

ADMINISTRATORS' REPORT TO CREDITORS IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 2.33 OF THE INSOLVENCY RULES 1986

Administrator's Report



Introduction

As previously advised, I was appointed Administrator of RUSHDEN AND DIAMONDS FOOTBALL CLUB LIMITED ("the Company") on 5 July 2011. The relevant court details are included within the Statutory Information produced as Appendix 1. The appointment was made by the holder of a qualifying floating charge, under the provisions of the Insolvency Act 1986 as amended by The Enterprise Act 2002 and was subsequently filed in the High Court of Justice, Companies Court

Under the terms of the Insolvency Act 1986, the Administrator is required to send creditors of the company a statement of his proposals for achieving the purposes of the Administration. The purpose of this report is to fulfil these requirements and to advise creditors generally on the progress of the Administration.

The Administrator acts as an officer of the court and as an agent of the company without personal liability. Any act required or authorised under any enactment to be done by an administrator may be done by any one or more persons holding the office of administrator from time to time.

The Administrator of a company must perform his functions with the hierarchical objective of

- (a) rescuing the company as a going concern, or
- (b) achieving a better result for the company's creditors as a whole than would be likely if the company were wound up (without first being in administration), or
- (c) realising property in order to make a distribution to one or more secured or preferential creditors.

In the administration of this company objectives (a) and (b) are not achievable but I believe that objective (c) will be achieved. Immediately following my appointment I realised that objectives (a) and (b) could not be achieved. The company had ceased trading for the reasons set out later in this report. At the commencement of the administration I was thus without any funds to enable trading to continue or a league for any team to play in. The holder of the qualifying floating charge stated that they would not be prepared to fund any trading during the administration.

Administrators statement

Under paragraph 52 of Schedule B1 of the Insolvency Act 1986 I am not required to summon a first meeting of creditors as I do not believe either objective (a) or (b) above will be achieved and the only distribution to unsecured creditors may be from the prescribed part. Creditors may however require me to summon a creditors meeting if more than 10% of creditors by value request me to do so. Creditors who require me to hold a creditors meeting should complete Form 2.21B and send it to Carter Clark within 12 days of the date of these proposals. If no valid request for a creditors meeting is received within 12 days of the date of these proposals, the proposals are deemed approved. A copy of Form 2.21B is enclosed with this report. Under Rule 2.37 of The Insolvency Rules 1986 (as amended) I am entitled to ask creditors for a deposit for my fees in summoning such a meeting.

Creditors are also entitled at a meeting of creditors to establish a Creditors' Committee should they so wish, provided that there are no fewer than three creditors wishing to be represented on the committee. The maximum size of a committee is restricted to five members

Prior professional relationship

Prior to being consulted by the company concerning its financial position, I had had no prior professional relationship with the company or any of the directors

Background and events leading to the appointment of Administrators'

The company operated a football club which had experienced considerable success. Promotion to the football league was obtained at the end of the 2000 – 2001 season. A further promotion to League One was obtained two seasons later.

The success of the club had been funded by a generous benefactor. Following the promotion to League One, the benefactor was unable to continue his generous funding. Relegation back to League Two duly followed. In June 2005 ownership of the football club was passed to a supporters trust.

At the end of the 2005 – 2006 season relegation to the football conference occurred Financial difficulties arose as a result of the relegation. Control of the club was duly passed to Mr Keith Cousins in November 2006 in order to avoid the club entering Administration.

Attendances at matches continued to decline and accordingly revenue from match day income also declined. Significant advances were made by the owner of the club in order to fund the on-going losses. The financial constraints placed upon the club also made it difficult to build a squad of players, who would be able to push for promotion back to the football league.

In December 2010 control of the club passed to Mr Liam Beasant and Mr Gary Calder Mr Calder resigned three months later and Mr Steve Beasant became the chief executive Mr Cousins relinquished control of the club as he was no longer prepared to continue funding the on-going losses. The new owners had plans to expand the club's revenue stream in order for it to become self-financing. Unfortunately, these projected revenue streams never materialised. The club continued to be loss making.

The Football Conference have stringent financial reporting criteria. The management board of the Football Conference became concerned about the company's finances and required reassurance that the club would be able to fulfil its fixtures during the 2011 – 2012 season. The club was unable to provide sufficient reassurance to the conference and, as a result, was expelled from the Football Conference on 11 June 2011.

Whilst discussions with the Football Conference were taking place, the club's directors sought new investors. The investors, however, lost interest when the club lost its place in the Football Conference. As all these matters were on-going, a winding up petition was issued against the company, which in turn was supported by various other creditors. Without any further investment it was clear that the company could not avoid being wound up. In addition to these difficulties, the landlord of the club's stadium also exercised its right to forfeit the lease by means of peaceable reentry.

The charge holder believed that an Administration would be more beneficial than a compulsory winding up Accordingly they exercised their right to appoint an Administrator prior to the adjourned hearing of the winding up petition

Financial Position of the Company as at 5 July 2011

Accounts were prepared by the company and extracts are enclosed at Appendix 2

A Statement of Affairs in respect of the company has not yet been provided by the directors. At Appendix 3.1 produce an estimated statement of affairs based upon the information currently known to me. A list of known creditors is also included.

