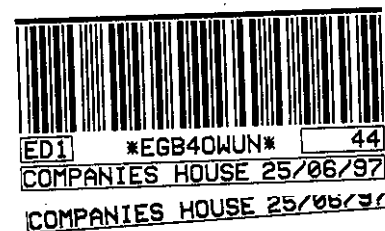

## CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

Period ended 31st December 1996

---

I have pleasure in presenting this report on the activities of the Foundation during its tenth year of operation, a fourteen-month period ending 31st December 1996. The Trustees decided to change the Foundation's year end to come into line with Lloyds TSB Group. TSB Group and the TSB Foundations' financial years had both previously ended on 31st October.

### OVERVIEW OF THE YEAR

Following the merger of Lloyds Bank and TSB Group plc, which took place on 28th December 1995, it was agreed that the TSB Foundations and Lloyds Bank Charitable Trust would continue to operate separate donation programmes during 1996.

An unexpected result of the timing of the merger was that the four TSB Foundations became entitled to 1% of Lloyds Bank's profits for their 1995 year. After discussion with the Charity Commission an arrangement was implemented whereby the budgeted amount for the Lloyds Bank Charitable Trust (£1.4 million) was met out of the unexpected income, with the donations made from the Trust approved by the Trustees of the TSB Foundations. The remaining funds from that unexpected sum (£983,333) were retained for use during 1997, which is the first year of operation of the newly named Lloyds TSB Foundations.

The description of the year's activities which follows relates to the donations made from the Foundation's income attributable to the profits of TSB Group. Lloyds Bank Charitable Trust's activities are described in that charity's own annual report.

The results for the year are given on page 11.

The four Foundations (for England and Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland and the Channel Islands) were established at the time of TSB Group's flotation and endowed with limited voting shares which now represent 1.53% of Lloyds TSB Group's share capital. In lieu of dividend they receive a covenanted income equal to 1% of the Group's pre-tax profits, averaged over three years. The Foundation for England and Wales receives 72.12% of this income under Deed of Covenant. There will be a phased growth in the Foundation's income over the next two years as it increasingly reflects the profit of the enlarged Group.

The amount received by the Foundation for England and Wales was £5,130,136 (compared with £2,033,784 last year). Overall, 1,382 donations were approved and paid, totalling £3,034,594 (compared with 980 totalling £1,884,239 in 1995). During the ten years since the first grants were made in 1987 more than £14 million has been donated by the Foundation for England and Wales.

### PRIORITY AREAS

The Trustees have continued to make the majority of the funds available - 70% - to regional and local projects in keeping with the original ethos of supporting charitable activity in local communities.

As I reported last year, the Trustees identified two new areas of concern - **Parenting** and the **Promotion of Volunteering** - which were added to the existing list of areas of priority: **Employment Training** (in particular for disadvantaged and disabled people), **Crime Prevention, Homelessness** (in particular helping homeless people back into mainstream society), **Carers, Young People, and Rural Areas**. Overall, 42% of grants, totalling £1.3 million, benefited people in one or more of these categories. This compares with £596,854 in 1995, which represented 35% of the donations made.

A full list of the donations made by the Trustees during the year is attached.

## MAJOR DONATIONS

I am pleased to report that confidence in the level of the Foundation's future income has resulted in a significant increase in the proportion of donations which are commitments over two or three years. Applications for core funding have also received sympathetic consideration, a trend which will continue. This reflects the Trustees' wish to respond to the constant request received from the voluntary sector, that grant-giving bodies should recognise their need for a stable funding base. This message sounded strongly in the Recommendations for Trusts and Foundations published in "Meeting the challenge of change: voluntary action into the 21st century", the Report of the English Commission on the Future of the Voluntary Sector, chaired by Professor Nicholas Deakin.

The Report also recommended greater collaboration with other trusts and funders, and the Trustees are delighted to have been involved in the Refugee Education Unit serving the refugee community in East London. The Unit is based at Praxis in Bethnal Green, was established under the initiative of the City Parochial Foundation, and is funded in partnership with the Tudor Trust and Henry Smith's Charity.

The Trustees have been keen to support charities which are able to demonstrate co-operation with others working in a similar field, and were pleased to fund a project presented by Help the Hospices, working jointly with Cruse Bereavement Care to enhance the quality of bereavement counselling throughout the hospice movement.

