THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2011

The directors have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the group for the year ended 31 March 2011

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company continued to be that of a holding company. The principal activity of the group during the year was the publication of business magazines, the provision of business information services and the organisation of related events.

This year has been one of careful stabilisation of our core titles, the continued development of our non print products and vigorous action to reduce our cost base

The recession continues and while most businesses, like ours, have found ways to survive in the face of expensive and limited bank finance, marketing spend has been curtailed across every sector our titles serve. With the plethora of competition we face in both product and communication channels, it is to the credit of our editorial and sales teams that we have been able grow revenue, albeit only by a couple of percent, and expand our influence in ensuring our customers get their sales message to the market most effectively

Our net profit in the year has grown by 106% in spite of the small revenue increase achieved Production costs, reflecting the gradual switch to a mix of print and electronic distribution and the increase in soft media sales, ran at 86% of the previous year level. Staff numbers and costs have been lowered too but will rise as the economic situation strengthens and our customer base increases its promotional activity.

The signs are there that this is beginning to happen. Our Flagship title 'InAVate' grew revenue by 26% year on year and announced the launch of xSolutions, an exhibition for the UK AV market which has attracted many of the field leaders in this area. Mature products have not enjoyed such a rigorous rebound though those in food, facilities and control engineering have each improved on last year's figures.

Our products in the engineering and electronic design fields have reduced their losses but point to the need for the Company to develop new offerings in burgeoning modern technology sectors that naturally embrace print, digital, internet and face to face channels in their attempt to gain market dominance

Soft media revenues such as websites and other electronic channels offer good potential to offset the gradual decline in print based revenues in mature sectors but such growth remains dependent upon our customers fully embracing the marketing opportunities this capability provides

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The first staging of xSolutions took place in October 2011 and was well supported by the leading companies in the sector and attracted a visitorship of a quality and quantity that more than satisfied their expectations. Next year's event has been booked again into ExCel for the beginning of October and the board is confident of our ability to grow this event over the coming years.

Elsewhere our efforts are directed at improving our approach to market, retraining existing personnel so that our sales offering is more inclusive of the multi channel requirement of today's advertisers, rather than continuing the one dimensional print based option of the past. Revenue potential here is large since it is still only the multi national market leaders who have committed serious money to the web and other electronic marketing opportunities to date and we have a number of innovations to encourage the medium sized operator to embrace what is the most accountable of advertising media.

Our intention is to widen our portfolio of titles to balance the mature strength of our existing products. Future launches will be in recently emergent sectors and will always comprise interlinked print, web and digital routes-to-market to reflect the myriad of choice open to customers in marketing their products and services.

The future will require that we stay abreast of technological changes in the way in which we deliver the information that is the bedrock of our ability to attract and keep readers and users of our products. Fundamentally however, we must continue to supply reliable, informative, helpful and involving material of quality to enable us to remain the first choice data supplier to the companies in our target markets. That is an ambition which the Company is well set to meet.

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets and in accordance with applicable accounting standards

Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practise), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

Basis of consolidation

The consolidated profit and loss account and balance sheet include the financial statements of the company and its subsidiary undertakings made up to 31 March 2008

Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts

Goodwill

Acquired goodwill is written off in equal instalments over its estimated useful economic life.

Exhibitions

Profits on exhibitions are taken to the profit and loss account in the period of the exhibition. Where costs in respect of an exhibition are incurred in a period prior to the exhibition, such amounts are taken to the profit and loss account in the period in which they arise unless there is reasonable certainty that the exhibition will result in a profit

Intangible Assets

Intangible assets represent publishing rights and titles, databases and exhibition rights Publishing rights in respect of well established titles with readily ascertainable market values on the basis of their estimated minimum market values. In accordance with the requirements of FRS 10 the values are reviewed annually. Having no finite economic life, amortisation is not provided.

Fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets include investment properties valued by the directors on an existing use open market basis. Other tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or valuation less depreciation.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows

Fixtures & Fittings

- 20% straight line

Equipment

- 20% straight line

The directors consider that the level of repairs and maintenance on freehold buildings will result in high residual values and long economic lives such that any depreciation charge would be immaterial

Stocks

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value

Operating lease agreements

Rentals applicable to operating leases where substantially all of the benefits and risks of ownership remain with the lessor are charged against profits on a straight line basis over the period of the lease

Pension costs

During the year the group operated two separate defined contribution pension schemes for the directors and staff. The staff scheme is closed and a new stakeholder scheme has been set up for employees. The pension costs charged in the financial statements represent the contributions payable by the group during the year.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided in full in respect of taxation deferred by timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. The deferred tax balance has not been discounted

No provision has been made for deferred tax on gains recognised on revaluing publishing rights or property to market value, as the company does not intend to sell the revalued assets

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Exchange differences are taken into account in arriving at the operating profit.

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the group after deducting all of its liabilities.

16. FINANCIAL RISK MANAGEMENT OBJECTIVES AND POLICIES

The company and group's financial instruments comprise bank balances, bank overdrafts, trade creditors, trade debtors and loans to the company. The main purpose of these instruments is to raise funds for the group's operations and to the finance the group's operations.

Due to the nature of the financial instruments used by the company and group there is no exposure to price risk. The group's approach to managing other risks applicable to the financial instruments is shown below

In respect of bank balances the liquidity risk is managed by maintaining a balance between the continuity of funding and flexibility through the use of overdrafts at floating rates of interest. The group makes use of money market facilities where funds are available.

In respect of loans these comprise loans from directors and loans from financial institutions. The interest rate on the loans from financial institutions is variable but the quarterly repayments are fixed. The group manages the liquidity risk by ensuring there are sufficient funds to meet payments. The interest rates on the loans from directors are variable and the loans payable on demand. The directors are aware of the group's required finance and have determined that these will only be repaid, in whole or in part, when finance is available.

Trade debtors are managed in respect of credit and cash flow risk by policies concerning the credit offered to customers and the regular monitoring of amounts outstanding for both time and credit limits

Trade creditors liquidity risk is managed by ensuring sufficient funds are available to meet amounts due
