Director's report and financial statements

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Director's report

The director has pleasure in submitting the annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1996.

Principal activity

The company continued to act as an intermediate parent undertaking for Healthcall Group PLC's investment in its medical and other domiciliary businesses.

Results for the year

The company has not traded during the year, except for the receipt and payment of dividends.

Dividends

Dividends of £4,000,000 were paid in the year (1995: £4,602,000).

Director

MD Henchey was the only director during the year.

MD Henchey had no interest in the share capital of the company at any time during the year.

MD Henchey is a director of Healthcall Group PLC, the company's ultimate parent undertaking, and accordingly his interest in the shares of group undertakings are disclosed in that company's financial statements.

Statement of director's responsibilities

Company law requires the director to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the director is required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements:
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.