## NATIONAL POOL

Each of the four Foundations contributed 10% of its income to the National Pool. This fund is used to make donations to charities working throughout the UK, and also to fund the Staff Matched Giving Scheme from which staff throughout the Group are eligible to benefit.

### Medical Research

It had been agreed during 1995 that a small number of grants would be made from the National Pool in the two fields of medical research identified by the Chairmen of the four Foundations - **Mental Health** and **Ageing**. Two grants were approved, to Research into Ageing to fund a three-year research project on age-related macular degeneration, the most common cause of blindness in the UK, and to the Mental Health Foundation towards a study into the impact of psychotherapy on the lifetime cost of Childhood Conduct Disorder. A two-year extension to this was agreed, following evaluation of the first year's work.

### Staff Matched Giving Scheme

I am delighted to report that the Staff Matched Giving Scheme, established in 1992, has grown enormously over the year. During the year 819 members of staff within the former TSB Group received a total of £237,431 to match their own fundraising efforts for charities within the Foundations' guidelines. This compares with 426 donations totalling £81,504 in 1995.

For 1997 a new scheme has been launched to supersede both the TSB Foundations Staff Matched Giving Scheme and the Lloyds Bank "£ for £" scheme. The new scheme covers all members of staff of the enlarged group and £500,000 has been set aside for the year.

## TRUSTEES

With the impending change to the Lloyds TSB Foundation, it has been necessary to make some changes to the Board of Trustees. We have been very sorry to bid farewell to three Trustees, who have all made a distinctive contribution to the work of the Foundation.

Lady Mary Holborow, one of the founding Trustees, completed ten years on the Board, during which time she has given sterling service as regional Trustee for the South West. David Hinton has provided wise counsel for the Foundation's work in the Tyne Tees region since 1989 and


David Wood retires after three years, having been instrumental in the creation of the role of Regional Co-ordinator which has made a great impact on our work at local level in the community and also raised awareness of the Foundation amongst TSB staff. I thank them all most warmly for their contributions.

#### **PLANS FOR 1997**

Throughout the year the Trustees have given particular attention to planning the strategic direction for the Foundation in view of the increased income from 1997. Details are given in the Director General's Report.

The Trustees greatly look forward to the first year of operation as the Lloyds TSB Foundation for England and Wales, and in particular to the opportunities which the increased income will provide to support charitable activity in local communities.

This has been one of the most challenging years in the history of the Foundation, and I am extremely grateful to all my fellow Trustees and to the staff for all their hard work.

**DIRECTOR GENERAL'S REPORT**

Period ended 31st December 1996

---

It is a great pleasure to report on a year in which we have been able to support 35% of those who have applied to us, compared with 26% in 1995. As the statistics on page 7 show, of the 4,000 received (3,750 last year), 18% were outside the policy guidelines (19% in 1995).

**TENTH  
ANNIVERSARY**

1996 was the tenth year of operation of the four Foundations and during the year the total donated by the Foundations passed the £20 million mark.

The anniversary was celebrated with a series of Birthday Parties, starting with a reception held at the House of Commons. This was followed by eight similar events, one held in each of the eight Regions in England and Wales. A wide range of guests were invited, including representatives of beneficiary charities and local authorities, and civic representatives. On each occasion the Regional Trustee cut a Birthday Cake which was subsequently donated to a suitable local charity. The events provided an opportunity to raise awareness of the Foundation and its likely growth following the merger, and managers of local voluntary organisations appreciated the opportunity to discuss matters of concern both with colleagues in the voluntary sector and with representatives of local government.

The year was rounded off with a dinner hosted by Lloyds TSB Group at the National Gallery for Trustees of all four Foundations, together with representatives of the voluntary, statutory and private sectors.

**CO-ORDINATORS**

The eight Regional Co-ordinators continued their important work out in the community, assessing applications and arranging suitable publicity for the donations made. Building on their experience, the majority having been in post for two full years after a career in the bank network, they are now able to offer a wide range of advice to voluntary organisations on funding, management and publicity matters.

Co-ordinators have also given formal presentations to seminars and workshops for representatives of the voluntary sector. Examples include a Fundraisers' Forum at St Ives, a seminar run in conjunction with the Sussex Police Authority for Victim Support Groups, a Funders' Forum organised by South Yorkshire Funding Advice Bureau, a presentation to voluntary and charitable groups in Wigan, and a seminar organised by Wiltshire Community Council.

