Notes to the Accounts - for the year ended 31 December 2011

1 Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of accounting

These financial statements are prepared on the going concern basis, under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and generally accepted accounting principles in the United Kingdom (UK GAAP). The principal accounting policies, which have been consistently applied are set out below

The directors have adapted the arrangement of certain headings in the profit and loss account to reflect more effectively and more accurately the nature of the company's activities. In particular turnover represents interest receivable and interest payable has been treated as a deduction against gross profit.

(b) Turnover

Turnover represents gross interest receivable for the company's principal activity. Interest in respect of all loans is credited to the profit and loss account as it becomes receivable. All turnover is derived from within the United Kingdom.

(c) Tax

Corporation tax is charged on the profit on ordinary activities for the year as adjusted for tax purposes

(d) Provisions for losses on loans and advances

Provision is made for all anticipated losses on loans and advances based upon a year end appraisal

Specific provisions are made against mortgage loans on a case by case basis to cover anticipated losses in respect of all accounts that are in arrears and where a probable loss has been identified due to impairment. Anticipated losses on such accounts are calculated as the difference between the current achievable market value of the security, based on current valuations of the property performed by qualified local surveyors, and the outstanding loan balance, after making appropriate allowance for costs of repossession and sale any any amounts recoverable under external loss insurance

General provisions are made to reflect the probability that other loans may also be impaired at the balance sheet date, with the result that the amount advanced may not be recoverable in full. The provision is based upon the company's experience and current economic trends

(e) Cash flow statement

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Leek United Building Society and is included in the financial statements of Leek United Building Society, which are publicly available. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS1 (revised 1996)
