,264 (2018 - £48,692), when capital expenditure was only £102,267, giving a closing net cash balance of £16,247. The loan due after more than one year for the solar panels declined to £47,533. Net current liabilities plus long term debt, a better measure liquidity, fell by £108,264 to £175,807 (2018 - £284,071).

Council has once again decided not to re-value any of the freehold land and buildings and consequently not to recognise in the accounts any revaluation surplus for the tenanted investment properties that could arise.

#### Reserves and the Future

Council continues to review the reserves of the Association. It regards an appropriate level of reserves to equate to current assets exceeding current liabilities.

2019 has achieved the best financial results in the history of the Association. Council realises that continuing efforts to encourage Trade Stand exhibitors and Sponsors are essential to maintain this year's success, while total overheads will continue to need tight control. The County Show will always be weather dependent and its financial results will fluctuate. Over the last few years the margin between total income and direct costs had tended to shrink. 2019 has reversed that trend. The Board of Management looks to Westpoint to provide reliable

additional income to the County Show and to build on the unusual success of 2019 to achieve a permanent improvement in profitability in future years.

#### Staffing of the Show Office

During the year research by the senior management showed that the County Show had been left behind by other County Show Charities in the control of staffing costs. This was evidenced by the much lower productivity of the Devon County Show office. Other county agricultural shows appear to make better use of more modern computer technology and flexible hours of work, with employees working shorter hours during the autumn and winter. The Board of management concluded that as trustees of the Charity it had no choice but to pursue the savings available. After professional advice and consultation with all staff, it was apparent that existing staff affected preferred redundancy to working fewer hours at reduced salaries. To the great regret of the Board, three staff took voluntary redundancy. Each had served the Association with great dedication and loyalty, for which the Board expresses its sincere thanks and wishes them all well in pursuing their careers elsewhere. They have been replaced by those prepared to accept more flexible terms. The full cost of this re-organisation has been provided in these accounts. The Board expects to achieve savings of at least £35,000 per annum.

#### **Agrifest**

The Agrifest Autumn Livestock Show had been run, independently at Westpoint for a number of years, but with falling income so that financing it in the future could become a problem. In January the Board of Management agreed to a request to assist Agrifest and underwrite its finances. However as the year progressed it was apparent that a number of factors, including some uncertainty over the degree of voluntary support available, caused the Board to be seriously concerned over its ability to successfully manage the show. In September the Board took the difficult decision to cancel the event, which caused much distress to its supporters.

#### **Risk Management**

The Board of Management continually assesses the business risks through the normal budgetary process and seeks to ensure that effective systems and controls are in place to mitigate them. Risk management is a regular agenda item at meetings of the Board. These risks fall into three categories - the stability of the budgetary and financial control system, policies and procedures to prevent fraud and to protect the integrity of the physical assets of the Association and its subsidiary, and monitoring and maintaining adequate third party liability insurance cover to protect the Association from claims for loss or compensation following injury or damage. In view of the reported financial problems faced by another Charity in Devon, for the 2019 Audit, the Board has requested Bishop Fleming particularly to review the adequacy of its financial controls including the handling of cash and to suggest any improvements that should be put in place. The Board also regularly considers volunteer succession and progression, and the need to plan for the next generation.

#### **Auditors**

In 2018 the Board of Management-tested the market for the Audit contract and concluded that Bishop Fleming should be re-appointed, as approved by a resolution of Council in July 2018. At the forthcoming Annual General Meeting, the Treasurer will propose the re-appointment of Bishop Fleming as auditors to the Association.

#### Council's sincere thanks to all the Stewards and Staff

The Devon County Show relies on the dedicated voluntary contribution of its 12 Chief Stewards, 22 Senior Stewards and more than 300 Stewards and committee members, all of whom have continued to give generously thousands of hours of voluntary work, many throughout the year. To this must be added the work of the professional team in the Association office, led by Richard Maunder, Chief Executive and Association Secretary, and Mrs Sam Mackenzie-Green, the new Show Manager. Council also recognises the importance of the Westpoint team as it makes a significant contribution to the Association's finances.

To the Association staff and to all the voluntary Stewards and committee members, Council and the Board of Management extend very warm thanks for their continuing dedicated service and loyalty.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015) - (Charities SORP (FRS 102)), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) and the Companies Act 2006.

