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### TRUSTEES' REPORT (INCLUDING DIRECTORS' REPORT)

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2021.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in note 1 to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016)

#### Objectives and activities

The charity's principle objective is the promotion of homeopathy through funding of education and research and the raising of funds to support homeopathic activities.

The policies adopted in furtherance of these objects continue to be:

- to educate the public in the art and science of homeopathy, in particular using social media to provide and disseminate information
- promoting to the public the useful results of study and research into homeopathic medicine so that they may make more informed choices about their health
- making grants to students of homeopathy in financial need
- Making grants to projects that deliver homeopathic treatment to members of the public

The trustees have paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charity Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

#### Achievements and performance

Charitable activities:

The charity continues to provide membership services for supporters of homeopathy, including email newsletters, a website, Facebook page and Twitter posts.

#### Financial review

It is the policy of the charity that unrestricted funds which have not been designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six month's expenditure. The trustees considers that reserves at this level will ensure that, in the event of a significant drop in funding, they will be able to continue the charity's current activities while consideration is given to ways in which additional funds may be raised. This level of reserves has been maintained throughout the year. However, fundraising activities were curtailed due to the Coronavirus pandemic, consequently reducing the charity's income."

The trustees have assessed the major risks to which the charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

#### Structure, governance and management

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a company limited by guarantee.

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

#### 1 Accounting policies

#### **Charity information**

Homeopathy Action Trust is a private company limited by guarantee incorporated in England and Wales. The registered office is Unit F, Whiteacres, Cambridge Road, Whetstone, Leicestershire, LE8 6ZG.

#### 1.1 Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the charity's governing document, the Companies Act 2006 and "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102)" (as amended for accounting periods commencing from 1 January 2016). The charity is a Public Benefit Entity as defined by FRS 102.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update Bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity. Monetary amounts in these financial statements are rounded to the nearest £.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention. The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

#### 1.2 Going concern

At the time of approving the financial statements, the trustees have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus the trustees continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

#### 1.3 Charitable funds

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of their charitable objectives.

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions by donors as to how they may be used. The purposes and uses of the restricted funds are set out in the notes to the financial statements.

### 1.4 Incoming resources

All income is recognised when the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### 1.5 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised as soon as a liability is probable.

Grants payable are recognised when payment is due.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS (CONTINUED) FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2021

The restricted funds are as set out below:

#### Cancer Fund:

This fund supports the use of homeopathy with cancer. The Trust funded a Cancer Support Project, which published a positive user-outcome study.

#### **Homeopathy Wood:**

The Wood, situated at Sywell Country Park, Northamptonshire, is a living collection of homeopathic remedies. Currently we have over 1000 individually sponsored trees and encourage further donations to the Wood or the gifts of single trees or a group of 3 trees.

#### Library Fund:

This is a Fund to house and make available homeopathy books, currently in storage.

#### Film Projects:

These projects finance documentary films about Homeopathy.

#### **Bursaries (Struggling Homeopaths) Fund:**

This Fund is to assist students of homeopathy financially, with a modest grant towards their costs.

#### Kenya School Fund:

This fund supports the provision of Homeopathy books to the Kenya School of Homeopathy.

#### **Ghana Homeopathy Project:**

This funding was a one-off grant to support the ongoing education of students of homeopathy in Ghana.

#### Amma Resonance Healing Fund:

The fund facilitated an international homeopathy educational conference.

### Stephen Gordon Fund:

A fund for donations towards a memorial to Stephen Gordon FSHom, a founding pillar of the Society of Homeopaths and the European Central Council of Homeopaths, who sadly passed away on 8 July 2017. Stephen worked tirelessly to speak up for homeopathy and we owe him an eternal debt of gratitude for his vision, energy and commitment.

#### Future funding:

The trustees decided at the AGM on January 15th 2021 to fulfil existing commitments to oversees projects and thereafter focus all resources only on UK projects.
