#### **Principal activity**

The principal activity of the company is the running of a professional football club.

#### **Executive Summary**

The Directors present their report and financial statements for the financial year ended 30th June 2021.

The financial statements relate to the 2020/21 EFL League season which continued to be impacted by Government restrictions in place as a result of the ongoing Covid 19 pandemic.

In view of the uncertainty, the club has continued to apply a robust approach to managing its finances with all appropriate controls in place. This approach has ensured that the club navigated its way through the pandemic and maintained a reasonable financial position.

The initial challenge came from the Government decision, made at the start of the season, that all fixtures were to be played "behind closed doors" until further notice. The Club immediately adopted a policy in relation to season ticket sales where purchasers could enjoy access to the EFL iFollow system in the event that they were unable to attend matches in person. As a result, the club was able to maintain a good level of season ticket sales which in conjunction with the support of sponsors and advertisers meant a reasonable level of match related revenue. The Club continued to take advantage of all available Government support which included Job Retention Scheme, Welsh Government and Local Council initiatives.

# Directors' Report for the Year Ended 30 June 2021

Support from the Football Authorities, both EFL and Premier League, has been vital in the Club maintaining its strong financial base and the Board ensured it continued to meet all contractual obligations.

At the start of the 20/21season the EFL introduced a system of Salary and Squad Caps which created new challenges which required careful management and the Club continued to achieve success on the pitch by reaching the EFL League 2 play offs. The semi-finals and final of these were given dispensation to be played in front of minimal crowds with a considerable level of restrictions. The financial benefit of reaching the play offs was therefore severely impacted.

Overall, the performance remains very satisfactory and the support the club has received throughout the year from sponsors, partners, Football Authorities, Welsh Government, UK Government, Newport Council, and local politicians is very much appreciated.

The Board would like to acknowledge the overwhelming support and understanding it has received from its supporters during a difficult period for all concerned. This has been absolutely crucial in meeting all of the challenges that the Club faced.

#### 1 General information

The company is a private company limited by share capital, incorporated in England and Wales.

#### 2 Accounting policies

## Summary of significant accounting policies and key accounting estimates

The principal accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

#### Statement of compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 102 Section 1A - 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006.

#### Basis of preparation

These financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention except that as disclosed in the accounting policies certain items are shown at fair value.

#### Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

As a result of the Covid-19 related pandemic the 2019-20 season was terminated early and the 2020-21 season was commenced with all fixtures taking place "behind closed doors". This had an impact on income but with the Club's continued control on costs in line with budget, a small profit was made for the 2020-21 financial year.

With the 2021-22 season currently being played with the return of fans, the board are confident that with the controls put in place as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, it will ensure the Club can continue to operate within its agreed bank facilities.

Consequently, the Board consider that the Going Concern basis remains appropriate in preparing these financial statements.

#### Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 30 June 2021

#### Revenue recognition

Turnover represents amounts derived from ordinary activities, and is stated net of Value Added Tax.

Income is recognised as follows:-

- gate receipts, retail sales at point of sale
- central funding, commercial income, grant income over the time period to which it relates
- transfer fees at point of entitlement in accordance with the transfer agreement
- donations at point of receipt unless stipulated by the donor

#### Tangible assets

Tangible assets are stated in the balance sheet at cost, less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

The cost of tangible assets includes directly attributable incremental costs incurred in their acquisition and installation.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is charged so as to write off the cost of assets, other than land and properties under construction over their estimated useful lives, as follows:

Plant and equipment

Improvements to leasehold premises

#### Depreciation method and rate

on a straight-line basis over five or ten years

on a straight-line basis over ten years

## Goodwill

Player acquisition costs are capitalised as intangible fixed assets and comprise the transfer fees, transfer levies, and agents' fees arising on registration.

These capitalised costs are amortised on a straight-line basis over the duration of each of the players' contracts. Where a player's contract is extended, amortisation is recomputed over the longer contract period, from the date on which the extended contract is signed.

Where the carrying value of a player's acquisition costs are regarded as impaired (for instance, by injury), these costs are written down to the value regarded as recoverable through usage or sale.

Any gain or loss arising on the sale of a player registration is calculated in the same way as for any other fixed asset.

Where a portion of an agreed transfer fee is conditional on future performance criteria (for instance, a given number of first team performances), that portion of the transfer fee is recognised only when its realisation becomes certain.

#### **Amortisation**

Amortisation is provided on intangible assets so as to write off the cost, less any estimated residual value, over their useful life as follows:

#### Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash on hand and call deposits, and other short-term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash and are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

#### Trade debtors

Trade debtors are amounts due from customers for merchandise sold or services performed in the ordinary course of business.

Trade debtors are recognised initially at the transaction price. They are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment. A provision for the impairment of trade debtors is established when there is objective evidence that the company will not be able to collect all amounts due according to the original terms of the receivables.

#### **Stocks**

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and estimated selling price less costs to complete and sell. Cost is determined using the first-in, first-out (FIFO) method.

The cost of finished goods and work in progress comprises direct materials and, where applicable, direct labour costs and those overheads that have been incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. At each reporting date, stocks are assessed for impairment. If stocks are impaired, the carrying amount is reduced to its selling price less costs to complete and sell; the impairment loss is recognised immediately in profit or loss.

#### **Trade creditors**

Trade creditors are obligations to pay for goods or services that have been acquired in the ordinary course of business from suppliers. Accounts payable are classified as current liabilities if the company does not have an unconditional right, at the end of the reporting period, to defer settlement of the creditor for at least twelve months after the reporting date. If there is an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting date, they are presented as non-current liabilities.

Trade creditors are recognised initially at the transaction price and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

#### **Borrowings**

Interest-bearing borrowings are initially recorded at fair value, net of transaction costs. Interest-bearing borrowings are subsequently carried at amortised cost, with the difference between the proceeds, net of transaction costs, and the amount due on redemption being recognised as a charge to the Profit and Loss Account over the period of the relevant borrowing.

Interest expense is recognised on the basis of the effective interest method and is included in interest payable and similar charges.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the company has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting date.

### Share capital

Ordinary shares are classified as equity. Equity instruments are measured at the fair value of the cash or other resources received or receivable, net of the direct costs of issuing the equity instruments. If payment is deferred and the time value of money is material, the initial measurement is on a present value basis.