Prescribed part

There are provisions of the insolvency legislation that require a administrator to set aside a percentage of a company's assets for the benefit of the unsecured creditors in cases where the company gave a "qualifying floating charge" over its assets to a lender on or after 15 September 2003. This is known as the "prescribed part of the net property." A company's net property is that left after paying the preferential creditors, but before paying the lender who holds a floating charge. An administrator has to set aside.

- 50% of the first £10,000 of the net property, and
- 20% of the remaining net property up to a maximum of £600,000.

The estimated Statement of Affairs indicates that the net property upon which the prescribed part will be calculated is £99,814. This would lead to a prescribed part of £22,962. This is however subject to the eventual realisations and the costs of the administration. The actual amount of the prescribed part is therefore likely to be lower. In addition, I believe there may be some more preferential creditors who have not yet lodged their claims.

If the prescribed part becomes less than £10,000, I have a discretion to disapply the provisions relating to the prescribed part if I believe that the costs of distributing the prescribed part outweigh the benefit

Attached, at Appendix 4, is a Receipts and Payments Account for the period 5 July 2011 to 25 August 2011

Progress of the administration to date

Since the commencement of the administration I have managed to collect £7,210, subject to clearance of cheques, in respect of the company's book debts. Most of this sum relates to the hiring of facilities at the football club prior to the landlord forfeiting the lease. I have also received £8,033 from the company's bank account. At present I am not able to identify whether this money belongs to the company or is money held on trust by the company as part of the Dale Roberts Memorial Fund. Clarification is being sought from the bank.

The contracts relating to the transfer of players, and under which monies are due, have been identified. Work is on-going in relation to the collection of these sums. Creditors will receive a further update in my next progress report.

Several former employees have lodged claims with me. These claims have been forwarded to the Redundancy Payments Office for processing and payment. The claims of those unsecured creditors who have notified me of their debts have been logged and will be passed on to a liquidator if and when one is appointed.

Administrators' time costs

To date myself and my staff have spent 118 6 hours dealing with the administration at a time cost of £25,779 which equates to an average hourly rate £217 36 per hour. A detailed breakdown of these costs is set out in Appendix 5

Future matters in the administration

When the collection of the company's book debts has been completed, I believe that the purpose of the administration will have been achieved. Following payment to the secured creditor, any preferential creditors and the expenses of the administration, I will bring the administration to a close by dissolving the company, unless realisations exceed current expectations and a distribution is available to unsecured creditors. If a distribution is to be made, I will convert the administration to a creditor's voluntary liquidation in accordance with Paragraph 4 of my proposals.

The liquidator for the purpose of the winding up shall be

- a) a person nominated by the creditors of the company in the prescribed manor and within the prescribed period,
- b) If no person is nominated under paragraph (a), the administrator

I confirm that as part of my proposals I seek nomination as liquidator in the subsequent winding up of the company. Creditors may nominate a different person as the proposed liquidator

EC Regulations on Insolvency Proceedings 2000

The company's main interests are within England and Wales and therefore these proceedings are main insolvency proceedings as defined by the above regulations. This is because the company's registered office and trading address are in England & Wales.

The Administrator's formal proposals in respect of the company are attached to this report.

STATEMENT OF THE ADMINISTRATORS' PROPOSALS PURSUANT. TO PARA 49 OF SCHEDULE 1B OF THE INSOLVENCY ACT 1986

In accordance with Paragraph 49 of Schedule B1 to the Insolvency Act 1986, I, Alan John Clark of Carter Clark the Administrator of RUSHDEN AND DIAMONDS FOOTBALL CLUB LIMITED - IN ADMINISTRATION ("the Company"), make to the creditors the following proposals for achieving the purposes of the Administration which commenced on 5 July 2011 Approval of these proposals will be deemed approved unless within twelve days of the date of these proposals creditors have requested that I hold a creditors meeting in accordance with Rule 2 37 Insolvency Rules 1986

Proposals

The Administrator proposes

- 1. That I continue to receive and manage the assets of the company, with a view to realising the assets of the company and making a distribution to the charge holder and any preferential creditors. I also anticipate that there will not be a distribution to the unsecured creditors except from the prescribed part pursuant to Section 176A of the Insolvency Act 1986. I am, however, not empowered to make a distribution to the unsecured creditors within the Administration unless I make an application to court. It is proposed that the Administrator be empowered to realise the assets of the company at such time and on such terms as he considers most beneficial, should he consider this course of action to be appropriate.
- That I carry out all acts and generally exercise my powers in a way that I consider to be appropriate and beneficial for the achievement of these purposes for which the Administration was sought
- 3. That I continue the Administration for such period of time that it remains likely to achieve the purposes for which the Administrator was appointed
- That once I believe that the purposes of the Administration have been achieved or are no longer capable of implementation I will bring the Administration to an end. At the conclusion of the Administration the company will be dissolved or converted to a creditor's voluntary liquidation if there is a dividend available to the unsecured creditors.
- 5 During the course of the Administration I will receive and deal with the claims of unsecured creditors
- The release as Administrator will occur upon the filing at Companies House of the appropriate form to dissolve the company or convert the administration to a creditor's voluntary liquidation. In addition the Administrator shall be granted discharge from liability in accordance with paragraph 98(2) of Schedule B1 to the Insolvency Act 1986, 21 days after ceasing to act.
- 7. That the Administrators remuneration be fixed by reference to the time properly given by him (as Administrator) and the various grades of his staff calculated at the prevailing hourly charge-out rates of Carter Clark for attending to matters arising in the Administration
