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DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE 52 WEEKS ENDED 25 FEBRUARY 2012

The Directors present their report and the audited financial statements of Spen Hill Management Limited (the "Company") for the 52 week period ended 25 February 2012 (prior period 52 weeks ended 26 February 2011)

Business review and principal activities

The principal activity of the Company is to manage the property owners' interests in the properties and to provide services in accordance with the terms of the Property Pool Management Agreements for Tesco joint ventures and certain other property owners. There has been no significant change in the nature or level of this activity during the period and we do not expect this to change significantly throughout the next financial year.

Results and dividends

The results for the period show a pre-tax profit of £1,367 (2011 loss of £318,145) and sales of £3,310,386 (2011 £2,697,626)

The Directors do not recommend a payment of a dividend for the 52 weeks ended 25 February 2012 (2011 £mil)

The Company had net liabilities of £316,776 at 25 February 2012 (2011 £318,143)

Principal risks and uncertainties

The principal risks relate to the recoverability of management and insurance fees

To manage this risk the Company periodically reviews the financial position of the entities to which the Company supplies insurance and management services

From the perspective of the Company, the principal risks and uncertainties are integrated with the principal risks of the Tesco PLC Group (the "Group") and are not managed separately. Accordingly, the principle risks and uncertainties of the Group, which include the Company, are discussed on pages 40-47 of the Tesco PLC Group Annual Report for the 52 weeks ending 25 February 2012 which does not form part of this Report.

Going concern

It is the current intention of the parent undertakings to continue to finance the Company so as to enable it to meet its liabilities as they fall due, and to carry on its business without any significant curtailment of operations during the forthcoming year. Accordingly the accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Charitable and political contributions

There were no charitable or political donations for the period (2011 £nil)

Future outlook

The Company's performance is expected to improve throughout the next financial period and it is anticipated that the current performance levels will be maintained

Key performance indicators (KPIs)

Given the straightforward nature of the business, the Directors are of the opinion that analysis using key performance indicators is not necessary for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the business
