Principal activities

1 Accounting policies

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2005)

Turnover

Turnover represents the total invoice value, excluding value added tax and trade discounts, of services rendered during the year. Revenue is recognised by the date of departure and related costs are charged to the profit and loss account on this basis.

Depreciation

Depreciation has been provided at the following rates in order to write off the assets over their estimated useful lives

Computer equipment and software Fixtures, fittings and equipment

35% reducing balance / 7 years straight line 20% reducing balance

Deferred taxation

Full provision is made for deferred taxation resulting from timing differences between the recognition of gains and losses in the accounts and their recognition for tax purposes. Deferred taxation is calculated on an un-discounted basis at the tax rates which are expected to apply in the periods when the timing differences will reverse.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account

Leasing and hire purchase commitments

Assets held under finance leases and hire purchase contracts, which are those where substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the asset have passed to the company, are capitalised in the balance sheet and depreciated over their useful lives. The corresponding lease or hire purchase obligation is treated in the balance sheet as a liability.

The interest element of the rental obligations is charged to the profit and loss account over the period of the lease and represents a constant proportion of the balance of capital repayments outstanding

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the lease term

Pensions

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme

18 Related parties

During the year the company received a management charge of £561,265 (2005 - £582,933) from its subsidiary company, Driveline Travel Limited The company was also charged by Driveline Travel Limited for transport costs amounting to £2,368,374 (2005 - £2,290,868) At 31 December 2006 there was a balance due from Driveline Travel Limited of £98,221 (2005 - £102,013) and this is included in debtors

The company also has an Employee Benefit Trust Scheme, in which as employees of the company, the directors have an interest

During the year the company commenced occupation of premises owned by Scottish Equitable Pension Plan, a pension scheme set up for the two directors. Amounts paid for rent during the year amounted to £13,125
