### **Governing Document**

The company is registered under The Companies Act 2006 as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital, registration number 2274964. It was incorporated on 7 July 1988. As a charity it is registered with the Charity Commission number 299754 and was registered on 21 July 1988. The governing instrument of the company is the Memorandum and Articles of Association.

The principal activity of the organisation remains the advancement of the Christian Religion by providing youth workers and projects where young people receive instruction, care and counselling, by training leaders in Christian youth work theory and practice, and providing support and supervision for those involved in Christian youth work

# Recruitment and Appointment of the Council of Management

Members of the Council of Management (trustees) are elected by the membership of the organisation at the Annual General Meeting, normally for a period of three years. Members who have served for three years may offer themselves for re-election. In between AGMs, additional members may be co-opted but must be put forward for election at the following AGM.

#### **Trustee Induction and Training**

Potential trustees normally meet with the Chairman of the Council before they are put forward for election, when the duties and responsibilities are discussed, and they are invited to attend at least one Council meeting before making a decision about becoming a trustee

#### Risk Management

The trustees have identified the major risks which may affect the charity and have taken steps to mitigate those risks. A comprehensive risk assessment was completed by September 2010 and discussed at the following meeting of the Council of Management. This assessment will be kept under annual review.

#### Management and Staffing

The day-to-day management of the organisation lies with the executive Director of the organisation and with the Director of the Oxford Centre for Youth Ministry Policy and strategy are decided by the Council of Management, normally after discussion involving the Director and appropriate staff, and the implementation is regularly monitored

Approval for recruitment of staff is given by the Council of Management, or by the Chair acting on its behalf

# **Objectives**

OYW is an ecumenical Christian charity. We are an open and inclusive worshipping community of Christians from a variety of traditions, and we are committed to service among young people. We seek justice and righteousness at personal and community levels and within our organisation.

We seek to offer unconditional care, support and hope to young people in Oxford, encouraging their personal and spiritual growth and maturity through the practice of Christian Relational Care with appropriately trained Christian youth workers, We are committed to training and equipping Christian Youth Workers as the lead organisation for the Oxford Centre for Youth Ministry This latter work is an integral part of Oxford Youth Works and works in close conjunction with the national Centre for Youth Ministry

#### **Activities**

In planning the activities for the year, the Trustees have considered the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit and in particular, the specific guidance on charities for the advancement of religion

- 1. Youth Work We work with young people in the Oxford community to offer unconditional friendship, support, opportunities and the Christian gospel
- 2. Training through Oxford CYM (a regional delivery centre for Centre for Youth Ministry a company limited by guarantee [no 3988613] and a registered charity [No 1081144]), we offer practical theology courses in children and family work, schools work, and youth and community work from volunteer level to masters, with professionally (JNC) qualifying degree courses as the main activity

#### **Achievements and Performance**

- Mentoring scheme in The Oxford Academy in conjunction with the Behavioural Support Base proving to be very productive
- Extended contact with groups in schools growing in momentum and attendance
- Summer and Half-term trips providing more opportunity to develop positive and deeper relationships
- Discipleship group well attended and growing
- New partnership with "Shout" to develop a Young Carers support network
- 17 Oxford CYM students graduating, including 11 2 1s and 3 firsts first cohort of University of Gloucestershire graduates
- MA first cohort of University of Gloucestershire 7 graduates including 2 distinctions and 2 merits, and 11 Oxford Brookes graduates with 4 merits
- Oxford CYM took on MA Courses academic leadership and administration for CYM nationally
- Successful re-validation and professional accreditation (JNC) of MA Youth & Community Work and Practical Theology
- Successful validation of new suite of MAs in Professional Practice and Practical Theology to offer CPD in chaplaincy work, well-being and spirituality, leadership and mission
- Appointed new Work-based Learning Tutor to support students and placements
- Launched book on boys' spirituality by Carolyn Edwards (Oxford CYM Senior Tutor)
- 2 Day Conferences successfully delivered and contributed to Youthwork The Conference, Children's Ministry Conference, Faith in Research Conference, Oxford Diocese 'Mend the Gap' Conference, and sacred Spaces in Public Places
- Supported CMS Pioneer Missional Leadership Training

