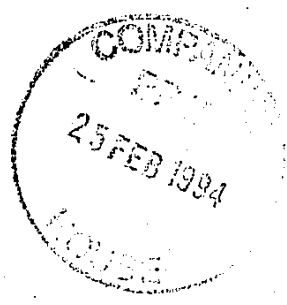

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

Year ended 31st October 1993

I have pleasure in presenting this report on the activities of the Foundation during its seventh year of operation, ending 31st October 1993.

The results for the year are given on page 7. The four Foundations (for England and Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland and the Channel Islands) own 5% of TSB Group's share capital in the form of limited voting shares. In lieu of dividend they receive a covenanted income equal to 1% of the Group's pre-tax profits, averaged over three years. The Foundation for England and Wales receives 72.12% of this income under Deed of Covenant. In 1993 the amount received was slightly reduced from that received in 1992. Overall, 512 donations were approved, totalling £764,186 (compared with 636 totalling £947,849 in 1992). The number of appeals received continues to place great pressure on the funds available.

As in previous years, the four Foundations have contributed to the National Pool, from which donations are made to nationwide appeals. The England and Wales Foundation contributed 15% of its covenanted income to the National Pool, a proportion which will remain the same for 1994.

The Chairmen of the four Foundations decided to take a pro-active approach to their grant-giving from the National Pool in 1993 and identified two charities, RELATE and The Samaritans, to which they gave major donations of £25,000 each with the aim of enabling them to take forward specific projects. RELATE are developing a programme of training for Centre Managers and The Samaritans are expanding their Outreach projects focussing on two high risk groups: people in rural areas and young people. These two projects reflect two of the England and Wales Foundation's priority areas which are described more fully in the Director General's Report.

I am delighted to report that the Matched Giving Scheme, launched in February 1992 for staff across TSB Group, has now provided 255 matched sums totalling £48,611. Charities within the Foundations' guidelines, for which staff have undertaken specific fundraising activities, have received amounts of up to £250.

The Trustees appreciate the decision by the TSB Group Board to guarantee a minimum income of £1m to the four Foundations for 1994, which has enabled us to plan ahead confidently. The share of this sum for the England and Wales Foundation will be £721,200.

The England and Wales Board undertook a further review of its policy relating to Scientific and Medical Research in the light of the reduced funds available for distribution, and decided to continue to make no further commitments in this field until further notice.

1993 has seen two changes of Trustees. I would like to thank John Elbourne, Chief Operating Officer of TSB Retail Banking and Insurance, for his efforts on behalf of the Foundation, continuing to raise awareness of our activities within the branch network. Unfortunately the commercial pressures of managing the bank network have meant that he is unable to continue his role as a Trustee. In August the Board was very sorry to bid farewell to John Douglas who, since the inception of the Foundation in 1987, has devoted considerable time and expertise to the Foundation's work in the West Midlands. The Trustees thank him most warmly for his service and wish him well in his retirement in Dorset.

In their place I am delighted to welcome David Wood, Director of Sales Development, TSB Retail Banking and Insurance who takes over from John Elbourne, and Christine Kenrick who assumes the mantle of responsibility for the West Midlands.

I am pleased to have this opportunity to thank all the Trustees for their hard work - assessing the appeals received, chairing the regional meetings attended by representatives from the bank network and the Foundation office, and giving generously of their time and expertise. I have also continued to value the overview of the charitable activities we seek to support brought by my Deputy Chairman Joanna Foster.

1994 will continue to challenge our judgment of the most effective use of the funds available.

DIRECTOR GENERAL'S REPORT

Year ended 31st October 1993

I am pleased to reflect on my third year as Director General. Applications received amounted to some 3,500, compared with 3,750 in 1992. Of the applications received we have been able to support 16%. 25% have been outside the policy guidelines and the Trustees regret that they were unable to support the remaining 59% owing to lack of available funds.

The main challenge for the staff this year has been to ensure that it has been those applications which offer the most effective use of our still limited resources which have been placed before the Trustees.

I referred last year to the specific priority areas identified by the Trustees. These have been: Employment Training, Young People, Rural Areas, Crime Prevention, Self Help Projects, Homelessness (in particular helping homeless people back into mainstream society) and Carers. The Trustees have allocated approximately one third of the funds available to these priority areas, which will remain the same for 1994, with the exception of Self Help Projects which have proved more difficult to define than we anticipated.

The contribution made by the Area Directors and Foundation Co-ordinators within the bank network in providing local information and knowledge of the charities under consideration has been of great value.

Regular features on the work of the four Foundations have appeared in the TSB Bank in-house magazine "On Line" and other Group-wide publications, and a special supplement was again published this year, highlighting specific donations made throughout the UK.

The TSB Group Management College in Solihull has expanded its programme of in-house training course places offered to managers from the charitable sector, which has been administered by the Foundation. The benefits have proved to be mutual, with both TSB staff and charity managers welcoming the exchange of views on a wide variety of management issues. This initiative has proved a valuable source of in-kind support complementing the still depleted financial support offered to the charitable sector.

The Foundation staff have continued to act as a source of expertise for the Group's Community Affairs Steering Committee. In July, I was pleased to take part in a workshadowing exchange organised by the Understanding British Industry Teacher Placement Service with Linda Coventon, Head of Learning Support at Sedgefield Comprehensive School in South London.

We have maintained our involvement with the Association of Charitable Foundations (ACF) and the Corporate Responsibility Group (CRG) through which we benefit from meeting with fellow grant-givers from both the Trust and corporate sectors. Of particular value have been the two organisations' major conferences. The CRG Annual Consultation in May stimulated debate amongst the corporate sector about four specific issues: Employee Involvement, Rural Economic Regeneration, Long term Unemployment and Education and Future Employment. The ACF conference held this year in Liverpool addressed a wide range of issues affecting the voluntary sector and considered them in the context of one of Britain's most needy cities. The Secretary to the Foundation and myself were among delegates from some 80 Trusts and Foundations who attended seminars and workshops on matters such as educational opportunities for all, health promotion, policy and practice of Trusts, black and ethnic minorities and co-operation with other Trusts.

The Foundation staff are most grateful to all the Trustees for their unfailing willingness to offer advice and guidance throughout the year. 1994 will be an exciting year during which we plan to develop the active approach used on a small scale this year.

TRUSTEES' REPORT

Year ended 31st October 1993

The Trustees present their annual report and the audited accounts for the year ended 31st October 1993.

Incorporation

The TSB Foundation for England and Wales was incorporated on 13th December 1985 as a company limited by guarantee. It is one of four Foundations created to preserve in a permanent framework the TSB's traditional role of contributing to the life of the community. The other three Foundations cover Scotland, Northern Ireland and the Channel Islands. Each Foundation is separate from the others and from the TSB Group and is directed by its own independent Board of Trustees.

Objects

The TSB Foundation for England and Wales is established to do anything which is a charitable purpose according to the laws of England and Wales from time to time principally in, but not limited to, England and Wales and the Isle of Man including in particular:

To advance education and training in all aspects of knowledge by means of (but not limited to) the making of grants, including the establishment of scholarships and prizes, and other like awards.

To advance scientific or medical research, on the condition that all useful results of such scientific or medical research are published, and education in scientific or medical research by means of (but not limited to) the making of grants, including the establishment of scholarships and prizes, and other like awards.

To promote the provision of facilities in the interest of social and community welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation and enjoyment of the arts with the object of improving the conditions of life of people who are disadvantaged by youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances.

Activities

A review of the development of the Foundation during the financial year and of its position at the end of the year is presented in the Chairman's Statement and the Director General's Report on pages 2 and 3. The Statement of Financial Activities on page 7 shows the income received under the Deed of Covenant with TSB Group plc, together with the expenditure, the overall result for the year and the balance carried forward to next year. The authorised donations amounted to some £732,220. Owing to initial uncertainty concerning the level of income for 1994, the Trustees again made provision to carry forward funds to supplement next year's income.

Future Prospects

The Foundation has been guaranteed a minimum of £721,200 under the deed of covenant in respect of the year ending 31st October 1994. It is expected that the Foundation will continue to operate in a similar manner to previous years.

Trustees

The Trustees who are also directors are as listed on page 1.

Auditors

KPMG Peat Marwick have signified their willingness to be reappointed auditors and a resolution to that effect will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Year ended 31st October 1993

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Foundation and of the excess of expenditure over income for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its activities.

The Trustees are required to keep proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Foundation and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Foundation and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the Foundation's affairs as at 31st October 1993 and of its excess of expenditure over income for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.



NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

Note 1
Guarantee Company The Foundation is a company limited by guarantee not having a share capital. The liability of the members is limited by the Memorandum of Association to £1 each. The number of Trustees (including the Chairman) who are also members at 31st October 1993 was twelve.

Note 2
Basis of preparation The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards.

Note 3
Covenant from TSB Group plc The Foundation derives its revenue from TSB Group plc which has entered into a covenant to make annual payments to the England and Wales Foundation of a total amount equal to 0.7212 per cent of one-third of the aggregate pre-tax profits (less pre-tax losses) of the Group for the three years ended on 31st October in the year preceding the year of payment.

Note 4
Other TSB Foundations The accounts incorporate the results of the National Pool to which the four Foundations contribute. The England and Wales Foundation pays 15% of its covenanted income and the Foundations for Scotland, Northern Ireland and the Channel Islands 10% of their respective covenanted incomes. The share of the National Pool at 31st October 1993 attributable to the other Foundations is dealt with as Minority Interests as described in Note 13. In 1993 the England and Wales Foundation contributed £103,853 (1992: £145,683) to the National Pool.

Note 5
Direct charitable expenditure Donations for the year include commitments agreed but not yet paid for the next financial year. This amounts to a total of £33,500 (1992: £100,417). Donations also include amounts paid from the National Pool totalling £138,605 (1992: £182,350). A full list of donations is attached at Appendix 1.

Note 6
Investments The Foundation holds 56,936,842 limited voting shares of 25p each of TSB Group plc, representing 72.12% of such shares in issue, which themselves represent 5% of the issued share capital of the TSB Group plc. The shares have no rights to dividend; have voting rights only in limited circumstances; and may be converted into ordinary shares of TSB Group plc under certain circumstances.

The Foundation also holds a Special Rights Redeemable Preference Share of £1 in TSB Bank plc. This share carries the right to appoint two directors to the Board of TSB Bank plc.

These investments have been stated in the accounts at a cost of nil. TSB Group plc is registered in Scotland. TSB Bank plc is registered in England and Wales.

Note 7
Debtors Debtors represent amounts due from TSB Group plc.

Note 8
Auditors' remuneration The auditors waived their fee for 1992 and the accrual for £890 was credited to income in 1993. The fee for 1993 has also been waived.

**Note 9
Trustees' fees**

The Trustees, who are also the directors of the Foundation, received no remuneration during the year.

Staff**

The average number of persons employed by the Foundation during the year was four (1992: four). Total salary costs amounted to £92,001 (1992: £86,591, a figure of £76,374 relating to only 11 months being disclosed in 1992). The Foundation contributed to pension arrangements in respect of the Director General up to 31st March 1993.

Minority Interests**

20.5% of the balance held in the National F has been contributed by the other three TSB Foundations and these interests are recognised as such by being described as Minority Interests.
