REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT (DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES)

YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2004

The Council of Management presents its annual report and the accounts for the year to 31st March 2004.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part VII of the Companies Act 1985 relating to small companies. The members of Council have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in October 2000.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY

The principal activity of the Company in the year under review was the informal education of young people aged 8 to 16 years who are experiencing social exclusion and/or disadvantage.

INVESTMENT POWERS

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the charity has the power to make any investment which the Trustees see fit.

REVIEW OF THE ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS OF THE CHARITY-CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2003/04

I am delighted to present the Eastern Ravens Trust annual report for the year ending 31 March 2004. This has been an interesting and eventful year for all who work with children and young people following the publication of Every Child Matters and plans to introduce The Children's Bill.

Staff and young people accessing our projects have been involved in some of the local consultation events that have taken place in the borough and there will be opportunities over the next few years for Eastern Ravens to be involved in the shaping of exciting new services which bring all agencies closer together to support the development of local children and young people.

Looking at the reports contained within the annual report, I believe that Eastern Ravens can demonstrate that it is a successful provider of community based services for hard to reach children and young people and is developing some excellent working partnerships with key mainstream services in the borough. This is a sound base to move forward into the future.

The Young Carers Project was developed at the request of young carers and their parents and was extended in 2003-04 to include more young carers at the request of Stockton Children's Fund. The respite and support services it provides add value to the statutory provision in the borough and it is pleasing to see from the comments of young people and their parents that the project is highly valued by its service users. This was also recognised in the Stockton Social Service Inspection Report.

In the forthcoming year, the board will be commissioning more detailed research on the views of young carers and their parents and the impact of the project on service users. This will inform the future direction of the project and we hope that the findings will also be incorporated into a new borough wide strategy on young carers.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT (DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES)

REVIEW OF THE ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS OF THE CHARITY-CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2003/04 (continued)

The Trust values the opportunity to work in partnership with all of the key agencies involved in working with children and young people and this year we welcomed Jane Bradley from Stockton Youth Offending Service onto the board of directors. This reflects the strong partnership that has developed between Eastern and the YOS since 2001 to support the development of the Youth Inclusion Project. This multi-agency project is providing an excellent example of how services can work more effectively together to maximise the support available to young people. The delivery of the project is managed by Eastern Ravens and the project is performing well in national evaluations. As a result the Youth Justice Board have confirmed that funding is secure until 2008. We are therefore in an excellent position to draw in match funding to replace the SRB funding which is due to be replaced at the end of the next financial year.

We welcomed a number of new staff, volunteers and directors to the organisation this year. Eastern Ravens is growing and building a reputation for delivering good quality services in the local community. The organisation's existing base is too small to accommodate the size of the team or the range of activities and services we are providing and the board have arranged to relocate the admin base into the Richard Hind Centre year in May until our permanent new premises are ready in the Newtown Resource Centre.

It is clear from the project reports and their photo galleries that the Eastern Ravens staff and volunteers have worked extremely hard to make this year successful and fun. This requires skill, commitment and good teamwork and I would like to congratulate the manager staff and all of the young people involved in the projects for making this year a success.

RESERVES POLICY AND RISK MANAGEMENT

As a result of a business plan developed by the trustees in 2001, The Young Carers and Youth Inclusion Projects started in 2001/02 and they continued in the current year.

The trustees monitor progress against budget and objectives and review their strategic objectives at their regular meetings. They also review the risks faced by the charity and implement strategies to mitigate those risks. This included the computerisation of the accounting records to ensure that management reports can be produced on a timely basis.

The trustees aim to expend all funds on their charitable objects, but recognise the need to maintain a certain level of reserves as a cushion against possible future funding difficulties. Free reserves (i.e. those reserves not tied up in fixed assets, designated or restricted funds) of £50,000 would allow the charity to continue its operations for around 4 months; while alternative funding sources were sought.

At 31st March 2004, free reserves amounted to £ 63,374.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT (DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES) YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2004

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES IN RELATION TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the financial year and of its surplus or deficit for the financial year. In doing so the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002), the Companies Act 1985 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice issued in October 2000.
- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.
- c) Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.
- d) Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered and are allocated to the particular activity to which they relate.
- e) Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life at the following rates

Office and garages 10% reducing balance All other assets 25% reducing balance

- f) Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purposes and are available as general funds.
- g) Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the management committee for particular purposes.
- h) Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund, with a fair allocation of management and support costs.
