Strategic report for the year ended 31 December 2019

The Company is a member of the WPP plc Group (the 'Group'). The Company's principal activity is to act as an intercompany financing company.

Future developments

Review of business

The Company made a loss for the year ended 31 December 2019 of £340,567 which will be transferred from reserves (2018: a loss of £307,000 which will be transferred from reserves).

The Directors are of the opinion that the current level of activity and performance is sustainable due to continued support from WPP. Further details are provided in the 'Going concern and liquidity risk' section.

Dividends

In the current or prior year no dividend was proposed to the holders of any shareholding of the Company.

COVID-19

The coronavirus pandemic is adversely affecting and is expected to continue to adversely affect the Group's business, revenues, results of operations, financial condition and prospects.

Due to the non-trading activities of the Company, the Directors do not expect a significant impact on the results of operations or financial condition of the Company in the short term.

Going concern and liquidity risk

The Directors believe that preparing the financial statements on the going concern basis is appropriate.

The Directors have assessed the potential impact that the global outbreak of Covid-19 has had on the liquidity, performance and financial position of the Company for at least the next 12 months from the date at which the financial statements have been signed.

As the Company is not trading with a limited number of transactions, there is no expected impact to the financial position of the Company as a result of Covid-19.

The Company is a subsidiary of WPP plc and is therefore subject to the overall WPP plc financing arrangements. For this reason, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

After making enquiries, the Directors believe that there are reasonable expectations that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational adistence with low liquidity risk for at least the next 12 months from the date or signing the financial pratements.

1 Presentation of the financial statements

Congrat information

The Company is a private Company, limited by shares and is incorporated in the United Kingdom under the Companies Act 2006. The Company is registered in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is Sea Containers House, 18 Upper Ground, London, SE1 9GL United Kingdom.

The Company's principal and business activities, future development and a review of its performance and position are set out in the Strategic report on Pages 1 and 2.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied, unless otherwise stated.

2.01 Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 100 Application of Financial Reporting Requirements ("FRS 100") and Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework ("FRS 101").

These financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

2.02 Consolidation

The Company is a wholly owned subsidiary of the ultimate parent Company and as such has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing group financial statements under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006. It has also met all of the exemption conditions under section 400 of the Companies Act 2006. WPP plc, a Company incorporated in Jersey, is the Company's ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party. The largest group of undertakings for which group financial statements are prepared and which include the results of the Company are the consolidated financial statements of WPP plc. The registered address of WPP plc is 13 Castles Street St. Helier Jersey JE1 1ES. Copies of the consolidated financial statements can be obtained from www.wppinvestor.com. The smallest group of undertakings for which group financial statements are prepared and which include the results of the Company are the consolidated financial statements of WPP Jubilee Limited, registered in the England and Wales. The registered address of WPP Jubilee Limited is Sea Containers House, 18 Upper Ground, London, SE1 9GL, United Kingdom. The immediate parent undertaking is Cordiant Communications Group Limited. These financial statements are separate financial statements.

2.03 Foreign currency translation

Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statement of the Company are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates (the 'functional currency'). The functional and presentation currency of the Company is Pounds Sterling (£).

2.04 Finance income and expense

Finance income and expenses are recognised on an accruals basis using the effective interest method.

2.05 Taxation

The tax expense for the period comprises current tax. Tax is recognised in the income statement, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in shareholders' funds. In this case, the tax is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in shareholders; funds respectively.

The current tax charge is calculated on the basis of the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date in the countries where the Company operates and generates taxable income. Management periodically evaluates positions taken in tax returns with respect to situations in which applicable tax regulation is subject to interpretation. It establishes provisions, where appropriate, on the basis of amounts expected to be paid to the tax authorities.

2.06 Trade and other payables

Trade payables are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers.

Trade and other payables are initially recognised at fair value and then held at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Long-term payables are discounted where the effect is material.

2.07 Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Incremental costs directly attributable to the issue of new ordinary shares or options are shown in equity as a deduction, net of tax, from proceeds.

The Company has no employees (2018; nil).
