#### RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The profit and loss account is set out on page 5 and shows the profit before taxation for the year of £1,344,067 (1995 - £796,369). A dividend of £550,000 was paid during the year, which leaves a profit of £323,996 to be retained.

# PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The company's principal activities during the period were that of restaurateurs and food and wine retailers. The restaurants trade as Le Pont de la Tour and Cantina del Ponte which, together with the shops, form part of the "Gastrodrome" at Butler's Wharf in London.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

#### **Turnover**

Turnover represents sales to outside customers at invoiced amounts excluding service charge and Value Added Tax.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost, less estimated residual values, of all fixed assets over their expected useful lives. It is calculated on the original cost of the assets at the following fixed instalments rates:

#### Stocks

Stocks consist of raw materials and consumables and are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value on a first-in, first-out basis.

#### Leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight-line basis over the term of the lease.

#### 2. TURNOVER

Turnover, attributable to continuing operations, is derived from the sale of food, wines, spirits, beverages and sundry items.

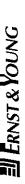
