Strategic Report

Period from 2 March 2021 to 31 December 2021

Principal activities and business review

The directors present their strategic report for Whitespace Software Limited ("the Company") for the period ending 31 December 2021.

The principal activity of the Company in the period under review is to provide digital placing technology to the insurance market.

Principal Risk and uncertainties

The Company continuously monitors the business and markets in which it operates, in order to act accordingly when uncertainties and risk arise. The main financial risks faced by the company and the way these risks are managed are detailed below.

Credit Risk

The Company considers the credit risk associated with its trade accounts receivable to be commercially reasonable and believes that such concentration does not result in the significant risk of near term severe adverse impacts.

Liquidity Risk

The Company monitors cash flow and working capital requirements on a daily basis, therefore, mitigating liquidity risks as much as possible. There is currently no requirement for additional funding facilities and the Company was cash positive at the year end. Through the support of the Verisk group, no additional liquidity risks arise as part of the internal restructuring review.

Foreign Currency Risk

The Company's exposure to credit risk, interest rate risk and cash flow risk is within reasonable limits and these exposures are not hedged. There are no further material risks in which the company believes that external hedging is required or mitigating action is needed at present.

Other risks

The Company continues to monitor risk associated with climate change, the on-going war in Ukraine and resulting energy cost crisis. Management do not believe the Company has any greater exposure to these risks compared to the wider economy.

Performance Monitoring

The Company believes its ability to generate recurring revenues is a key indicator of a successful execution of its business strategy. The company uses year over year revenue growth plus EBITDA margin as metrics to measure its performance.

Future developments

The Company has evaluated subsequent events through to the date these financial statements were approved and has not identified any significant subsequent events that require consideration as an adjustment.

Notes to the Accounts

Period from 2 March 2021 to 31 December 2021

1. General information

The Company is a private company limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is 26th Floor 22 Bishopsgate, Bishopsgate, London, United Kingdom, EC2N 4BQ.

2. Accounting policies

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK ("FRS 102") as issued in August 2014. The amendments to FRS 102 issued in July 2015 and effective immediately have been applied. The presentation currency of these financial statements is Sterling. All amounts in the financial statements have been rounded to the nearest Sterling.

The Company's immediate parent undertaking, Verisk Specialty Business Solutions Limited, includes the Company in its consolidated financial statements. The consolidated financial statements of Verisk Specialty Business Solutions Limited are prepared in accordance with FRS 102. In these financial statements, the company is considered to be a qualifying entity (for the purposes of this FRS) and has applied the exemptions available under FRS 102 in respect of the following disclosures:

- Reconciliation of the number of shares outstanding from the beginning to end of the period;
- Share based payments;
- Cash Flow Statement and related notes; and
- Key Management Personnel compensation.

As the consolidated financial statements of Verisk Specialty Business Solutions Limited include the equivalent disclosures, the Company has also taken the exemptions under FRS 102 available in respect of the following disclosures:

The disclosures required by FRS 102.11 Basic Financial Instruments and FRS 102.12 Other Financial Instrument Issues in respect of financial instruments not falling within the fair value accounting rules of Paragraph 36(4) of Schedule 1.

The accounting policies set out below have, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

The Whitespace Software Limited employee benefit trust

The Company's accounts include the Whitespace Software Limited Employee Benefit Trust ('the EBT'). The directors consider that the company has control of the shares held by the EBT and bears their benefits and risks. Shares held by the EBT are shown as 'Investment in own shares'. The cost of the shares less expected proceeds is amortised on a straight line basis over the period from grant of the earliest outstanding share option awards to their unconditional vesting date. Administration expenses are charged to the profit and loss account as they accrue. Any excess or shortfall of proceeds over cost arising within the EBT on the issue of company's shares to employees who are exercising share options is credited or debited to Other Reserve and in the period they amounted to £nil (1 March 21 - £4,000).

Research and development

Research expenditure is written off in the period in which it is incurred.