Devon County Agricultural Association meets the definition of a public benefit entity under FRS 102. Assets and liabilities are initially recognised at historical cost or transaction value unless otherwise stated in the relevant accounting policy.

The Statement of financial activities (SOFA) and Balance sheet consolidate the financial statements of the company and its subsidiary undertaking. The results of the subsidiary are consolidated on a line by line basis.

No seperate SOFA has been presented for the company alone as permitted by section 408 of the Companies Act 2006.

#### 1.2 COMPANY STATUS

The Association is a company limited by guarantee. In the event of the Association being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the Association.

#### 1.3 FUND ACCOUNTING

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the Council members in furtherance of the general objectives of the Association and which have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the Association for particular purposes. The costs of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund is set, but in the notes to the financial statements.

#### 1.4 INCOME

All income is recognised once the Association has entitlement to the income, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Donated services or facilities are recognised when the Association has control over the item, any conditions associated with the donated item is probable and that economic benefit can be measured reliably. In accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102), the general volunteer time is not recognised. Please refer to the Council members' report for more information about their contribution.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### 1.5 EXPENDITURE

Expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation to transfer economic benefit to a third party, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is classified by activity. The costs of each activity are made up of the total of direct costs and shared costs, including support costs involved in undertaking each activity. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs which contribute to more than one activity and support costs which are not attributable to a single activity are apportioned between those activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Central staff costs are allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use.

Costs of activities in furtherence of the charity/s-objectives-relates to the costs incurred in respect of the Devon County Show.

Costs of trading activities relates to the costs incurred in respect of the subsidiary.

#### 1.6 BASIS OF CONSOLIDATION

The financial statements consolidate the accounts of Devon County Agricultural Association and its subsidiary.

The Association has taken advantage of the exemption contained within section 408 of the Companies Act 2006 not to present its own income and expenditure account.

#### 1.7 TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS AND DEPRECIATION

Freehold land is not depreciated. Freehold buildings are included at cost less accumulated depreciation. As the tenanted investment properties are inextricable part of the showground buildings and can never offer unrestricted public access, no arms length open market valuation would be meaningful.

A review for impairment of a fixed asset is carried out if events or changes in corcumstances indicate that the carrying value of any fixed asset may not be recoverable. Shortfalls between the carrying value of fixed assets and their recoverable amounts are recognised as impairments. Impairment losses are recognised in the Statement of financial activities.

Tangible fixed assets are carried at cost, net of depreciation and any provision for impairment. Depreciation is not charged on freehold land. Depreciaiton is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Freehold property - 5 - 50 years
Plant and machinery - 5 - 10 years
Fixtures and fittings - 3 - 5 years

#### 1.8 INTEREST RECEIVABLE

Interest on funds held on deposit is included when receivable and the amount can be measured reliably by the Association; this is normally upon notification of the interest paid or payable by the Bank.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2019

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### 1.9 DEBTORS

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

#### 1.10 CASH AT BANK AND IN HAND

Cash at bank and in hand includes cash and short-term flighly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

#### 1.11 LIABILITIES AND PROVISIONS

Liabilities are recognised when there is an obligation at the Balance sheet date as a result of a past event, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefit will be required in settlement, and the amount of the settlement can be estimated reliably. Liabilities are recognised at the amount that the Association anticipates it will pay to settle the debt or the amount it has received as advanced payments for the goods or services it must provide. Provisions are measured at the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation.

#### 1.12 FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

The Association only holds basic financial instruments as defined in FRS 102. The financial assets and financial liabilities of the Association and their measurement basis are as follows:

Financial assets - trade and other debtors are basic financial instruments and are debt instruments measured at amortised cost. Prepayments are not financial instruments,

Financial liabilities - trade creditors, accruals and other creditors are financial instruments, and are measured at amortised cost. Taxation and social security are not included in the financial instruments disclosure definition. Defered income is not deemed to be a financial liability, as the cash settlement has already taken place and there is an obligation to deliver services rather than cash or another financial instrument.

#### 1.13 PENSIONS

The Association has a defined contribution pension scheme open to all employees and makes contributions in the case of staff/members who are part of the scheme. Such costs are charged to the consolidated statement of financial activities on an accruals basis.

#### 1.14 VAT

Expenditure is stated exclusive of recoverable input VAT where applicable.

#### 1.15 TAXATION

Based on its status as a registered charity and the use of funds for charitable purposes the Associaton is exempt from corporation taxation on the whole of its income.
