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DIRECTORS' REPORT

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2011

The directors present their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011

Principal activities and review of the business

On 14 April 2011 Capita Holdings Limited acquired the entire share capital of Right Document Solutions Holdings, the immediate parent company, for a net consideration of £16,502,000

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary (indirectly held) of Capita plc and operates within the group's Professional Services division

The principal activity of the company continued to be that of the supply, support and management of total document solutions with a specialism in Managed Print Services (MPS) and associated DocuCheck® consultancy, incorporating the sale, implementation, and servicing of mono and colour digital multifunctional devices printers scanners fascimile, associated print scan and archiving software and other office equipment to our customers on a nationwide basis. There have not been any significant changes in the company's principal activities in the year under review. The directors are not aware, at the date of this report, of any likely major changes in the company's activities in the next year.

As shown in the company's profit and loss account on page 4, the company's turnover has increased by £9,738,000 from £6,929 000 to £16 667,000 over the prior 6 months and operating profit has increased by £3 060,000 over the same period

The balance sheet on page 5 of the financial statements shows the company's financial position at the year end. Net assets have decreased by £1,120,000 to £6,824,000. Details of amounts owed by/to its parent company and fellow subsidiary undertakings are shown in notes 9 and 10 to the financial statements.

Key performance indicators used by Capita plc are operating margins free cash flow capital expenditure and return on capital employed. Capita plc and its subsidiaries manage their operations on a divisional basis and as a consequence, some of these indicators are monitored only at a divisional level. The performance of the Professional Services division of Capita plc is discussed in the group's annual report which does not form part of this report.

Systems and procedures are in place to identify, assess and mitigate major business risks that could impact the company Monitoring exposure to risk and uncertainty is an integral part of the company's structured management processes. The principal risks that the company faces are operational risk contract pricing, competition, regulatory and legislative impacts recruitment and retention of staff and maintenance of reputation and strong supplier and customer relationships

Group risks are discussed in the group's annual report which does not form part of this report

Results and dividends

The results for the year (2010 6 month period) are set out on page 4

The directors proposed a final dividend during the year of £4,825 000 (2010 £mil)

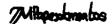

1 Accounting policies

11 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention

The company has sufficient financial resources together with long standing relationships with clients and suppliers As a consequence, the directors believe that the company is well placed to manage its business risks successfully After making enquiries the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and accounts

The company has not produced a cashflow statement on the basis that the ultimate parent undertaking. Capita plc, has prepared a group cashflow statement in accordance with FRS1 (revised)

12 Changes in accounting policies

The company has adopted the following new Financial Reporting Standards issued by the UK Accounting Standards Board (ASB)

Amendment to FRS 25 (IAS 32) Financial Instruments Presentation - classification of rights issues - The amendment alters the definition of a financial liability to enable parties to classify rights issues (and certain options or warrants) as equity instruments. The amendment is applicable if the rights are given pro rata to all of the existing owners of the same class of an entity's non-derivative equity instruments, to acquire a fixed number of the entity's own equity instruments for a fixed amount in any currency. The adoption of this amendment has had no impact on the financial statements of the company.

Improvements to Financial Reporting Standards (2010) - In May 2010 the International Accounting Standards Board issued its third omnibus of amendments to its standards, primarily with a view to removing inconsistencies and clarifying wording. These amendments were adopted by the ASB and issued in June 2010. The adoption of these amendments, which are effective from 1 January 2011, did not have any impact on the financial position or performance of the company.

FRS 30 Heritage Assets - In June 2010 the ASB issued this standard on the accounting treatment of heritage assets which is effective for annual periods beginning on or after 1 April 2010. This standard did not have any impact on the financial position or performance of the company.

UITT 47 (IFRIC 19) Extinguishing Financial Liabilities with Equity Instruments - This interpretation clarifies that equity instruments issued to a creditor to extinguish a financial liability are consideration in accordance with paragraph 41 of FRS26 (IAS 39). The equity instruments issued are measured at fair value (unless this cannot be reliably measured, in which case they are measured at the fair value of the liability extinguished) with gain or loss being immediately recognised in profit or loss. The adoption of this interpretation had no effect on the financial position or performance of the company.

UITF 48 Accounting implications of the replacement of the Retail Prices Index with the Consumer Prices Index for Retirement Benefits - In December 2010 the UITF issued guidance on the accounting treatment consequent to the UK Government's announcement to replace RPI with CPI for the statutory minimum increase in pensions in defined benefit schemes. This UITF abstract did not have any impact on the financial position or performance of the company.

13 Compliance with accounting standards

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice), which have been applied consistently (except as otherwise stated)

1.4 Turnover

Turnover represents amounts receivable for goods and services net of VAT and trade discounts

1.5 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Fangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows.

Fixtures, fittings & equipment

25% straight line and reducing balance

Motor vehicles

25% straight line

16 Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are charged against income on a straight line basis over the lease term

1.7 Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value

18 Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution scheme for the benefit of its employees Contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account in the year they are payable

19 Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more, taxation with the following exceptions

- Provision is made for taxation on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However no provision is made where on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to taxation only where the replacement assets are sold.
- Provision is made for deferred taxation that would arise on remittance of the retained earnings of overseas subsidiaries only to the extent that at the balance sheet date, dividends have been accrued as receivable,
- Deferred taxation assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted

Deferred taxation is measured on an undiscounted basis at the taxation rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse based on taxation rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date

1.10 Share-based payments

Equity-settled share-based payments, were issued in the form of share options to certain employees prior to Capita plc acquiring the company. In accordance with FRS 20, such payments are measured at fair value at the date of grant. Fair value is measured using the Black-Scholes pricing model and is expensed on a straight line basis in the income statement over the vesting period, based on an estimate of the number of shares that will eventually vest.

The UK corporation tax rate decreased from 26% to 24% from 1 April 2012 and changes to writing down allowances also took effect from this date. The deferred tax balance has been adjusted in the current year to reflect the reduction to 25% (as this change was enacted at the balance sheet date) resulting in a charge to the profit and loss account of £4,734 included in the current year deferred tax charge. Proposed changes to tax laws and rates that will have an effect on the deferred tax assets and liabilities of the Company have also been announced but not substantively enacted at the balance sheet date. The impact of these changes on the Company is not considered to be material.