**TRAINING FOR  
VOLUNTARY  
SECTOR  
MANAGERS**

The Foundation has continued to administer a scheme offering free places on general management courses to managers from the voluntary sector, held at the TSB Management College in Solihull. This year the 34 places were offered to charities working primarily in the fields of volunteering and carers. Delegates from both the company and the charities have continued to comment on the mutual benefit of the scheme and we are delighted that it will continue in 1997.

**ASSOCIATION OF  
CHARITABLE  
FOUNDATIONS  
(ACF)**

All four TSB Foundations were again represented at the ACF conference, held this year in Edinburgh. The programme of Special Interest Groups, visits and seminars has continued to provide valuable opportunities for both staff and Trustees to meet and exchange ideas with others working in similar fields of charitable activity.

**COMMISSION ON  
THE FUTURE OF  
THE VOLUNTARY  
SECTOR**

1996 saw the publication of the Report of the Commission on the Future of the Voluntary Sector, chaired by Professor Nicholas Deakin. The Trustees in their consideration of policy for 1997 noted the Recommendations for Trusts and Foundations, and are particularly pleased that the anticipated increase in income will enable them to develop greater collaboration with other

trusts and funders, strongly recommended by this Report. They will continue to balance concern for innovation with funding of organisations' core activities, including support for voluntary sector infrastructure and for research.

#### PLANS FOR 1997

In anticipation of a considerable increase in applications, the head office team has been expanded to eight people from January 1997.

The Trustees decided during the year that a greater proportion of funding should be allocated to national projects, whilst retaining a commitment to the majority of the income being allocated to grass-roots activity.

It has been agreed to divide the country in accordance with the Standard regions of England, and, for the first time, to treat the whole of the Principality of Wales as an entity in its own right. A Welsh-speaking Co-ordinator has been appointed, with a background in Lloyds Bank, to undertake the role covering Wales.

In the past the allocation of funds has been based on the strength of the bank branch network. In future, regional funding will be made on the basis of population figures, weighted for deprivation. This change will enable the Trustees to draw on nationally reported statistics to identify trends and needs, to inform the Foundation's grant-giving at local and regional level.

The Trustees have decided upon a three-tiered strategy for 1997. The majority of funds will continue to be given to grass-roots charities, in line with the ethos on which the Foundation was established. This level will include a greater level of support for core funding and two- and three-year commitments. Secondly, a greater proportion of funding than in the past will be allocated to national projects, particularly in the Foundation's chosen priority areas. There will again be a focus on core funding for organisations and support for the infrastructure of the voluntary sector. Collaborative projects will be particularly welcome to apply for support. Thirdly, a new field of activity which the increase in funds will enable the Trustees to explore is social policy research. It is anticipated that one or two discrete research projects will be identified, with the possibility of funding follow-up work resulting from recommendations.

In the light of the strategic review, the Foundation's procedures have been thoroughly revised to streamline the process of handling the increased volumes of applications, and new guidelines were issued in November in preparation for the new year.

The new opportunities which the Foundation has for supporting charitable work in local communities have been made widely known to the 80,000 staff within Lloyds TSB Group through several articles in the internal staff newspaper.

This has been a very busy year for all the Trustees as there has been an increase of almost 50% in the number of donations made compared with last year, and we are very grateful for their advice and expertise so willingly given throughout the year. We are looking forward with enthusiasm to the expansion of the Foundation's work in 1997.

