REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT (DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES)

YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2005

The Council of Management presents its annual report and the accounts for the year to 31st March 2005.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part VII of the Companies Act 1985 relating to small companies. The members of Council have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" issued in October 2000.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY

The principal activity of the Company in the year under review was the informal education of young people aged 8 to 16 years who are experiencing social exclusion and/or disadvantage.

INVESTMENT POWERS

Under the Memorandum and Articles of Association, the charity has the power to make any investment which the Trustees see fit.

REVIEW OF THE ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS OF THE CHARITY-CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2004/05

This has been a busy, eventful and successful period for all at Eastern Ravens. There have been important changes such as the relocation into our new base within the Newtown Community Resource Centre. This has enabled the organisation to provide the only dedicated space for young carers to meet in Stockton. It has also provided an opportunity for us to begin to deliver some highly successful events, which aim to bring different groups of children and young people together with others in the local community in addition to our regular services. We now have excellent facilities to support the future of the Trust and the development of its community based services for children and young people.

Our first visitors were young people from Stockton International Family Centre who joined young people from the Young Carers and Youth Inclusion projects at Eastern Ravens for 2 days of Murder Mystery Activities and a series of Arts Workshops. We also celebrated International Women's Day on 8 March by hosting our first intergenerational event in the new premises. This was a huge success, attended by over 150 local women and girls of all ages and from all parts of the community and involved a wide range of partner organisations and local residents groups.

We have also continued to develop and deliver the Youth Inclusion and Young Carers Projects. More recently, in January we expanded our project services to include a new information advice and guidance service that is delivered as part of the Connexions Tees Valley wide partnership initiative to support young people in Newtown who are not in education, training or employment.

REVIEW OF THE ACTIVITIES AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS OF THE CHARITY-CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT 2004/05 (continued)

Two external evaluations of the Youth Inclusion Project have shown that Eastern Ravens has provided good quality services for young people and identified that the project has major strengths in the majority of areas. They also highlighted the project as an example of national good practice in relation identifying the young people who are most at risk of crime and school exclusion in the community. This resulted in an invitation for the Trust manager to speak at the National YIP conference held in London at the end of March.

Similarly independent evaluation of the Young Carers Project carried out by the University of Teesside has shown that the project provides an escape route and is regarded as a "lifeline" for children and families with high levels of user satisfaction from both parents and children. It also clearly shows that the project is making a positive difference to the lives of young carers and their families living in Stockton.

After a very successful year the organisation is well placed to move forward successfully into the new financial year and I would like to thank all of the staff, volunteers and young people who have made this possible.

RESERVES POLICY AND RISK MANAGEMENT

As a result of a business plan developed by the trustees in 2001, The Young Carers and Youth Inclusion Projects started in 2001/02 and they continued in the current year.

The trustees monitor progress against budget and objectives and review their strategic objectives at their regular meetings. They also review the risks faced by the charity and implement strategies to mitigate those risks. This included the computerisation of the accounting records to ensure that management reports can be produced on a timely basis.

The trustees aim to expend all funds on their charitable objects, but recognise the need to maintain a certain level of reserves as a cushion against possible future funding difficulties. Free reserves (i.e. those reserves not tied up in fixed assets, designated or restricted funds) of £50,000 would allow the charity to continue its operations for around 4 months, while alternative funding sources were sought.

At 31st March 2005, free reserves amounted to £ 42546.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL OF MANAGEMENT (DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES) YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2005

TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES IN RELATION TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the financial year and of its surplus or deficit for the financial year. In doing so the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

The trustees are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

EASTERN RAVENS TRUST NOTES FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2005

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

- a) The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002), the Companies Act 1985 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice issued in October 2000.
- b) Voluntary income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.
- c) Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are receivable.
- d) Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred. Resources expended include attributable VAT which cannot be recovered and are allocated to the particular activity to which they relate.
- e) Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life at the following rates

Office and garages 10% reducing balance All other assets 25% reducing balance

- f) Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purposes and are available as general funds.
- g) Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the management committee for particular purposes.
- h) Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. Expenditure which meets these criteria is charged to the fund, with a fair allocation of management and support costs.