Development expenditure incurred is capitalised as an intangible asset only when all of the following criteria are met:

- It is technically feasible to complete the intangible asset so that it will be available for use or sale;
- There is the intention to complete the intangible asset and use or sell it;
- There is the ability to use or sell the intangible asset;
- The use or sale of the intangible asset will generate probable future economic benefits;
- There are adequate technical, financial and other resources available to complete the development and to use or sell the intangible asset; and
- The expenditure attributable to the intangible asset during its development can be measured reliably.

Expenditure that does not meet the above criteria is expensed as incurred.

Revenue recognition

Turnover represents the invoiceable amount of goods sold and services provided, stated net of Value Added Tax and includes the value of work done under long-term contracts. Certain of the Company's maintenance contracts are paid in advance, and the unexpired proportion of the total is included in creditors.

Turnover on long-term contracts is recognised according to the stage reached in the contract by reference to the value of work done. A prudent estimate of the profit attributable to work completed is recognised once the outcome of the contract can be assessed with reasonable certainty.

Income tax

The taxation expense represents the aggregate amount of current and deferred tax recognised in the reporting period. Tax is recognised in profit or loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case, tax is recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, respectively.

Current tax is recognised on taxable profit for the current and past periods. Current tax is measured at the amounts of tax expected to pay or recover using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences at the reporting date. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

2. Accounting policies (continued) Foreign currencies

Foreign currency transactions are initially recorded in the functional currency, by applying the spot exchange rate as at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are

translated at the exchange rate ruling at the reporting date, with any gains or losses being taken to the profit and loss account.

Operating leases

Lease payments are recognised as an expense over the lease term on a straight-line basis. The aggregate benefit of lease incentives is recognised as a reduction to expense over the lease term, on a straight-line basis.

Tangible assets

Tangible assets are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

An increase in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of a revaluation, is recognised in other comprehensive income and accumulated in equity, except to the extent it reverses a revaluation decrease of the same asset previously recognised in profit or loss. A decrease in the carrying amount of an asset as a result of revaluation, is recognised in other comprehensive income to the extent of any previously recognised revaluation increase accumulated in equity in respect of that asset. Where a revaluation decrease exceeds the accumulated revaluation gains accumulated in equity in respect of that asset, the excess shall be recognised in profit or loss.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost or valuation of an asset, less its residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Leasehold Improvements - Over the Life of the lease (monthly basis)

Computer Equipment

- 3 years (straight line basis)

Fixtures, Fittings & Equipment

- 3 - 10 years (straight line basis)

Office Equipment

- 3 - 10 years (straight line basis)

Developed Software - 3 years (straight line basis)

Investments

Fixed asset investments are initially recorded at cost, and subsequently stated at cost less any accumulated impairment losses.

Financial instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the transaction price, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost

Significant Judgements and Estimates

In determining the carrying amounts of certain assets and liabilities, the Company makes assumptions of the effects of uncertain future events on those assets and liabilities at the Company's Statement of Financial Position date. The Company estimates and assumptions are based on historical experience and expectation of future events and are reviewed periodically.

Capitalised Development Costs

Management have reviewed the capitalisation of development costs for the current year, post acquisition of the Company by Verisk Speciality Solutions Ltd. In prior periods the Company did not capitalise development costs as not all capitalisation criteria were met, management are satisfied that all capitalisation criteria have now been met, and it is appropriate to capitalise development costs.

The Finance Bill 2016 enacted provisions to reduce the main rate of UK corporation tax to 17% from 1 April 2020. However, in the March 2020 Budget it was announced that the reduction in the UK rate to 17% will now not occur and the Corporation Tax Rate will be held at 19%. The UK Government has since announced that the UK corporate tax rate will be increased to 25% effective 1st April 2023. As the increase in tax rate has not been enacted all deferred tax balances as at 31 December 2021 continue to be measured at a rate of 19%. There are no current or deferred tax amount disclosed within the accounts in relation to items recognised in other comprehensive income.
