DIRECTORS' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 1996

The Directors present their annual report on the affairs of News International Associated Services Limited ("the Company") together with the accounts and auditors' report for the year ended 30 June 1996.

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the Directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and its profit or loss for that period. In preparing those accounts, the Directors are required to:

- * select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- * state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts; and
- * prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose, with reasonable accuracy, at any time the financial position of the Company and enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND BUSINESS REVIEW:

The Company acts as an agent for companies in the News International plc group. The external revenue earned (net of commission) and all costs are transferred to the relevant group companies.

The Company generated turnover for the year of £55,000 (1995 - £50,000) resulting in a profit on ordinary activities after tax of £36,000 (1995 - £50,000). The Directors expect the present activity to continue for the foreseeable future.

We have audited the accounts on pages 4 to 9 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and the accounting policies set out on page 4.

Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors

As described on page 1, the Company's Directors are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those accounts and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Directors in the preparation of the accounts and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the circumstances of the Company, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the accounts are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the accounts.

Opinion

In our opinion the accounts give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company as at 30 June 1996 and of its profit for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING:

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The Company's accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

In accordance with the provisions of Financial Reporting Statement No.1 (revised) ("FRS1"), a cash flow statement has not been prepared since the Company is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of a body corporate (Note 9). A consolidated cash flow statement is included in the accounts of The News Corporation Limited ("TNCL"), the ultimate parent company, which meets all other conditions of FRS1.

TURNOVER:

Turnover is the net management charge receivable by the Company in the ordinary course of its business, excluding value added tax.

TAXATION:

Corporation tax is provided on taxable profits after group relief at current rates. It is the policy of News International plc group companies not to make payments to fellow subsidiary undertakings for group relief surrendered.

Provision is made using the liability method for the taxation effects arising from all timing differences (other than those which are expected by the Directors to continue within the foreseeable future) at the rates expected to be in force at the time of reversal.