 Identified Oxford CYM mission and strategy for next five years, in consultation with Methodist Church, CMS and Oxford Diocese

#### **Plans for Future Periods**

- To continue to engage and strengthen strong working relationships with 4 secondary schools in Oxford
- To work closely with churches in these schools' catchment areas to develop church participation through volunteers
- To continue and develop relationship with Shout
- To continue to develop strategic fundraising capacity
- To develop partnerships with churches and other Christian organisations to provide Prayer Spaces in Schools
- Develop continuing professional development programme
- Promote Oxford CYM through events and networks
- Develop training and resources for church-based volunteers
- Develop alumni community
- Develop research and partnership work to support longevity in ministry for youth and children's workers
- Identify new streams of funding
- Consider response to changing arena of Higher Education and funding

#### **Financial Review**

Income for the year of £295,166 showed a 4% increase on the preceding year (£283,310) mainly due to increased donations from Trusts and individuals. Total expenditure was carefully controlled and decreased to £310,943. As a result of these controls, the financial statements show a reduced general fund loss for the year of £24,264.

At the accounting date, £101,177 was held in total funds of which £32,016 was restricted

# **Principal Funding Sources**

Higher education funding provides for the training of youth workers and is the largest source of income. The other main sources of income funding the youth work are trusts, individual donors and churches

#### **Investment Policy**

In the light of the Trustees' concern over the current budget position, and as the majority of the charity's funds will be spent in the short term, in order to achieve the charitable objectives set out by the Trustees, longer term investment is not considered appropriate. The Trustees' policy of investment is therefore to retain funds as cash and place them on bank deposit at the best rates available, without incurring undue risk.

#### Reserves Policy

The Trustees have examined the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the expected operating costs and the main risks to the organization. Although there are budgeted costs for 2011/12 of £325,000, approximately 60% of these are covered by committed income, leaving uncovered annual expenditure of around £130,000. Unrestricted Reserves at 31 August 2011 of £68,111 represent around 6 months uncovered costs. The Trustees believe

this to be sufficient cover for the next two financial years. A deficit of around £12,000 is budgeted for 2012, so the level of funds retained gives the organisation sufficient time to increase its level of income in the future. Ongoing steps are currently under discussion to reduce the organisation's annual costs.

#### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 August 2011

#### 1 Charitable Status

Oxford Youth Works is a company limited by guarantee. It has no share capital and is a registered charity

#### 2 Accounting Policies

#### i Accounting Convention

These Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards, the Companies Act 2006 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (revised 2005)

#### ii Depreciation of Tangible Fixed Assets

Equipment is written off in the year of purchase if it costs less than £500 and also if funds are given specifically for its purchase

Otherwise, depreciation is provided in equal installments over the estimated lives of the assets The rates of depreciation are as follows

Furniture and Fittings

5 years

Office Equipment

3 years

#### iii Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy

Voluntary income is deferred where entitlement to the income occurs in a future accounting period as specified by the donor

The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income

Voluntary income is received by way of grants from churches and trusts, and gifts from individuals and is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable

Investment income is included when receivable

Incoming resources from charitable activities which include Higher Education Funding are included when earned

#### iv Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes irrecoverable VAT and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates

#### v Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity

Designated funds are unrestricted funds which have been earmarked by the Trustees for a particular purpose

Restricted funds are funds subject to specific restrictions imposed by the donor, the major fund being the monies utilised by Oxford CYM for the funding of students for their education in all its forms, and not available for other chantable purposes, and have therefore been treated in these financial statements as a restricted fund

#### Taxation

The Inland Revenue have confirmed that the Company is a charity within the definition of Section 506(1) Income and Corporation Taxes Act 1988 and therefore is exempt from Corporation Tax

The company is not registered for VAT

Gift Aid Tax recoverable is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable
