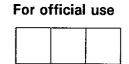

1. Introduction

In accordance with Section 48 of The Insolvency Act 1986 ("IA 1986"), I set out below my report on the receivership of Berkold Refrigeration Limited, DR Cooling Systems Limited and Wessex Marketing Company Limited ("the Companies") (together with Drakes Refrigeration Limited referred to as "the Group") following the appointment of Richard Hill and myself as Joint Administrative Receivers, on 31 July 1996, by Barclays Bank Plc ("the Bank").

2. Statutory information

3. Events leading up to appointment

- 3.1 Following significant losses in 1994 the Group undertook various steps to generate sufficient turnover and reduce costs to return to profitability. Despite an improvement in 1995 the cash effect of earlier losses continued to cause problems.
- 3.2 In September 1995 the directors recognised the need to refinance the business and commenced discussions with a potential investor. These discussions continued into 1996. Despite strong indications of support from the potential investor, an appropriate refinancing arrangement was never completed.
- 3.3 The Group's cash position continued to deteriorate, with turnover in March and April 1996 well below expectations. Payments to the Inland Revenue were deferred in expectation that a substantial cash injection would be forthcoming. When it became clear that Drakes Refrigeration Limited ("Drakes") would be unable to meet its commitments the Inland Revenue issued a winding-up petition against Drakes.
- 3.4 The petition was due to be heard on 31 July 1996. This prompted the Group's bankers to appoint Administrative Receivers on that date to protect its position. A winding-up order was also made against Drakes on 31 July 1996.

4. Action taken since appointment

- 4.1 Due to a dispute over ownership of certain assets of the Group and in view of the winding-up order made against Drakes, trading ceased on 31 July 1996. The business and assets of the Group were advertised and a sale was completed on 23 August 1996.
- 4.2 Litigation in respect of the ownership of trade debtors and certain chattel assets is underway and likely to continue for some time.

5. Debenture holder

5.1 The Bank holds a fixed and floating charge over all the assets, undertaking and property of the Group together with a chattel mortgage over certain items of equipment. At the date of our appointment, the Bank was owed £1.091m by Drakes, supported by cross guarantees given by the other companies forming the Group.

6. Statement of affairs

6.1 Statements of Affairs were requested from the directors on 2 August 1996. These have not yet been received.

7. Preferential creditors

7.1 Preferential creditors in respect of the Companies the subject of this report are estimated as follows:

7.2 There may be sufficient funds to enable a small dividend to be paid to the preferential creditors.

8. Other creditors

The prospect of funds becoming available for the unsecured non-preferential creditors is dependent on the outcome of litigation in respect of the ownership of trade debtors and certain other assets.

9. Section 48 meeting

9.1 Pursuant to Section 48 of The Insolvency Act 1986, a meeting of creditors of the Companies will be held at the offices of KPMG, 1st Floor, Dukes Keep, Marsh Lane, Southampton, SO14 3EX at 10.30 am on 31 October 1996. A formal notice to this effect is attached.
