1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015), subject to the departures referred to below.

Turnover

Turnover represents rents receivable and charges recoverable from the tenants of the company's properties, credit for which is taken when the charge is made to the tenants.

Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

In accordance with Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), no depreciation or amortisation is provided in respect of freehold investment properties nor on leasehold investment properties having an unexpired term of more than twenty years. This departure from the requirements of the Companies Act 2006, for all properties to be depreciated, is necessary, as the directors consider that this accounting policy results in the financial statements giving a true and fair view.

Leases having an unexpired term of less that twenty years are amortised evenly over the remaining period of the lease.

Low value items of furniture and fittings are written off in the year in which they are acquired.

Investment properties

Investment properties are included in the balance sheet at their market value.

Surpluses and temporary deficits are transferred to the revaluation reserve and on realisation transferred to the Profit and Loss Account as a reserve movement. Deficits which are expected to be permanent are charged to the Profit and Loss Account and subsequent reversals are credited to the Profit and Loss Account in the same way.

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Acquisitions and disposals of properties

Acquisitions and disposals are considered to have taken place at the date of legal completion and are included in the financial statements accordingly.

The Company's investment properties were valued internally by the directors at 31 March 2016 on the basis of market value.

In the event of the realisation of the company's investment properties at an amount equal to the valuation recorded in the financial statements, a liability to corporation tax on chargeable gains would arise which is estimated to be in the region of £15,000. No provision has been made for this in the financial statements in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

In accordance with the company's stated accounting policy (Note 1) no depreciation has been provided in respect of the freehold properties, nor on leasehold properties having an unexpired term of more than fifty years which are held for investment purposes.

The historical cost of the properties as at 31 March 2016 is £262,879 (2015: £262,879).
