# Report on the financial statements

## Our opinion

In our opinion the financial statements, defined below:

## Emphasis of matter - Basis of preparation

In forming our opinion on the financial statements, which is not modified, we have considered the adequacy of the disclosure made in note 1 to the financial statements concerning the basis of accounting. The Directors' state in their report that the company has ceased trading and it is the intention of the directors that the company will be wound up in the next financial year. Accordingly, the going concern basis of accounting is no longer appropriate and the financial statements have been prepared on a basis other than going concern as described in note 1 to the financial statements. No adjustments were necessary in these financial statements to reduce assets to their realisable values, to provide for liabilities arising from the decision and to reclassify fixed assets and longterm liabilities as current assets and liabilities.

- the profit and loss account for the year then ended;
- the cash flow statement for the year then ended; and

# 1 Accounting policies

## **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and applicable accounting standards in the United Kingdom. As stated in the Directors' report, the company has ceased business and it is the intention of the directors that the company will be wound up in the next financial year. Accordingly, the going concern basis of accounting is no longer appropriate and the financial statements have been prepared on a basis other than the going concern. A summary of the main accounting policies, which have been consistently applied during the year, are stated below:

#### Turnover

Turnover represents amounts billed during the year, arising from prior year activities relating to the provision of pension trustee services excluding sales tax and third party invoiced disbursements and net of bad debt provisions and write offs. Revenue is recognised when it is judged that the stage of completion of the contract, the amount to be received and the costs incurred and to complete the contract can be measured reliably and it is probable the revenue will be received. It is measured by reference to the stage of completion of the contract at the estimated fair value of the right to consideration

#### Assets and liabilities

All assets and liabilities are stated at the lower of cost and net recoverable amount.

# 2 Turnover

Turnover and result for the year are attributable to the principle activity of the company.

All turnover relates to the United Kingdom.
