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### **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

The directors present their Annual Report and the audited Financial Statements of Collateralised Mortgage Securities (No 5) PLC ('the Company'), registration no 2042458, for the year ended 30 September 2010

#### **BUSINESS REVIEW AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of The Paragon Group of Companies PLC ('the Group') The Company provided funding for the issue costs incurred by a fellow group company. The principal activity of the Company in the current period was the provision of funds to other group companies.

The Company's profit and loss account is shown on page 5. The profit after tax has fallen from £331,000 to £274,000.

The balance sheet on page 6 of the Financial Statements shows that the Company's financial position at the year end, in cash terms, was consistent with the prior year. Net assets have decreased due to the dividend being paid in the year. Details of amounts owed from other group companies are shown in note 7.

The directors recommend no final dividend (2009 £nil) which, given the interim dividend of 4 64 pence per share (2009 5 64 pence per share), means a total dividend for the year of 4 64 pence per share (2009 5 64 pence per share)

The Group manages its operations on a centralised basis. For this reason, the Company's directors believe that further key performance indicators for the Company are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business. The performance of the Group's mortgage lending operation, which includes the Company, is discussed in the Group's Annual Report, which does not form part of this Report.

#### PRINCIPAL RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Company's primary financial assets and liabilities are with other group companies, therefore the directors do not consider that the Company is exposed to any significant cash flow, credit or liquidity risks

After considering the above, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company will have adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the Financial Statements.

#### **ENVIRONMENT**

The Group recognises the importance of its environmental responsibilities, monitors its impact on the environment, and designs and implements policies to reduce any damage that might be caused by the Group's activities. The Company operates in accordance with Group policies, which are described in the Group's Annual Report, which does not form part of this Report.

#### Cash flow statement

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption granted by Financial Reporting Standard 1 - 'Cash Flow Statements' and does not therefore provide a cash flow statement as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of The Paragon Group of Companies PLC, the accounts of which are publicly available

The Company's primary financial assets and liabilities are with other group companies, therefore the directors do not consider that the Company is exposed to any significant cash flow, credit or liquidity risks

#### 3. INTEREST RECEIVABLE

Interest receivable includes £380,000 (2009 £459,000) in respect of interest received on loans to other group companies

#### 4. DIRECTORS AND EMPLOYEES

The directors of the Company are all employed by Paragon Finance PLC, a fellow group company, and their remuneration is disclosed within the financial statements of that company, which do not form part of this Report.
