Directors' report for the year ended 31 March 2009

The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2009

Principal activities and review of business

The principal activity of the Company is unchanged from last year and is the operation in the Oxfordshire area of the independent radio licence for Fox FM, which was rebranded Heart 102.6 and 97.4 during the year.

Turnover for the year ended 31 March 2009 amounted to £2,878,000 (2008: £3,386,000) and the Company made a profit for the year before tax of £558,000 (2008: £1,086,000).

The decline in turnover of 15% year on year is due to a weak advertising market.

The business uses key performance indicators which are monitored on a regular basis which include audience trends such as listening hours, share of the market and demographic mix, as well as financial indicators such as revenue. Variance analysis is performed monthly and variances are monitored and discussed within a formal meeting structure.

The key risk to the business is that continued advertising slowdown may put pressure on traditional revenues.

The risks are monitored and managed through parent and local management. The group has an internal risk management function which identifies major business risks and puts policies and procedures in place to manage those risks.

During the year, the company incurred a recharge of redundancy costs from Global Radio Services Limited which amounted to £200,753.

Results and dividends

The profit for the year, after taxation, amounted to £395,000 (2008: £754,000).

The directors do not recommend the payment a dividend (2008: £nil).

Policy and practice on payment of creditors

The Company does not follow a code but operates a payment policy to agreed terms in settling outstanding debts. For certain types of regular contracted services direct debit or standing order arrangements are encouraged. Most other supplies are on an ad hoc basis and the terms of payment are agreed when the order is placed. The majority of payments are made by electronic transfer directly to suppliers' bank accounts. All of the payments are undertaken on the Company's behalf by Global Radio Services Limited under an agency agreement.

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2009

1. Accounting policies

1.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items, which are considered material in relation to the financial statements.

1.2 Cash flow

The Company, being a subsidiary undertaking where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group whose consolidated financial statements are publicly available, is exempt from the requirement to draw up a cash flow statement in accordance with FRS1.

1.3 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at their purchase price less accumulated depreciation.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives on the following bases:

Office & studio equipment - 10%- 20% per annum Fixtures, fittings and technical equipment - 20%-33% per annum

1.4 Operating leases

Rentals under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight-line basis over the lease term.

1.5 Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19.

1.6 Pensions

The Company participates in the GCap Media Personal Pension Plan. These are defined contribution arrangements to which the Company makes age-related contributions. The amount charged to the profit and loss account represents the contributions payable to the scheme in respect of the accounting year and amounted to £4,505 (2008: £6,870). There were no outstanding or prepaid contributions at year end (2008 £nil).

1.7 Dividends on shares presented within shareholders' funds

Dividends unpaid at the balance sheet date are only recognised as a liability at that date to the extent that they are appropriately authorised and are no longer at the discretion of the company. Unpaid dividends that do not meet these criteria are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

2. Agency agreement

Global Radio Services Limited provided personnel and other services to the Company. The amounts included in 'operating charges' contain a charge for these services. For the year ended 31 March 2009, this charge was £608,146 (2008: £709,000).

3. Staff costs

The Company does not directly employ any staff (2008: nil).

5. Turnover

Turnover represents amounts invoiced in respect of all services and goods provided during the year, excluding value-added tax. Radio airtime revenue is recognised on the date of broadcast and this is considered to be the only material class of business for the Company in the United Kingdom.
