INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF CITIFRIENDS NOMINEE LIMITED

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Citifriends Nominee Limited ("the Company") for the year ended 31 December 2018 which comprise the income statement, balance sheet and related notes, including the principal accounting policies in Note 1.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs as at 31 December 2018 and of its result for the year then ended;
- have been properly prepared in accordance with UK accounting standards, including FRS 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework; and
- have been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 2006.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK) ("ISAs (UK)") and applicable law. Our responsibilities are described below. We have fulfilled our ethical responsibilities under, and are independent of the Company in accordance with, UK ethical requirements including the FRC Ethical Standard. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is a sufficient and appropriate basis for our opinion.

Going concern

The Directors have prepared the financial statements on the going concern basis as they do not intend to liquidate the Company or to cease its operations, and as they have concluded that the Company's financial position means that this is realistic. They have also concluded that there are no material uncertainties that could have cast significant doubt over its ability to continue as a going concern for at least a year from the date of approval of the financial statements ("the going concern period").

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Accounting policies

a) Basis of presentation

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework ("FRS 101"). In preparing these financial statements, the Company applies the recognition, measurement and disclosure requirements of International Financial Reporting Standards as adopted by the EU ("Adopted IFRSs"), but makes amendments where necessary in order to comply with Companies Act 2006 and has set out below where advantage of the FRS 101 disclosure exemptions has been taken.

The Company has taken exemption available under FRS 101 not to disclose all transactions with other group companies and investees of the group qualifying as related parties. It has also taken the exemption available under FRS 101 not to prepare a cash flow statement, the effects of new but not yet effective IFRSs and capital management disclosures.

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The functional and financial statements presentation currency of the Company is Pound Sterling ("£") and all values are rounded to the nearest pound, except where otherwise indicated.

The Directors have satisfied themselves that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operation for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

The Company's results are consolidated in the financial statements of its ultimate parent company, Citigroup Inc., which are made available to the public annually.

The accounting policy set out below has, unless otherwise stated, been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements.

b) Changes in accounting policy and disclosures

Standards issued and effective

There are a number of accounting standards that have been issued by the International Accounting Standards Board ("IASB"), which became effective during 2018. They include:

- IFRS 9 Financial Instruments. The IASB completed the final element of its comprehensive response to the financial crisis with the publication of IFRS 9 in July 2014. The improved standard includes a logical model for classification and measurement, a single forward-looking 'expected loss' impairment model and a substantially-reformed approach to hedge accounting. The standard replaces the existing guidance in IAS 39 Financial Instruments: Recognition and Measurement and carries forward the guidance on recognition and derecognition of financial instruments from IAS 39. IFRS 9 is effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2018, with early adoption permitted. The standard has no material impact on the financial statements.
- IFRS 15 Revenue from Contracts with Customers. In May 2014, the International Accounting Standards Board (IASB) issued IFRS 15. The core principle of the new Standard is to recognize revenue to depict the transfer of goods or services to customers in amounts that reflect the consideration to which the Company expects to be entitled in exchange for those goods or services. The revenue is recognized when the control over the goods or services is transferred to the customer. IFRS 15 is effective for annual reporting periods beginning on or after 1 January 2018. IFRS 15 has no material impact on the financial statements.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1.1 Debtors

Debtors are recognised initially at fair value subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method and subject to expected credit loss impairment under IFRS 9 as described above.

2. Directors' remuneration

None of the Directors received any emoluments during the year in respect of their services to the Company (2017: £nil).

3. Auditor's remuneration

The auditor's remuneration of £1,883 (2017: £1,470) for these financial statements is borne and paid by Citibank Investments Limited.

Contingent Assets, as applied under FRS 101, all known actual or possible litigation and claims whose effects should be considered when preparing the financial statements.

10. The Board has disclosed to you the identity of the Company's related parties and all the related party relationships and transactions of which it is aware which are set out in Appendix B. All related party relationships and transactions have been appropriately accounted for and disclosed in accordance with IAS 24 Related Party Disclosures, as applied under FRS 101. The Board confirms that the Company has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS 101 paragraph 8 (k) and has therefore not included the exempted information in the financial statements.

Included in the Appendix A to this letter are the definitions of both a related party and a related party transaction as we understand them and as defined in IAS 24.

11. The Board confirms that:

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- a) The financial statements disclose all of the key risk factors, assumptions made and uncertainties surrounding the Company's ability to continue as a going concern as required to provide a true and fair view.
- b) No events or circumstances have been identified that may cast significant doubt on the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern.

Appendix A:to the Board Representation Citifriends Nominee Limited: Definitions

Criteria for applying FRS 101

Material Matters

Certain representations in this letter are described as being limited to matters that are material.

IAS 1.7 and IAS 8.5 state that:

"Material omissions or misstatements of items are material if they could, individually or collectively, influence the economic decisions that users make on the basis of the financial statements. Materiality depends on the size and nature of the omission or misstatement judged in the surrounding circumstances. The size or nature of the item, or a combination of both, could be the determining factor."

Fraud

Fraudulent financial reporting involves intentional misstatements including omissions of amounts or disclosures in financial statements to deceive financial statement users.

Misappropriation of assets involves the theft of an entity's assets. It is often accompanied by false or misleading records or documents in order to conceal the fact that the assets are missing or have been pledged without proper authorisation.