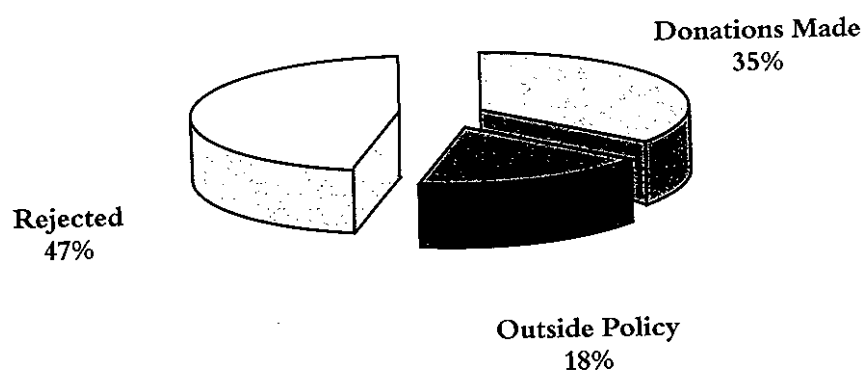

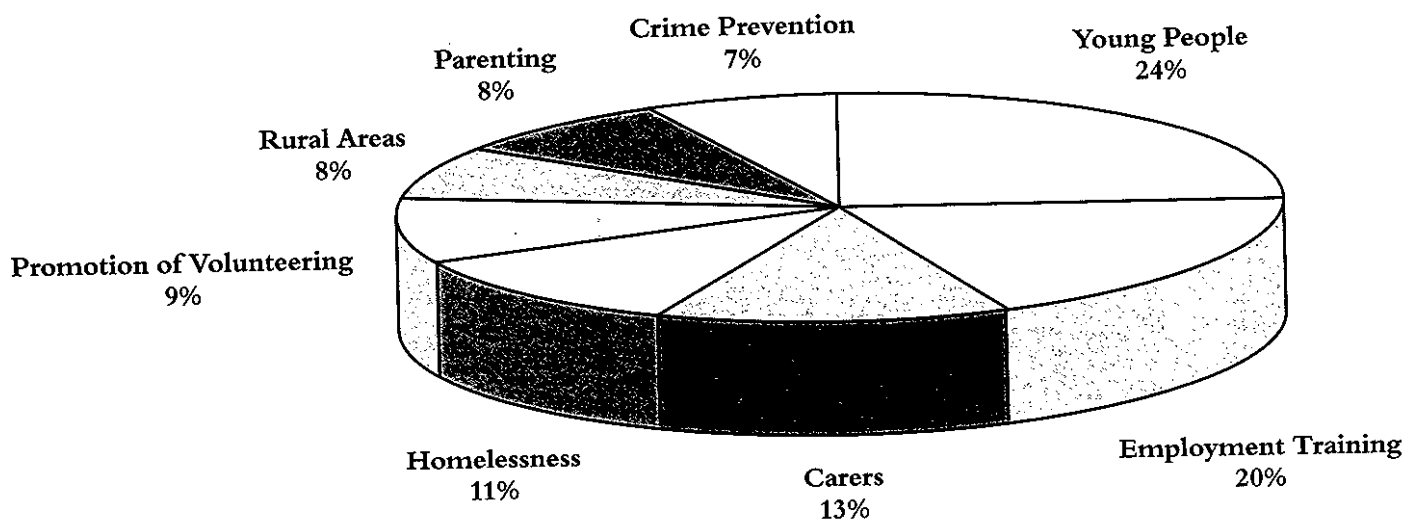

**TRUSTEES' REPORT**

Period ended 31st December 1996

---

The Trustees present their annual report and the audited accounts for the 14-month period ended 31st December 1996. The change of name from TSB Foundation for England and Wales to the Lloyds TSB Foundation for England and Wales took effect after the end of the period under review, on 1st January 1997.

**Incorporation**

The Lloyds TSB Foundation for England and Wales (formerly the TSB Foundation for England and Wales) was incorporated on 13th December 1985 as a company limited by guarantee. It is one of four Foundations created to preserve in a permanent framework the TSB's traditional role of contributing to the life of the community. The other three Foundations cover Scotland, Northern Ireland and the Channel Islands. Each Foundation is separate from the others and from the Lloyds TSB Group (formerly the TSB Group) and is directed by its own independent Board of Trustees.

**Objects**

The Lloyds TSB Foundation for England and Wales is established to do anything which is a charitable purpose according to the laws of England and Wales from time to time principally in, but not limited to, England and Wales and the Isle of Man including in particular:

To advance education and training in all aspects of knowledge by means of (but not limited to) the making of grants, including the establishment of scholarships and prizes, and other like awards.

To advance scientific or medical research, on the condition that all useful results of such scientific or medical research are published, and education in scientific or medical research by means of (but not limited to) the making of grants, including the establishment of scholarships and prizes, and other like awards.

To promote the provision of facilities in the interest of social and community welfare for recreation and leisure time occupation and enjoyment of the arts with the object of improving the conditions of life of people who are disadvantaged by youth, age, infirmity or disablement, poverty or social and economic circumstances.

**Activities**

A review of the development of the Foundation during the financial year and of its position at the end of the year is presented in the Chairman's Statement on pages 2 to 4 and in the Director General's Report on pages 5 to 6. The Statement of Financial Activities on page 12 shows the income received under the Deed of Covenant with Lloyds TSB Group plc (formerly TSB Group plc), together with the expenditure, the overall result for the year and the balance carried forward to next year. The authorised donations amounted to some £5,004,708 (1995: £2,000,849).

