REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of the stadium redevelopment.

Turnover

Turnover represents match receipts and other income associated with the principal activity of running a professional football club and excludes value added tax (all income generated in the UK).

Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Stadium development 2% on a straight line basis

Long term lease 2% on a straight line basis

Plant and equipment 10% on a straight line basis

Motor vehicles 20% on a straight line basis

Fixtures and fittings 12.5% on a straight line basis

The carrying value of the stadium development has been frozen and is carried at modified historical cost as permitted by the transitional rules in the first year of application of FRS 15 "Tangible fixed assets".

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost is computed on a first in first out basis. Net realisable value is based on estimated selling price less the estimated cost of disposal.

Intangible fixed assets and goodwill

The cost of players' registrations is capitalised and amortised over the period of the respective players' contracts.

Goodwill amounting to £1,659,999 relating to prior periods was historically written off against the profit and loss reserve as a matter of accounting policy and remains eliminated against that reserve. This amount will be charged or credited in the profit and loss account on the subsequent disposal of the associated business. Any future goodwill, will be capitalised in the balance sheet and amortised over its useful life.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability methods in respect of the taxation effect of all timing differences to the extent that tax liabilities are likely to crystallise in the foreseeable future.

Leases and hire purchase contracts

Tangible fixed assets acquired under finance leases and hire purchase contracts are capitalised at the estimated fair value at the date of inception of each lease or contract. The total finance charges are allocated over the period of the lease in such a way as to give a reasonably constant charge on the outstanding liability.

Year ended 31 May 2001

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Deferred income

Revenues received in advance are credited to deferred income and released to the profit and loss account over the period to which they relate.

Grants received in respect of safety work and ground improvements are credited to deferred grant income and are released to the profit and loss account over the anticipated useful life of the assets to which they relate.

Pensions

Defined contribution arrangements are made to eligible employees of the company. The pension cost charged in the year represents contributions payable by the company.

Signing-on fees

Signing-on fees payable to players are charged, as part of operating expenses, to the profit and loss account over the period of the player's contract. Where a player's registration is transferred, any signing on fees payable in respect of future periods are charged against profit or loss on disposal of players.

Contingent appearance fees

Where the directors consider the likelihood of a player meeting future appearance criteria laid down in the transfer agreement of that player to be probable, provision for this cost is made (see note 16). If the likelihood of meeting these criteria is not probable no provision is made (see note 23).

Investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision for any impairment.

2. PRIOR YEAR ADJUSTMENTS

- (i) To accord with industry best accounting practice, operating expenses of £13,734,480 shown in the year ended 31 May 2000 have been restated to include amortisation of players' registrations of £2,032,450 which was previously stated separately on the face of the profit and loss account.
- (ii) In order to ensure comparability of corresponding amounts and improve disclosure of deferred income, amounts previously accounted for as creditors falling due within and after one year, have been reclassified as accruals and deferred income. This results in an increase in accruals and deferred income at 31 May 2000 of £2,678,927 and a corresponding decrease in creditors falling due within one year of £617,973 and in creditors falling due after more than one year of £2,060,954. See also note 18.
- (iii) At the current and previous year end the ultimate parent undertaking formally agreed that, for the foreseeable future, it would continue financial support and that it would not seek repayment of amounts due for at least twelve months from the date of signing the financial statements. In order to reflect this £38,256,957 (£38,111,573 company) has been reclassified at 31 May 2000 from creditors falling due within one year to creditors falling due after more than one year.

None of the above adjustments has any effect on current or prior year profit before or after tax.

3. CONSOLIDATED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

As permitted by Section 230 of the Companies Act 1985, the profit and loss account of the parent company is not presented as part of these accounts. The parent company's profit (see note 20) for the financial year amounted to £3,341,109 (2000 - loss of £3,174,226). Of the company's profit for the year £3,352,623 (2000 - loss of £3,113,108) arises from movements in provisions which were made against intercompany receivables in a previous year.

23. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

In addition to amounts provided in note 16, the group may be required to pay contingent sums, dependent on the occurrence of future first team and international appearances and on field playing success of £1,121,000 (2000 - £492,375) at the balance sheet date.

24. PENSIONS

Certain staff of the group are members of either the Football League Limited Retirement Income Scheme, a defined contribution scheme, or the Football League Limited Pension and Life Assurance Scheme ("FLLPLAS"), a defined benefit scheme. As the group is one of a number of participating employers in FLLPLAS contributions are expensed in the profit and loss account as they become payable. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the group, being invested with insurance companies.

In August 1999 a deficit on FLLPLAS was identified by the actuarial advisers to the scheme. The deficit attributable to the group in respect of current and former employees is £108,000 (projected to August 2001) and has been charged to the profit and loss account in the current year.

25. ULTIMATE PARENT COMPANY

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Wend Investments Limited, a company incorporated in the Bahamas.

26. POST BALANCE SHEET EVENTS

Since the year end, the group has sold players' registrations recorded as intangible assets with a value at the balance sheet date of £582,005 resulting in a profit on sale of £867,995. In addition the group has acquired players' registrations with a value of £7,085,000 since the balance sheet date.
