Impact of the Coronavirus Pandemic on Our Business

An assessment of the impact that the Coronavirus pandemic has had upon our business, the motorcycle industry and the global economy is set out in the Directors' Report within the Reports and Financial Statements of Triumph Motorcycles Limited, the company's subsidiary undertaking, for the year ended 30 June 2020.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. As of 30 June 2020, the company had net assets of £80,000,000 (2019: £30,000,000).

The company is part of the Bloor Investments Limited Group "the Group". The Group has funded its operations through a combination of shareholder's funds, group loans, bank loans, bank overdrafts and other borrowings. The bank loans and bank overdrafts are arranged on a sub-group basis by Bloor Holdings Limited, a wholly owned subsidiary of Bloor Investments Limited.

On 26 September 2018, the Group extended its financing arrangements and the majority of the group's facilities, which are on a secured basis, are now committed for a period to 30 September 2022. These are subject to covenants which are reported on a quarterly basis.

The directors have reviewed the Group's trading and cash forecasts, which take into account possible changes in trading activities, show that the Group will have adequate resources to meet its liabilities in the foreseeable future, and that there is a remote possibility of the Company being called upon to meet its cross-guaranteed obligations.

The company also has a letter of support from its ultimate parent company. Accordingly the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Section 172 Companies Act 2006

In discharging their duty to promote the interests of the Company under Section 172 Companies Act 2006, the Directors of the Company consider a number of factors and stakeholders' interests. Details of how the wider Group deals with customers and other stakeholders, as well as other methods of stakeholders engagement designed to maintain the Group's reputation for high standards of business conduct, is set out in the corporate governance statement (Section 172) within the Directors' Report within the Reports and Financial Statements of Triumph Motorcycles Limited for the year ended 30 June 2020.

Brexit

The United Kingdom left the European Union (EU) on 31 January 2020 with a transition period in place until 31 December 2020. Negotiations will continue during this period to agree the rules to be applied to our future trading and other relationships with EU member states. Until the outcome of these negotiations has been confirmed, the full impact of Brexit for our business remains unclear.

However, we have conducted assessments to consider the range of possible outcomes and the impacts to our operations and have implemented relevant mechanisms where appropriate. We continue to plan for all eventualities and are prepared whatever the outcome.

Notes to the financial statements

for the year ended 30 June 2020

1. General information

Triumph Motorcycles Group Limited is a private company limited by shares incorporated in England. The registered office is Ashby Road, Measham, Swadlincote, Derbyshire, DE12 7JP.

2. Statement of compliance

The individual financial statements of Triumph Motorcycles Group Limited have been prepared in compliance with United Kingdom Accounting Standard, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland ("FRS 102")" and the Companies Act 2006.

3. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with UK applicable accounting standards.

The company has not traded during the year, has received no income and has incurred no expenditure and consequently has made neither a profit nor a loss (2019: £nil). Therefore no statement of comprehensive income has been presented in these financial statements.

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with FRS 102 requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise its judgement in the process of applying the company's accounting policies. The areas involving a higher degree of judgement or complexity, or areas where assumptions and estimates are significant to the financial statements are disclosed in note 4.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. As of 30 June 2020, the company had net assets of £80,000,000 (2019: £30,000,000).

It is included in the consolidated financial statements of Bloor Investments Limited which are publically available. Therefore the company is exempt by virtue of section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements.

These financial statements are the company's separate financial statements.

Investments

Investments in subsidiary undertakings are stated at cost unless there is evidence of impairment in value of the investments in which case the investment is reduced to the higher of its net realisable value or current value in use. An impairment provision is made in the profit and loss account when the directors consider it appropriate, in accordance with FRS 102, paragraph 14.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax arises from timing differences that are differences between taxable profits and total comprehensive income as stated in the financial statements. These timing differences arise from the inclusion of income and expenses in tax assessments in periods different from those in which they are recognised in financial statements.

Deferred tax is recognised on all timing differences at the reporting date except for certain exceptions. Unrelieved tax losses and other deferred tax assets are only recognised when it is probable that they will be recovered against the reversal of deferred tax liabilities or other future taxable profits.

Deferred tax is measured using tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the period end and that are expected to apply to the reversal of the timing difference.

4. Critical accounting judgements and estimation uncertainty

The company makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates will, by definition, seldom equal the related actual results. The estimates and assumptions that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year are addressed below.

(i) Investments

The accounting treatment, and judgements made therein, of investments in subsidiary undertakings has been considered above in the accounting policies (note 3).

5. Auditors' remuneration

Auditors' remuneration of £12,800 (2019: £11,301) is borne by another Triumph group company.

The company has guaranteed the bank overdrafts and bank loans made to certain other group companies within the Bloor Group, which at 30 June 2020 amounted to £161,738,000 (2019: £35,579,000). The directors do not believe these guarantees will be called due to the continuing profitability of the group

11. Related party transactions

As a wholly owned subsidiary of Bloor Investments Limited, the company has taken advantage of the exemption under FRS 102, para 33.1A not to provide information on related party transactions with other 100% owned undertakings within the Bloor Investments Limited group. Note 12 gives details of how to obtain a copy of the published financial statements of Bloor Investments Limited.

12. Ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party

The immediate parent undertaking is Bloor Holdings Limited. The smallest group of which the company is a member and for which group financial statements are prepared is Bloor Holdings Limited. The largest group of which the company is a member and for which group financial statements are prepared is Bloor Investments Limited, this is also considered to be the ultimate parent undertaking. All these companies are registered in England and Wales. The ultimate controlling party is Mr J S Bloor.

13. Subsequent events

On 29 July 2020, the company issued 50,000,000 £1 ordinary shares to its immediate parent undertaking, Bloor Holdings Limited in respect of the capital contribution received. Additionally, the company's subsidiary undertaking, Triumph Motorcycles Limited, issued 50,000,000 £1 ordinary shares to the company in respect of the capital contribution made.