**Future Prospects**

The Foundation is expecting to receive further income under the deed of covenant in respect of the year ending 31st December 1997. Following the merger of TSB Group and Lloyds Bank, future income will be based on the pre-tax profits of the Lloyds TSB Group.

**Trustees**

The Trustees who are also directors are as listed on page 1. Their appointments are approved by the Board of Lloyds TSB Group plc.

**Accounting Policies**

There have been no changes in the accounting policies during the period.

**STATEMENT OF TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES**

**Respective responsibilities of Trustees and auditors**

As described on page 9 the Trustees, who are also the directors of the Foundation for the purposes of company law, are responsible for the preparation of financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those financial statements and to report our opinion to you.

**Basis of opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgments made by the Trustees in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Foundation's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

**Opinion**

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Foundation's state of affairs as at 31st December 1996 and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, in the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.



The Foundation is a company limited by guarantee not having a share capital. The liability of the members is limited by the Memorandum of Association to £1 each. The number of Trustees (including the Chairman) who are also members at 31st December 1996 was twelve.

Note 2

**Basis of preparation**

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, including the SORP Accounting by Charities.

Note 3

**Designated funds**

The Trustees created two designated funds at the beginning of the year. The Lloyds Bank Charitable Trust fund was set up with contributions from the four TSB Foundations to cover the budgeted expenditure from Lloyds Bank Charitable Trust for 1996, out of unexpected income received in respect of Lloyds Bank's profits for 1995. The 1997 fund represents the balance of the unexpected income to the England and Wales Foundation which the Trustees decided should be held throughout the year, to be used only after the change of name to the Lloyds TSB Foundation.

Note 4

**Covenant from Lloyds TSB Group plc**

The Foundation derives its revenue from Lloyds TSB Group plc which has entered into a covenant to make annual payments to the England and Wales Foundation of a total amount equal to 0.7212 per cent of one-third of the aggregate pre-tax profits (less pre-tax losses) of the Group for the three years ended on 31st October in the year preceding the year of payment.

Note 5

**Other TSB Foundations**

The accounts incorporate the results of the National Pool to which the four Foundations contribute 10% of their covenanted income. The share of the National Pool at 31st December 1996 attributable to the other Foundations is dealt with as Minority Interests as described in Note 13. In 1996 the England and Wales Foundation contributed £341,128 (1995: £305,067) to the National Pool.

Note 6

**Direct charitable expenditure**

Donations for the year are based upon the new donations agreed by the Trustees during the financial year. Some donations are agreed as multiple payments spread over several years. As each yearly payment becomes due it is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities. The amount of such outstanding multiple commitments as at 31st December 1996 is shown in Note 14.

Donations include amounts agreed from the National Pool totalling £447,129 (1995: £159,456). A full list of donations is attached at Appendix 1.

**Note 7**  
**Investments**

The Foundation holds 56,936,842 limited voting shares of 25p each of Lloyds TSB Group plc, representing 72.12% of such shares in issue, which themselves represent 1.53% of the issued share capital of Lloyds TSB Group plc. The shares have no rights to dividend; have voting rights only in limited circumstances; and may be converted into ordinary shares of Lloyds TSB Group plc under certain circumstances.

The Foundation also holds a Special Rights Redeemable Preference Share of £1 in TSB Bank plc. This share carries the right to appoint two directors to the Board of TSB Bank plc.

These investments have been stated in the accounts at a cost of nil. Lloyds TSB Group plc is registered in Scotland. TSB Bank plc is registered in England and Wales.

**Note 8**  
**Debtors**

Debtors represent amounts due from Lloyds TSB Group plc.

**Note 9**  
**Auditors' remuneration**

The auditors waived their fee for 1995. The fee for 1996 has also been waived.

**Note 10**  
**Trustees' fees**

The Trustees, who are also the directors of the Foundation, received no remuneration during the year.

**Note 11**  
**Transactions with Trustees**

Travel expenses were reimbursed to seven of the Trustees during the year, amounting to £3,908 (1995: £2,848).

**Note 12**  
**Staff**

The average number of persons employed by the Foundation during the year was four (1995: four). Total salary costs amounted to £138,557 (1995: £112,068). Salaries incurred by the Foundation that require further disclosure in accordance with SORP Accounting by Charities are as follows:
