REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS for the year ended 31st August 2005

Principal Activity

The principal activity of the company remains the advancement of the Christian Religion by the provision of leadership training, support and supervision and facilities for those involved with Christian Youth Works. The company is registered with the Charity Commissioners under registration number 299754.

Results for the Year and Reserves Policy

Despite a reduction in overall income, (2005: £224,025, 2004: £257,678) the directors' aim for a break-even position for the year was achieved with overall expenditure being kept to a level similar to the previous year (2005: £223,569, 2004: £220,501). With grants and donations in respect of Restricted Funds of £58,026 (2004: £60,889) again enabling a substantial proportion of the salaries of the staff working on specific projects to be met direct from Restricted Funds, there was a General Fund surplus of £7,174, providing a General Fund balance to carry forward of £46,897. In view of the expectations that part of the increased budget expenditure for the coming year will continue to be met from Restricted Fund grants and donations, the directors consider that the appropriate level of unrestricted reserves remains around £50,000.

Directors

The above named served as directors during the year as indicated above. The directors of the company are also the trustees of the charitable activities of Oxford Youth Works.

Directors' Responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- follow applicable accounting standards, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts;
- prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF OXFORD YOUTH WORKS

We have audited the financial statements on pages 4 to 9 of Oxford Youth Works for the year ended 31st August 2005 which comprise the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet, and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002), under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 6.

This report is made solely to the company's members, as a body, in accordance with Section 235 of the Companies Act 1985. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the company's members those matters we are required to state to them in an auditor's report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the company and the company's members as a body, for our audit work, for this report, or for the opinions we have formed.

The directors (who also act as trustees of the charitable activities of Oxford Youth Works) are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards. Their responsibilities are set out in the Statement of Directors' Responsibilities.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Directors' Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding trustees' remuneration and transactions with the company is not disclosed.

In forming our opinion, we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the charitable company's state of affairs as at 31st August 2005 and of its incoming resources and application of resources (including its income and expenditure) for the year then ended, and have been properly prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act 1985.

1. Charitable Status

2. Accounting Policies

12. Joint project with Church Mission Society

The individual gift totaling £126,858 received over the past three years by the Church Mission Society to assist with the funding of a youth worker and his family, jointly supported by Oxford Youth Works and CMS, has enabled the purchase of a house at a cost of £86,328, wherein Oxford Youth Works has a one half interest. Of the closing overall fund balance of £79,297 the trustees anticipate future property expenditure of around £14,000 leaving £22,133 towards ongoing salary and other costs of the youth project.

13. Council Members' Remuneration and Reimbursed Expenses

No fees or remuneration were paid to any member of the Council during the period (2004 - £nil). Expenses of £95 (2004 - £46) were reimbursed to a member of the council.
