To the Directors of R. Delamore Limited:

In our opinion, the company is entitled under sections 246 and 247 of the Companies Act 1985 to the exemptions claimed in the directors' statement on page 3, and the financial statements to be delivered have been properly prepared in accordance with Schedule 8 to the Companies Act 1985.

We reported, as auditors of R. Delamore Limited, to the shareholders on 10 January 1996 on the company's financial statements prepared under Section 226 of the Companies Act 1985 for the year ended 31 March 1995, and our audit opinion was as follows:

"We have audited the financial statements on pages 4 to 16 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on pages 6 and 7.

Respective responsibilities of directors and auditors

As described on page 1 the company's directors are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the circumstances of the company, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements. The company is exempt from the requirement of Financial Reporting Standard 1 to produce a cash flow statement, as it is a small company as defined by the Companies Act 1985.

Notes to abbreviated financial statements

31 March 1995

1 Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are:

a) Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

b) Intangible fixed assets

Purchased goodwill is capitalised and amortised on a straight-line basis over 20 years.

c) Tangible fixed assets

Tangible fixed assets are shown at original historical cost.

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost, less estimated residual value, of each asset on a straight-line basis over its expected useful life, as follows:

Greenhouses

12.5% per annum

Plant and machinery

25% per annum

Motor vehicles

25% per annum

d) Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is based on purchase cost on a first-in, first-out basis, plus a reasonable proportion of propagation overheads based on normal levels of activity, where applicable.

Net realisable value is based on estimated normal selling price, less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete, slow-moving or defective items where appropriate.

e) Taxation

Corporation tax is provided on taxable profits at the current rate.

Advanced corporation tax payable on dividends paid or provided for in the year is written off, except when recoverability against corporation tax payable is considered to be reasonably assured.

Deferred taxation (which arises from differences in the timing of the recognition of items, principally depreciation, in the financial statements and by the tax authorities) has been calculated on the liability method. Deferred taxation is provided on timing differences, which will probably reverse at the rates of tax likely to be in force at the time of reversal. Deferred taxation is not provided on timing differences which, in the opinion of the directors, will probably not reverse.
